







A fine and attractive example. *Confessions...* (1821) is the classic autobiographical narrative written by Thomas De Quincey (1785-1859) concerning his laudanum (tincture of opium) addiction and its effect on his life. The Confessions was the first major work De Quincey published and the one which won him fame almost overnight. First published anonymously in September and October 1821 in the London Magazine, the Confessions was released in book form in 1822, and again in 1856.





The binding is unsigned, but most certainly by an American master craftsman, possibly from the Club Bindery, Monastery Hill Bindery, or the Roycroft Bindery. 



Their marriage ended in 1936 and Sam returned to London and went back into the book business at E. Joseph with his brother Jack. When *My Autobiography* was published in September 1964, Chaplin gave Sam this inscribed copy.












