





'A SNOW CORNICE'


Significantly, this dramatic image of an expeditioner on skis, silhouetted against gigantic ice cliffs, features Xavier Mertz, one of the two men to lose their lives on the Australasian Antarctic Expedition, 1911-1914. Mertz was one of the ill-fated Far Eastern Party, the three-man sledging team which set out from Cape Denison in November 1912. After the death of Lieutenant Belgrave Edward Ninnis, Mertz and Mawson turned back, but Mertz sickened and died on the return journey, with Mawson left to carry on alone. This very large sepia-toned gelatin silver photograph is from the original 1915 Australian exhibition of Hurley photographs, with the label of the Fine Art Society, New Bond Street, London, on the verso.

GUTENBERG, JOHANNES (c.1398-1468) **A LEAF FROM THE GUTENBERG BIBLE**

Single folio leaf. 371 x 300 mm, printed on recto and verso, black gothic lettering of forty-two lines in double columns, large two-line initial letters rubricated in red; light foxing and very small edge chips, remnants of binding along one edge with tiny fragments of manuscript binder's waste (presumably from the original or otherwise early binding), small stain to edge of lower margin (well away from text); a fine example housed in a cloth chemise and clamshell box. Folio 148 from Volume I, comprising the entire text of Chapter 3 of the Second Book of Samuel. Provenance: The Mons - Trier II copy, widely dispersed in fragments from the 16th to the 20th centuries. *"[The Gutenberg Bible] has never been surpassed. Of all the arts, printing at its birth reached perfection more nearly than any other."* (A. Edward Newton)




The Gutenberg Bible was the first complete book printed in Western culture using the radical technology of movable pieces of type. This form of printing ushered in an information revolution whose impacts on society have been incalculable.

Small folio, contemporary calf with embossed armorial device to boards, ruled in blind, rebaked, spine with raised bands; edges stained blue, later endpapers, title with woodcut printer's device, manuscript inscription lower margin; woodcut initials and tail-pieces; pp 541, [35], folding world map, 255 x 480 mm, based on that of Ortelius published in 1570; the map was not included in the first Cologne edition of 1589, nor in the original Florence edition of 1588.


Maffei's account of the Portuguese discoveries in the West and East Indies and the Jesuit missions. The second Cologne edition retains the folio format of the 1588 edition, and is the only Cologne edition to contain the important world map; the map is missing in most copies which appear for sale, being a prized object for map collectors. Maffei's account of Japan was enthusiastically endorsed by Alessandro Valignano, in a letter sent from Macau in 1603: "Of all those who have so far written about Japan, none has done it with greater precision or in better order than Father G.P. Maffei."




The first published image of the Thylacine and Tasmanian Devil.

'The first European illustration of a thylacine was modelled on an injured animal caught in a trap. It is a sad embodiment of initial contact between Europeans and colonial fauna. The thylacine is pictured with a Tasmanian devil that was loaded onto a ship for transportation to England, but died before the vessel left Hobart. The injured thylacine also died. The image was published in volume 9 of the Transactions of the Linnean Society of London in 1808. The engraving was produced from a drawing by George Prideaux Harris, Deputy Surveyor-General of Van Diemen's Land ... Harris sent his drawing to London with a letter to Sir Joseph Banks speaking of "descriptions of the life" of two species, which he considered were "in every respect new". He classified the two animals in the same genus as opossums, naming the thylacine *Didelphis cynocephala* (dog-headed opossum) and the Tasmanian devil *Didelphis ursina* (bear opossum)...' Union atlas, containing new and improved maps of all the Empires, Kingdoms and States in the known world, designed as a companion to the various gazetteers & books of geography now in use, the whole clearly engraved by artists of eminence and carefully coloured. Including maps of the Roman Empire and Ancient Greece.

Quarto, modern binding of half calf over marbled papered boards, gilt-lettered contrasting morocco title label to spine, gilt ornamentation, new endpapers, engraved title page with vignettes of the four continents, 38 hand-coloured copperplate maps, the maps of the Eastern and Western hemispheres showing the voyages of Cook, the map of Asia including New Holland with dates of notable discoveries; the maps clean and fresh.

LAING'S PLANETARIUM ORRERY

Detroit : Laing Planetarium Co., 1896.


Scientific instrument (technically a tellurion or tellurium) measuring 32 cm tall and 55 cm in length when fully extended, comprising a copper-painted wooden sphere representing the sun mounted on a turned maple podium, around which oscillates a black and white painted sphere representing the planet Venus; attached to the podium is a turned maple arm with manufacturer's plaque, at the end a 3 inch pocket globe, around which a sphere representing the moon revolves, the entire device on a wooden circular stand divided into quadrants titled with the four seasons, the months of the year and the twelve signs of the Zodiac. Through a series of pulleys, the earth moves around the sun, whilst in rotation, and with simultaneous revolutions of the planetary objects. The string pulleys replaced, as they have perished in almost every example, else in very good condition. Accompanied by the manufacturer's printed instructional book Supplement to Facts in Mathematical Geography. A manual for schools and homes comprising Elements of Astronomy by Alexander Laing (1902), explaining the mechanism and science of the planetarium.

A wonderful astronomical teaching aid in good working order.

“In paintings and etchings of this period, the lake is a recurring theme for Long, with his favoured motifs of mirrored reflections and windswept trees appearing time and again within his decorative compositions. Dark, velvety shadows, described by watery aquatint, mark out the foreground of this twilight scene. Looking across Narrabeen Lakes from present day Wheeler Park, the view takes in the small mound of the uninhabited island that slices into the right of the composition, and the distant hills of North Narrabeen and Elanora Heights. Immediately behind the artist was a newly built bridge, which separated the mouth of the lake from Narrabeen beach. The richly hatched foliage of the trees vibrates with the suggestion of a gentle breeze coming up off the ocean at day’s end.”

“With the extension of the tramline to Narrabeen in 1913, the region surrounding the lake became popular with holidaymakers, and a camping ground was established on the north side of the lagoon. Long maintained a small camp along the lakeside, with a caravan and boatshed housing a wooden rowing boat. Some of his students, to whom he taught etching, would occasionally be invited to join him. Seeking respite from the bustling suburbs of Sydney’s lower North Shore, the artist basked in the serenity and natural beauty of the Northern Beaches.”

“A copy of the etching was possibly first exhibited in 1929 at the ‘Ninth annual exhibition of the Australian Painter–Etchers’ Society’, Sydney, 18–30 November (#96, as ‘The lake’, aquatint). 

Tom Roberts may have met the Brown sisters through Australian Dr Vera Scantlebury, who was working in London hospitals at the same time as Roberts during WWI. The journals in the present volume cover the period of the Napoleonic wars, and the struggle and its effects are recorded in regular detail. As are the various Irish rebellions over the same period, the careers of Fox and Pitt, the Catholic question, travel and exploration across the globe, and experimentation and debate over smallpox and vaccination. The magazine still has a decidedly liberal flavour. The present volume continues the coverage of the Napoleonic war, especially the campaigns in Spain and Portugal. It also has reports from Botany Bay about cannibalism by the Fijians, and activities in Tahiti as well as flooding by the Hawkesbury River. 



Rare, and very fine: a presentation copy (inscribed on the front endpaper to Walter Wrottersley “from the translator”) of an unusual publication for this period in Australia, a translation of an obscure commentary on Aristotle. Almost nothing of a philosophical bent was published in Australia before the 1850s and the creation of the Universities of Sydney and Melbourne. Perhaps the earliest philosophical work printed in Sydney?



Elwin says that he translated part of the eighteenth-century writer Metastasio’s critical observations on the Poetics in order to place “such portion as appeared to be likely to engage the attention, as well from the nature of the immediate topic, as from the spirited manner in which it is treated... within reach of the English reader”. Metastasio, or Pietro Antonio Domenico Trapassi, is best known today because Mozart used his “La Clemenzo di Tito” as the basis for his libretto.

Ferguson originally entered the translator as Elwin Hastings, but the Addenda notes that his identity as Hastings Elwin was established by an inscribed presentation copy offered by Henry Cork, London, Cat. 5 (1929) No. 294. Hastings Elwin was a rather grand figure, friend of the poet Thomas Moore, elected to the NSW Legislative Council in 1843. Item #1603



“The Merry Piper” is an exuberant and rambling adventure by Harold Gaze. Born in New Zealand in 1885, a whimsical artist with outstanding talent, Harold Gaze is one of the more elusive children’s writers and illustrators. Ever opting to paint to a scale suitable for exhibition, Gaze exhibited at the Victorian Artists Society Annual Exhibition in May 1919, the same year as *The Chewgum-blewgum* was released. His work over the next few years “established him as the most original illustrator of children’s books after Ida Rentoul Outhwaite.” (Holden, Robert. *A Golden Age: Visions of Fantasy*, p. 82)

It is said that Gaze worked with the Disney studios on *Fantasia*. Solo shows of his fantasy paintings in Los Angeles earned him the appellation of ‘The Bubble Man’. 



The Melbourne Glaciarium, now the site of Southgate near the State Theatre on Southbank, opened in 1906 as the third largest ice skating rink in the world. Aside from being a fantastic skating rink, the Melbourne Glaciarium was one of the first places in Australia to screen motion pictures and could seat up to 2000 people. It was also the site for basketball and gymnastics during the 1956 Melbourne Olympics.

Outhwaite's artwork depicts a young fairy in a red dress trimmed with white fur, skating along in a Santa hat, a bunch of red and green balloons trailing behind her. She has wings attached the heels of her ice skates and appears unaware and unbothered by the small, mischievous elf-fairy on skates brandishing snowballs. A beautiful artwork by Outhwaite, initialed I.R.O.



The Royal Navy officer Henry Keppel, later Admiral of the Fleet, was in the Malacca Straits in the early 1840s, acting against the Borneo pirates who had the area under their control; he gives a geographical overview of Borneo, and a good description of the Dyaks, the aboriginal Bornean tribes.




Rare on the market, this is a fine copy of the revised and expanded edition (with a new 25-page appendix) of the famous account of the shipwreck of the Juno. The English East India Company country ship was wrecked in the Bay of Bengal in 1795. The buoyancy of her teak cargo kept her afloat, and her 72 crew and passengers survived 23 days aloft in the rigging that protruded above the waves. Three years later the second mate, William Mackay, published his narrative of their treacherous disembarkation, and their arduous trek to a Company station on the Coromandel coast. This copy belonged to the Victorian pioneer John Pascoe Fawkner, whose many activities included being a newspaper publisher and a bookseller.

One of the more remarkable aspects of the map is how fully it investigates the southern hemisphere, mixing old speculations with the latest reports from Spanish and Portuguese voyagers in the Indian and Pacific Oceans. First published in 1570, this revision is from a slightly later Latin edition, dated on the engraving 1587 but actually published around 1592 as part of Ortelius' great atlas project, the *Theatrum Orbis Terrarum*.

It was published to accompany the 1880 display of a remarkable suite of 22 paintings of the Niger's four-year whaling voyage. Raleigh, a retired seaman, was a "fancy painter of carriages and house interiors" as well as a sign and boat painter in New Bedford, when he took up a second career as a painter of maritime art. The photographs here are of his series of oil paintings, each measuring six by eleven feet, which were designed to form a vast discontinuous panorama of a whaling voyage.

Germany, c. 1750. The "Nunc dimittis", also known as the Song of Simeon or the Canticle of Simeon, is a canticle taken from the second chapter of the Gospel of Luke, verses 29 through 32.

Its Latin name comes from its "incipit", the opening words, of the Vulgate translation of the passage, meaning "Now you dismiss".

The brief hymn of praise was sung by the aged Simeon, who had been promised by the Holy Spirit that he would not die until he had seen the Messiah. Simeon was at the Temple in Jerusalem when Mary and Joseph came to present the infant Jesus for the rite of purification according to Jewish law and custom. Simeon recognised the baby as the promised Saviour, took him in his arms, and raised his hymn of praise. Many composers, from Schutz to Rachmaninoff have set the words to music.

For most God-fearing people in the fourteenth century, the dragon was a real creature: a reptilian, winged, fire-breathing creature aligned with Satan, the bearer of death and misfortune and, significantly, the evil of paganism. The dragons depicted on this Book of Hours leaf may well have been included in the illuminations as a reminder to the devout reader of the evils associated with the creatures and to direct him or her to the safety and truth of the holy text where salvation was to be found.

One of the most celebrated works in the history of Western art, Francisco de Goya's Los Caprichos - meaning “follies” or “caprices” - comprises 80 captioned etchings & aquatints satirising the foibles of late 18th century Spanish society. Filled with a remarkable cast of aristocrats, procuresses, prostitutes, monks, goblins, witches and animals acting like human fools, Los Caprichos conjures up a haunting vision of a world on the margins of reason, where the line between reality and fantasy cannot be distinguished.

A dream-like quality pervades each work as Goya illustrates the pretensions of life with a dark, humorous, biting satire that contributes to the artist's status as “the first of the moderns.”



Number 79, 'No-one has seen us' is Goya's scathing commentary on the corruption within the clergy. A group of grotesque, goblin-like clerics, like monstrous creatures of the night, secrete themselves in the monastery cellar and drink to excess.



Authorship of the Seven Penitential Psalms is traditionally ascribed to King David who composed them to atone for his grievous sins which included adultery with Bathsheba and the murder of her husband, Uriah. They have long been associated with penitential devotions and commended as defence against the seven deadly sins, each psalm being associated with one of them.



The extremely small size of this leaf can be explained thus: Medieval piety involved substantial elements of public display, and the small but emergent urban bourgeoisie, mostly merchants or administrators in the growing royal bureaucracies were intent on imitating their superiors. So it is not surprising that the Book of Hours became something of a chic devotional accessory, especially for women, an incongruity that occasionally attracted disapproving comment. Eustache Deschamps, the great French poet of the late 14th century, put his satire into verse when he imagined the thoughts of a bourgeois wife who yearns for a Book of Hours that “is as graceful and gorgeous as me... So the people will gasp when I use it, That’s the prettiest prayer-book in town.”

Psalm 145 (KJV 146) is the last Psalm attributed explicitly to King David. Giovanni Bernardone, better known as Francis of Assisi, 1182-1226, wrote a poem towards the end of his life, in 1225, based on Psalm 145 and composer Antonin Dvorak set part of the psalm to music in his Biblical Songs (1894). The illuminations include one two-line initial 'L' in blue outlined in black with white penwork and an internal foliate design in orange, blue and white on a ground of highly burnished gold. Five one-line illuminated initials and three line fillers. A panel of fine illuminations beside the text includes acanthus leaves in blue and liquid gold, strawberries (symbolic of drops of Christ's blood), and other coloured flowers & foliage. 




The production of small format bibles flourished in Paris in the 13th century. Written on extremely thin parchment in an extraordinarily tiny script, these codices were highly portable. The parchment for these bibles used calf skin produced north of the Alps which was able to be processed on both sides, whilst retaining its white colouring and quality. It was impossible to detect the hair side from the flesh side on this vellum, making it an ideal parchment for the exceptionally fine writing required on these "pocket" bibles. The parent book of this leaf was a high quality bible of the Crusades period, used in the study of theology or preaching of the Gospel around the medieval countryside. It may have been first owned by a Dominican priest from an academic milieu as wealthy Flemish Dominicans studied at the Parisian college of Saint-Jacques.

Condition: This 750 year old leaf is in particularly fine condition. Leaves from these pocket bibles often have the margins cut down - perhaps for later re-binding - but this leaf retains its original margins. A very large & magnificently illuminated manuscript leaf celebrating Candlemas.

The eight-line historiated initial 'S' is the focus of this leaf. On a burnished gold ground outlined in black the letter 'S' is formed from red petals and green acanthus leaves which scroll into the left margin and extend into the centre to curl around the bar border. The sophistication of the design of the initial is contrasted with the simplicity - even naïvety - of the scene enclosed within the initial. Three groups of stylised clouds - possibly representing the Trinity - float in an idyllic sky as Mary and Joseph kneel on grass sprinkled with blue and red flowers, and bathe the Child before bringing the 40-day old infant to Simeon for his blessing. The simple scene possesses great charm and innocence. The figures of the smiling baby and Mary and Joseph's expressions of reverence and humility are highly detailed. Grey-haired and bearded Joseph is depicted in a simple pink robe. Mary, like her son, has flaxen hair and wears a magenta and gold robe under a green-lined blue cloak. The naked child, unwrapped from his swaddling clothes, raises his hands in blessing. All three figures have haloes in burnished gold.



THE SALMON PONDS were set up by the Government on the banks of the Derwent and supplied by water from the Plenty River, the salmon being reared from ova imported from England; in 1869 the first pond held about 90 brown trout. The *Illustrated Australian News* (6 Dec 1869) presented views of the Salmon Ponds after Clifford's photographs. The land was leased by the Government from the Read family.

Captain Moonlite (Andrew George Scott [1842-1880]) robbed the London Chartered Bank at Egerton near Ballarat, Victoria, in May 1869. He evaded capture but in 1870, after passing bad cheques and fraudulently purchasing a yacht in Sydney, he was confined in Maitland Gaol. In April 1872 he was imprisoned in Ballarat Gaol for the Egerton robbery. After escaping he was sentenced to ten years hard labour.

Freed from Pentridge Prison, Victoria, in 1879, in November Scott held up a sheep station at Wantabadgery, NSW. Retreating to a nearby homestead he and his gang continued the shoot-out with Senior-Sergeant Carroll and Constables Johns, Rowe, Hedley, and Williamson from Gundagai, Constable Gorman, Barry, and Bowen from Wagga, and Sergeant Cassin of Adelong. Constable Wiles, one of Moonlite's hostages, escaped and joined them. Scott shot dead Constable Bowen; James Nesbitt, who was apparently Scott's lover, and another gang member were also killed.

The press described Scott as 'of commanding presence,' highly educated', and '[b]rave to the verge of recklessness', with 'gentlemanly' manners and 'a certain air of chivalrous dash' (Gundagai Times 21 Nov 1879). He and Tom Rogan were hanged on 20 January 1880. Scott was buried at Rookwood Cemetery, but was reinterred in 1995 at Gundagai, nearby Nesbitt's grave.

At the time of taking the photograph, Richards & Co. of Sydney, were official photographers to the Sydney International Exhibition.



Groups of women and some men peer into shop windows and stroll through the Royal Arcade which opened in May 1870. Designed by Charles Webb, it had a 66-foot frontage to Bourke Street and was approached through an archway, with the shops running through to Little Collins Street. *The Argus* of 3 May 1870 reported that the arcade 'is 169ft in length by 22ft. in width. The roof, which is supported by light ornamental cast-iron trusses is of glass, with ... an arched skylight protected by iron which runs down the centre'. There were 11 'elegantly fitted up' shops on one side and 13 on the other, each with 'a frontage of nearly 14ft. by a depth of 21ft ... [F]acing Little Collins Street, there are two or three shops of larger dimensions'.

Retailers included watchmaker and jeweller Thomas Gaunt, Miss Mackay's Parisian millinery depot, the Original Scotch Pie Shop, and the Old Curiosity Shop, which sold opossum rugs, furs and 'native curiosities'. G. W. Perry, who became insolvent in mid-1871, and Thomas Foster Chuck, had photography studios in the arcade, so perhaps one of them took the photograph.

CHARLES KERRY, the photographer, was influential in the exploration and opening up for tourism of the Yarrangobilly Caves which became the most popular tourist resort in NSW in the late 19th century. In early March 1891 Kerry, with a representative of Cook & Sons, the tourist agency, and the sub-editor of the *Illustrated Sydney News*, travelled between Gundagai and Cooma. At Tumut they were joined by E.G. Brown and two friends. The first photograph documents the group's arrival at the Yarrangobilly Cave House. Brown's four-horse drawn buggy is on the left; the buggy on the right was supplied by Cook & Sons. The party discovered the 'Jersey' cave, named after the governor, with Kerry being the first to enter. The second photograph shows the returning party two miles from the Cave House at the 'Gap' encountering a group of 25 tourists from Adaminaby who were travelling to the Caves. According to the *Illustrated Sydney News* of 11 April 1891, 'knowing there were too many of them to find accommodation at the cave-house [they] had come prepared for all emergencies, and had brought with them provisions, tents, and all the necessary impediments for camping out.'

Sydney-born Joe Kirkwood (1897-1970) worked as a ten-year-old on a sheep station and made golf clubs from saplings and snakeskin in his spare time. After winning the Australian Open in 1920 he forged an international career. From 1924 he toured the world with famous American golfer Walter Hagen.

In Canberra, on 1 April 1930, former Prime Minister Billy Hughes ushered the duo in to a meeting with then Prime Minister James Scullin. Hughes hoped that the many local players who had descended upon Canberra would learn from their visit: 'However, Australia could teach them "Two-up".' (*Canberra Times* 2 Apr 1930). That afternoon Hagan defeated Kirkwood who then demonstrated trick shots. When Kirkwood revisited Canberra in 1934, Billy Hughes, 'whose love of golf is well known, applauded Kirkwood uproariously during the exhibition of trick shots at the conclusion of the match.'

During his career Kirkwood was said to have scored 29 holes-in-one, two of them in the same round. He was elected to the American Golf Hall of Fame at Foxburg, Pennsylvania, and the annual Kirkwood Cup is awarded to the winner of the Australian PGA Championship.



John Sands, stationers and publishers, were famous for their finely painted illuminated addresses. Mostly executed by anonymous artists, they typically featured Australian flora and were personalised with landscapes and architectural views. Illuminated addresses from the firm were presented to Governors, Governors-General, and other dignitaries. The address incorporates a painted view of 'The English Scottish & Australian Bank' at Mosman, along with wattle, flannel flowers and other wildflower decorations. Signed by the Mayor & other civic officials, the two pages of signatures also include those of members of the Balmoral Beach Club, and of such firms as Bridgman & Co., Cooney Brothers, and Griffiths & Co.

A silver gelatin photograph of the recipient, George Harrison Watson, is pasted inside. Watson died at his home in Awaba Street, Mosman, in 1930. His obituary noted that he had been 'well-known as the manager of the E.S.&A. Bank, Jamberoo, forty years ago.' *Kiama Reporter & Illawarra Journal* 4 Jun 1930). Before coming to Mosman, he had been manager of the bank's Rozelle (Balmain) Branch.

On 4 November 1915 a 'Cheer Up Button Day' was held with stalls attended by the Cheer Up women and wounded soldiers. In the afternoon a 'Cheer Up Hut' was opened in the city and about forty of the Cheer Up Girls from the Burra brought their own horses and paraded them through the streets, and escorted the governor to the hut.






A photo album documenting the career of Captain Alexander McLuckie containing photographs, postcards, clippings, and handwritten descriptions of each ship he served upon from when he first signed on as Boy to the Hampshire in Scotland in the 1920s. After his second posting he paid for his passage to Australia and there served numerous ships from Sydney and Adelaide travelling to ports all over Australia. Descriptions vary in detail from ship to ship but often include information on the ship's construction and wrecking, sometimes together with details of the work the ship did, both in general, and specifically while he served aboard. The log of ships he worked on ends in the late 1940s, though he continues to record details of various ships from his position as customs officer, harbor master, and pilot at Wallaroo, Port Lincoln, Port Pirie, and Port Adelaide from 1948 through to 1971. From the 1970s through to 1981 he records several journeys aboard cruise ships. The photo album is accompanied by 54 certificates of discharge further documenting his service from 1934 to 1976, together with a Pilot Service Certificate from the South Australia Department of Marine and Harbors, a Pilotage Exemption Certificate, a Commonwealth of Australia Naval Record Book logging his service as a Volunteer in the Royal Australian Navy from 1925 to 1927, together with an Attestation Form for Ratings Voluntarily Engaged in the Citizen Naval Forces, and a snapshot portrait of McLuckie in uniform, at the foot of a gangway.

The album is Near Fine Condition with only minor handling wear, some of the photographs and clippings are rubbed and worn. The certificates have been folded but are in Very Good Condition. The Log Book is fragile with the spine splitting though the interior is clean.




Elizabeth David's fourth book, considered by some to be her 'lightest', is arguably her most personal, as it included all the foods that she herself liked to eat and cook, and her most political. Written during the summer of 1954, as if in situ, it reflects her summer days and experiences in Provence and Italy, and a clear statement of her belief of the importance and value in preparing and eating food in season at the right time and in the right place; a manifesto taken up by many including Alice Waters and the Slow Food movement

Illustrated by her friend Adrian Daintrey, based on tableau and compositions prepared on her kitchen table over long lunches, *Summer Cooking* provides a lovely gentle insight into the food and occasions that David most enjoyed.





Jules Gouffe, once apprenticed to Careme, was one of the most senior and accomplished chefs in Paris in the mid-nineteenth century. His final position was at the Paris Jockey Club; having been recruited for the role by Alexandre Dumas and Baron Brisse. He wrote his seminal texts *Le Livre de Cuisine* and *Le Livre de Patisserie* during this time. The books had a significant impact on the development of French Haute Cuisine and influenced many subsequent Chefs and authors such as Escoffier.



Translated into English by his brother, Alphonse Gouffe, then head pastry cook to Queen Victoria, *The Royal Cookery Book* was an instant success. In addition to the expensive finely bound edition with colour plates, this household edition was issued at the more accessible 10/6 for the less wealthy and for kitchen copies for professional cooks. Part I 'Household Cookery' opens with some sage advice on establishing a *batterie de cuisine*. Part II "High Class Cookery" provides advice still relevant to today for establishing a kitchen team.


The particularly fine and sizeable wood-cut engravings of kitchen tools, ingredients, and dishes (repeated from the French edition) were engraved by Charles La Plante from drawings by Albert Jahandier based on the works of Eugene Ronjat.



Child was an American writer, poet and journalist who was also an abolitionist and a champion of rights for Women and Indigenous peoples. This, her most popular book, was first published in America in 1829. There was some confusion between this book and Susannah Clarke's *The Frugal Housewife* published in 1765 and by 1832 Child's book was being published as *The American Frugal Housewife*. Quite how this British edition by Thomas Tegg came to be is unclear. Edges faintly rubbed, small nick to head of rear joint, remarkably tight and crisp; gilding bright. Gift inscription ('1842') to p[3]; small 1cm tear to edge of the engraved frontispiece not affecting the image; occasional faint foxing and toning; a few neat pencil marks to the margins.

An interesting and almost near fine copy of an popular late Georgian, household book advocating real and practical economy, in what appears to be a 'gift edition' aimed at newly-weds by an early American suffragette & activist.

In 2006, Albert Adria, the younger brother of Ferran Adria, began his 'Natura' project to record 49 emblematic and ground-breaking desserts served at elBulli, their Michelin 3 star restaurant at Roses. Two and a half years later, when Natura was published, Adria was confirmed as one of the world's most influential and transformative dessert fine dining chefs.
