

A pioneering work on America

First Dutch edition, translated by Jan Huygen van Linschoten; first published in Seville in 1590: *Historia natural y moral delas Indias*. - José de Acosta (1540-1600), Spanish Jesuit missionary and historian, wrote this early important eye-witness account of South America, dealing i.a. with the history of the Indians of Peru and Mexico. 'Agosta was one of the first scholars to formulate a systemic theory of anthropology, suggesting a classification of different peoples into different types, and anticipating later theories of social evolution' (*Howgego* p.3).

It is one of the earliest balanced accounts of the New World, concentrating on the Spanish possessions in Peru and Mexico,

covering the Inca and Aztec people. A great classic translated into nearly every European language. It opened the eyes of Europe to the extraordinary wealth Spain was reaping from its possessions in the New World - (With library stamp on titlepage and faint waterstains in a few leaves). - *A very good copy of a pioneering work on America.*

Shanghai, Beijing, Kiautschou, Japan, San Francisco and New York. The fine illustrations were made by the German draftsman and illustrator Christian Wilhelm Allers (1857-1915).

1912. - The Norwegian explorer Roald Engelbregt Gravning Amundsen (1872 - 1928) left Norway in June 1910 on the ship *Fram*. When he received the news that the British polar explorer Scott was already on his way to the South Pole, Amundsen changed his plans and set his sights on arriving there before him. Scott's and Amundsen's expeditions were both now heading for the South Pole in 1911. His party established a camp at the Bay of Whales and a series of supply depots on the Barrier (now known as the Ross Ice Shelf) before setting out for the pole in October.




The party of five, led by Amundsen, became the first to

successfully reach the South Pole on 14 December 1911, four weeks before Scott. He

was a key figure of the period known as the Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration. - A very fine copy.

Thomas Atwood published the first history of the island and still provides the most uniquely vivid, if not unbiased picture of Dominica in the late 18th century. 


First edition. - The book is in the form of a diary, and the author seems to have traversed every part of South Africa where there was a mission station or a missionary. In this way he appears to have met almost every prominent man connected with mission work in South Africa at his time. The volume commences with an account of the author's visit to Mauritius, where he stayed about three months. There is a good description of Kaffraria, and of the Basuto, Griqua and Bechuana countries, and the account of the Cape Colony affords valuable

information concerning the first part of the nineteenth century (*Mendelssohn p.62*). Throughout the volume there are ample descriptions of the flora of the country. - *Fine.*

"The journey was started on March 20, 1861, and the author was joined by his fellow-traveller, Mr.J. Chapman, on the 20th of July. The volume contains an interesting account of hunting



and exploration in the country of the Namaquas and Damaras, and the illustrations are very spirited; there is a good description of the flora and fauna of the country, together with an account of the habits of the natives' (*Mendelssohn I, p.69*). - (Small library stamp on titlepage).



First edition. - The impact of Bekker's book, *The Bewitched World*, was a seminal work in the undermining of superstition, an early and powerful blow against the authority of the Bible, a significant instrument for the weakening of the Church's hold on men's beliefs, and a primary contributor to the liberation of thought across northern Europe. It caused a major scandal and in 1692 Bekker was removed from his office in Amsterdam by the synod of Alkmaar, because of heterodoxy. (Age-browned).

The treaty ceded ownership of Puerto Rico, Guam, and the Philippine islands from Spain to the United States and granted the United States temporary control of Cuba.


