





From 1816 until the transfer in 1949, the Dutch East Indies was the officially used name for the Dutch colony that ultimately included present-day Indonesia. The foundation for the colony of the Dutch East Indies was laid from 1602 onwards by the Dutch East India Company (VOC). In 1795 the VOC was taken over by the Dutch state. In the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, the Dutch colonial army conquered the vast majority of what eventually came to be called the Republic of Indonesia.



A completely revised and enlarged second edition of the ethnographic volumes; first edition published in Batavia, Landsdrukkerij, 1912-1914. - The language spoken in the central area of Sulawesi, mainly the district of Poso, was for a long time, following the local custom, known as Bare', its word for 'not', but has recent years been renamed Pamona, which is a place on the northern bank of Lake Poso. A description of the language by Nicolaus Adriani (1865-1926) was not included in this re-edition. Albertus Christiaan Kruyt (1869-1949), who worked in the same area as Adriani, was a well-known ethnographer. - *A classic anthropological monograph of the Toradjas of Sulawesi, Indonesia.*







Wijnand Otto Jan Nieuwenkamp (1874-1950) was a versatile artist: graphic artist, painter, architect, shipbuilder, writer, explorer, art collector and ethnographer. He still occupies a prominent place among artists around 1900. Nieuwenkamp found inspiration for his work in travel. Before 1897 he traveled in the Netherlands and Europe, then in the East Indian archipelago, often during years of expeditions. He visited the island of Bali six times during his journeys. In 1900 he built his beautiful home and workshop ship De Zwerver, with which he sailed with his family through the Netherlands, Belgium and Germany. In 1910 he settled in Edam, in 1920 he left for Italy where he lived until his death. - *Fine oeuvre catalogue.*



Vol. I contains Coen's letters up to 1623; these are very readable because Coen wrote in an excellent style. Vol. II and III contains his letters to his collaborators in Asia and resolutions taken during his government. Vol. IV contains the judicial verdicts pronounced during his tenure of office, as well as the letters addressed to him by the directors of the Company in Holland. Vol. V presents all the documents which concern his second term of office. Vol. VII (2 parts) contain all the letters from many parts of Asia that had been addressed to Coen, with extensive annotations (*Coolhaas p.40-41*). Not present as always Vol. VI containing his biography. - *A fine ste of a main source.*

from Achehnese will often be able to consult it with profit (*Voorhoeve, Languages of Sumatra*, p.6).




