The history of whaling is based on the demand of developing economies and the ability of whalers to create new trade and hunting routes across the North and South Pole regions. At the height of the industry, whaling experienced no governmental oversight as no governing body held jurisdiction over the Arctic regions. Today, the International Whaling Committee is a global protectorate; upholding the recognized and necessary ban on whale hunting. Even still, as whales continue to amaze humans with their family contingent lifestyle and reproductive patterns, whale hunting continues to exist and exploits exotic vulnerabilities (*Poseidon Expeditions*).

First edition. - An anonymous work on the state of the Cape of Good Hope under the first phase of British rule (1795 - 1803) in letters describing the diverse population of slaves in the Cape Colony. 'A short account of the Cape before the period of the rule of the Batavian Republic. The writter of the series of thirty-nine letters which are comprised in the volume was evidently a strong opponent of slavery, and a large part of the work is devoted to the exposition of his views on the matter, and a sketch of the various forms of slavery that have existed from ancient times" (Mendelssohn I, p.609). The large folding frontispiece depicts the wreck of H.M.S. Sceptre. On November 4, 1799, the Sceptre was lying in Table Bay with about a dozen other ships, when a very severe storm struck from the only quarter for which this bay provides no protection. The anchor cables parted in succession, and the ship drove on a reef just off shore. The *Sceptre* broke up completely, and only 51 reached shore of the approximately 450 people on board. Nine of the ships in the bay drove on the shore in the same storm, and were lost' (Huntress p.50). One print depicts a whale fishing scene near the Cape of Good Hope with 1 page of text. This scene purporting to illustrate whale hunting in Table Bay, South Africa, is actually a composite of earlier Dutch prints of the arctic fishery of the Van der Meulen/Van der Laan set' (Ingslls, Whaling prints, 102). - (Foxed, several pages more strongly). - Scarce.



First Dutch edition, first published in German *Historie von Grönland*. Barby & Leipzig, 1765; with bookplate E.M. Cox. - This first Dutch translation has more and better plates than the original edition and added is an extensive study of the natural history of Greenland, together with descriptions of the life and customs of the Greenlanders, their religion, knowledge of the stars, and a brief vocabulary of their language *(Howgego)*. -Detailed description of Greenland by David Cranz (1723-1777), the historiographer of the

Brethern, he stayed at Ny Herrnhut in Greenland, in 1761-62. With sections devoted to the establishment of the first Herrnhut or Moravian mission in Greenland, the nature, manners and customs of the inhabitants on the West coast on Davis Strait, whales and the whaling-industry in general, and the Eskimos. 'The minute journal of the noble Moravian Brethren, gives us in their own language the phases of Aboriginal life and peculiarities which daily presented themselves. No tribe of American savages has been more closely or intelligently studied. Specimens of their language are given...' (*Field 383*). Only state. - 'With this scene, Goltzius established a compositional prototype to be followed for the next two hundred years in Dutch views of stranded whales. The predominant characteristic is the landscape receding in the background with a line of curious people coming down the beach to view the spectacle. The onlookers are generally dressed in fancy clothes and a whale is always being measured. This early depiction has a casual, objective feeling about it, as compared with ones immediately following that interpret strandings as examples of God's limited creavity' *(Ingalls 358).*

A fine early impression of this spectacular scene showing the British whalers Amelia Wilson and Castor off Buru, Indonesia, with a dying sperm whale smashing a whale boat, crew cutting in blubber alongside one of the ships, and several whale boats giving chase. William John Huggins (1781-1845) was a porolific marine artist and ship portraitist, working in London from 1814

until his death in 1845. His devotion to ships and the sea resulted from an early career with the East India Marine Company, during which he sailed the world over serving in a variety of capacities (*Ingalls 103*). - A dramatic and important whaling print in fine condition. Brewington 188.



Including Heemskerk and Barentsz's winter encampment on Nova Zemlya, several accounts of whaling expeditions i.a. near Jan Mayen Island and Davis Strait, as well as descriptions of the types of whales, birds and fishes in these Arctic regions, and the surrounding lands and the people that lived there. The maps depict the

North Pole, Spitsbergen, Nova Zemlya, Jan Mayen Island, Greenland and Iceland. Two folding plates depict the famous whaling and herring fishery scenes by Kobell and Sallieth. 

The Dutch Polar Expedition 1882-1883,

initiated by C.H.D. Buys Ballot, was a scientific expedition that would visit Port Dikson in Siberia as part of the first International Polar Year. Due to heavy ice, the expedition led by Maurits Snellen was unable to reach Dickson, but observations were made on the frozen Kara Sea. After the sinking of the expedition ship *Varna in* the pack ice of the Kara Sea, near Nova Zembla, the men spent the long dark polar winter on an ice floe and managed to reach the mainland the following summer, after three weeks of struggling over melting and tilting pack ice. - (Slight foxing throughout).



Second and best edition; the first edition was published in Amsterdam in 1720. - This classic work on the Greenland whale fishery is one of the most thorough and authoritative descriptions of the early 18th century. It is the most important and extensive Dutch work on whaling, including ample descriptions of the early discoveries and exploration in the northern regions, Greenland, Iceland, Spitsbergen, Nova Zembla, Jan Mayen and Strait Davis. Giving along with extensive natural history, geography, history, and economics, detailed lists of ships' outfits, lists of shipowners and captains, an extensive vocabulary, and copious other details. At the end an account of New-Foundland cod-fishing. - (p.101 with


