


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

FIRST EDITION of this supplementary explanation to Biot's popular textbook on physical astronomy; a French translation was published at Brest in 1833. One of the most distinguished scientists of his day, Jean-Baptiste Biot (1774-1862) made important contributions in physics, astronomy and mathematics. Among his many published works are several widely used textbooks, including *Traité élémentaire d'astronomie physique* (Paris, 1802 and later editions).

Andrade (1768-1830) was born in Porto and entered the Benedictine Order. After earning a doctorate in mathematics from the University of Coimbra in 1799, he began a long and distinguished career as professor of astronomy at Coimbra and director of its observatory. Nominated in 1828 as vice-rector of the university by the Junta Provisoria, Andrade was forced after the liberal uprising failed to flee to London, where he was appointed tutor to the young D. Maria II, a position he was unable to accept due to ill health.



First and Only Edition in Portuguese. In 1791, as the French Revolution was nearing the height of its fury, Charles-Joseph Bevy published *Histoire de la noblesse héréditaire et successive des Gaulois, des François et des autres peuples de l'Europe*, which he refers to in a footnote to the "Advertencia do Author" in the present volume. Firmly believing that "o Povo não pode jámais ser Soberano, nem Legislador," he went on to compose the *Manuel des révolutions, suivi du parallèle des révolutions des siècles précédens avec celle actuelle*. Not surprisingly for a work so opposed to the current political tide, it appeared without place or printer in 1793, and is also a rare book: OCLC locates only 2 copies, both at the Bibliothèque nationale de Paris (464857255 and 457062920). Along with several arguments on the right of kings to rule, Bevy includes a section on Calvinism (pp. 48-60) and another on parallels between earlier rebellions in France and the current one (pp. 61-84).

We have not been able to identify the translator, who signs with the initials "J.P.M." The "Soldado Realista" who signs the dedication includes an excerpt from the epic poem *O Oriente*, by that staunch absolutist José Agostinho de Macedo. He declares that in publishing this manual his aim is to defend the rights of his monarch and the Church, in support of the absolutist King D. Miguel, then in power, who was being opposed by the liberals, led by D. Pedro I, Emperor of Brazil. D. Pedro, the elder brother of D. Miguel, had relinquished his rights to the Portuguese throne in favor of his daughter, D. Maria II.

The Abbé Bevy (1738-1830), a Benedictine of the congregation of Saint-Maur, was royal historiographer for the province of Hainaut (now partly in France, partly in Belgium). Bevy asked to be named historiographer of Austrian Hainaut, but the Academy of Brussels opined that he did not have adequate qualifications. Around 1785 he was admitted to membership in that Academy. According to the title page, he was also a member of an academy in Richmond, Virginia.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Preached at the Cathedral in Bahia. The dedication to D. João IV occupies all of the second and third preliminary leaves. The final preliminary leaf contains an introduction by the author, in which he refers to another sermon preached at the same venue in 1642 on a similar topic. Frei Bernardo de Braga (a.k.a. Frei Bernardo da Purificação, (Braga, 1604 [or 1598 according to João Francisco Marques]-Bahia, 1662), one of the most celebrated pulpit orators of his time, was elected Abbot of the Benedictine Convento de Tibães in 1632, becoming Procurador Geral for his order. In 1640 he set out for Brazil, arriving early 1641, teaching philosophy and theology at the Colégio of Bahia, before becoming abbot of the order's monastery of Pernambuco, serving from 1647-1650. He was elected Provincial for Brasil, serving from 1650-1656. Returning to Bahia, he was once more elected Provincial in 1662.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Contains two sermons in praise of the Benedictine Order preached at Bahia. The divisional title to the second part appears on leaf F1 recto. The dedication to Frei Vicente Rangel, dated Bahia, 20 de Abril 1661, occupies pp. 3-7 of the preliminaries. There is a preface on the following unnumbered page. The headpiece on p. 1 of the main section includes the French royal arms.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this oration recited at Pernambuco, dedicated to D. João IV of Portugal, whose younger brother, D. Duarte, had died in captivity. D. Duarte de Bragança (Vila Viçosa, 1605-Milan, 1649), fought with distinction under the Hapsburg Emperors in the Thirty Years War. Shortly after his brother declared himself King of Portugal in December 1640 D. Duarte was arrested and moved from one prison to another under harsh conditions, ending up in Milan, then under Spanish rule, in 1642, remaining there until his death. FIRST and ONLY EDITION of Francisco Antonio Fernandes da Silva Ferrão (Coimbra, 1798-Lisbon, 1874) was a member of the royal council and served numerous high financial and diplomatic positions in the government, including Ministro e Secretário de Estado dos Negócios da Fazenda in 1851, and as well as on committees for reform of the Portuguese legal system. Ferrão was a Freemason, and in his youth was a member of the Sociedade Patriótica Portuense. The *Apontamentos* reprints many documents relevant to Ferrão's career.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION? It includes a description of the special relationship of the Portuguese royal family to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Immaculate Conception of Mary became Catholic doctrine on December 8, 1854, with Pope Pius IX's encyclical *Ineffabilis Deus*.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The author explains that he was commissioned to write this sermon of thanksgiving for the birth of a son to Dr. João Leal da Gama Araujo Vasconcellos, but since the father died several months before his son was born, the sermon was not delivered.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The politically active Archbishop exhorts his flock to become better Christians and better citizens: "estamos h'uma dellas [revoluções], carissimos Irmãos Nossos, no meio da qual combinar os deveres de Christão com os de Cidadão he de summa importancia para vós, e do Officio daquelles que presidem na Igreja" (pp. 19-20). On pp. 15-17 the Archbishop describes the state of Brazil 300 years ago, and the benefits Christianity has brought to it.

Although issued anonymously this *Pastoral* was authored by D. Vicente da Soledade e Castro (1763-1823), a native of Porto, who was consecrated archbishop of the Archdiocese of San Salvador da Bahia and Primate of Brazil in 1820. He entered the Benedictine Order in 1788. Elected in 1821 to the Cortes Gerais e Extraordinárias da Nação Portuguesa, he served as its President for several months, and remained loyal to Portugal at the time of Brazilian independence.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Although issued anonymously this *Pastoral* was authored by D. Vicente da Soledade e Castro (1763-1823), a native of Porto, who was consecrated archbishop of the Archdiocese of San Salvador da Bahia and Primate of Brazil in 1820. He entered the Benedictine Order in 1788. Elected in 1821 to the Cortes Gerais e Extraordinárias da Nação Portuguesa, he served as its President for several months, and remained loyal to Portugal at the time of Brazilian independence.

The politically active Archbishop exhorts his flock to become better Christians and better citizens: "estamos h'uma dellas [revoluções], carissimos Irmãos Nossos, no meio da qual combinar os deveres de Christão com os de Cidadão he de summa importancia para vós, e do Officio daquelles que presidem na Igreja" (pp. 19-20). Known in secular life as Gaspar Teixeira de Azevedo, the author (São Vicente, Santos, São Paulo, 1715-Santos, 1800), a member of the Benedictine Order who had studied with the Jesuits at Santos, wrote this work after a diligent study of contemporary documents. A corresponding member of the Academia Real das Sciencias de Lisboa, he refutes a number of erroneous statements about the Paulistas made by Vaisette in his *Historia geographica*, Paris 1755, and by Charlevoix in his *History of Paraguay*, 1718. Frei Gaspar was a member of the Bahian "Academia Brasílica dos Renascidos". He became Abbot

of his order's house in Rio de Janeiro in 1763, and served as Provincial for the order in Brazil from 1766 to 1769. In later life he devoted himself to his studies as Cronistamór of his order in Brazil, while serving as Visitador of the monasteries of his native Capitania, declining the bishopric of Funchal, and returning to Rio in 1780 as master of novices before returning to Santos a few years later. A number of other writings remained unpublished during his lifetime.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The third through fifth preliminary leaves describe in detail the cenotaph erected for the queen at the Iglesia del Convento del Carmen in Valencia; the inscriptions on it (in Greek, Latin, and Spanish) are transcribed on pp. 33-41.

D. Maria Isabela de Bragança (b. 1797), daughter of D. João VI and Carlota Joaquina of Spain, married her maternal uncle Ferdinand VII of Spain in 1816. She died barely two years later in childbirth, having failed to provide an heir to the throne. Her legacy resulted from her love of art: the collection she began eventually became the core of the Museo del Prado, which opened a year after her death. In this oration, the author mentions that she was learning to draw and had established a school for young girls (pp. 23-5).

Fr. Josef Giner y Salelles, a Hieronymite monk, was formerly the prior of San Miguel de los Reyes in Valencia.

FIRST EDITION of this scarce and valuable history of the wars that ultimately expelled the Dutch from Brazil. Borba de Moraes comments, "Despite the fact that it is not a primary source book, it is very much sought after and has become rare." The author based his work on a manuscript by Diogo Lopes Santiago that was not published until 1875-1880, and also on such contemporary sources as Manoel Calado's *Valeroso Lucideno* and D. Francisco Manoel de Mello's *Epanaforas*. It is written as a panegyric to João Fernandes Vieyra, who organized and led the final insurrection (1645-1654): "Whatever his shortcomings, the rebellion of 1645 could hardly have succeeded without him, and his name is an imperishable one in Luso-Brazilian history" (Boxer p. 276). The nickname "Castrioto" refers to Jorge Castrioto, King of Epirus (Albania), the tale of whose exploits was popular in Portugal at this time.

The engraved title page has an fine half-length oval portrait of João Fernandes Vieyra in elaborately chased armor, wearing the Ordem de Cristo; a rectangle below holds his name, and running around the frame are the Latin words "Patrarunt nomen illi." Allegorical figures in niches surround him. Above the portrait, the figure of Fortitudo hefts a Doric column; putti to either side bear a sword and a trumpet, representing martial valor and fame. To the left of the portrait, Fidelitas carries a book and the scales usually

associated with Justice. To the right, Liberalitas holds a book and raises a hand in greeting. At the foot of the page is Fernandes Vieira's coat of arms, in an elaborate frame. The engraving is signed by Clemente Billingue ("Clemente Billingue Invenit e fes."), whose dates Soares estimates as ca. 1660 to after 1716. Soares considers him proficient but not inspired: "um artista operoso, correcto por vezes nos delineamentos, mas desprezando quási por completo as expressões das suas figuras ... um abridor de profissão e nunca um artista entusiasta pela sua arte."

Frei Raphael de Jesus (d. 1693), a Benedictine monk, was named *Chronista-mor do Reino* by a decree of 1681. He wrote the seventh part of the *Monarquia lusitana*, published in 1683.



Bernardo Peralta, 1730. The text is concerned with the priority of the Hieronymites in Spain, i.e., when they were established and how much authority they have or ought to have. The Hieronymite order, following the rule of St. Augustine, controlled royal monasteries such as the Escorial and Santa Maria de Guadalupe in Extremadura in Spain and the Jerónimos monastery at Belém in Portugal.

Beginning on the third unnumbered leaf and continuing to the final preliminary leaf are "Memorias para la vida de D. Luis de Salazar," including a "Cathalogo de las obras impressas, y manuscritas de Don Luis de Salazar, formado del de Frankenau, y de su Bibliotheca manuscrita" of four pages. Don Luis was a leading genealogist, having written extensively on the subject, and his library was rich in genealogical manuscripts. An interesting biographical detail is that Don Luis's bed was normally covered with books. He was known as an expert in both civil and canon law, using his knowledge of the latter on several occasions to attempt to resolve disputes between religious orders.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this work in favor of the Benedictine Monks in their dispute with the Hieronymites over precedence in the processions of *Corpus Christi* and other religious ceremonies. This extensive and drawn-out controversy gave rise to a number of books.

Frei Manuel de Santo António (Lisbon, 1671-Coimbra 1749), a monk of the Benedictine Order, was Lente de Theologia at the Universidade de Coimbra and Rector of the colleges of his order both in Coimbra and Lisbon.

FIRST EDITION; a facsimile was published in 1988. Scholars had been nagging Frei Fortunato, the chronicler of Alcobaça, to publish some of the rich manuscript holdings of the monastery's library. Volume I includes an invocation to the Virgin on the hymn *Ave Maris Stella*, a discourse on the Acts of the Apostles, a catechism, an explanation of the Ten Commandments, a discourse on the symbol called Athanasian, short works by Dr. Fr. João Claro, and fragments of an early version of the Rule of St. Benedict. Volume II includes stories from Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Judges, Ruth, and 1-2 Kings. Volume III includes stories from 3-4 Kings [*sic*], Tobias, Ezekiel, Daniel, Judith, Esther, and Maccabees, and on the capture of Jerusalem and the rebuilding of Jerusalem and the Temple.

Frei Fortunato de São Boaventura (1777-1844) was born in Alcobaça, where his father was a bookseller. He took a Doctor of Theology degree at the Universidade de Coimbra and later taught there for many years. A distinguished historian, he is best known for his chronicles of the Cistercian congregation at Alcobaça. During the 1820s he launched a career as a political polemicist on behalf of absolutism, gaining a reputation as a lesser P. José Agostinho de Macedo. In 1831 D. Miguel rewarded his loyalty by appointing him Reformador Geral dos Estudos, and the following year he was confirmed as Archbishop of Évora. After the fall of D. Miguel in 1834, he sought refuge in Italy.

The present edition is significantly different from the other editions, all of which are rare—but this one appears to be the rarest. It seems to be the only edition edited by Josef Felix Maceda, and contains material on pp. 55-65 not in any of the others. p. 65 is a note about cooking the “raiz y la hoja” in white wine. There are also other differences. Comparing the present volume to the editions of Madrid: Imprenta de Hilario Santos, 1786 and 1787, the “Nota del editor” is greatly expanded. On p. 13, which begins “Nombres y virtudes de la Planta Carqueyxa” there is a paragraph, continuing to p. 14, and with a footnote on that page, which is not present in these Madrid editions. There are other subsequent significant variations in the text.

This Segovia edition is more closely related to that of Madrid: Imprenta de Pantaleon Aznar, 1787, but there are also differences other than the final 11 pages. In addition to some minor variants, a section from pp. 40-1 of the Aznar edition, titled “Precaucion,” has been omitted. Then, in the section which begins “Noticias adquiridas por el Edictor de algunas curas muy particulares, hechas por la Carqueyxa” on p. 51 of our volume, and on p. 43 of the Aznar edition, several of the cures mentioned are different. Regarding the edition of Madrid: Imprenta de Blás Roman, 1790, it appears to follow more or less the two Hilario Santos editions, with more or less the same differences from ours.

The plant known as *carqueyxa* (*Genista tridentata*) in the Galician dialect, from the genus *Genista*, is a plant similar to what is known in English as “Common broom” [*Genista scoparia*]. (See Henry Stephens, *The Book of Farm*, volume I, 1844, p. 347; see also “Genista” in Bartholomew Parr, M.D., *The London Medical Dictionary*, London: 1809, Volume I, p. 701.) It is known in Spanish as *carquesa* and in Portuguese (and in some areas of Spain) as *carqueja*. It is a type of shrub typical of the Iberian Peninsula, known for flowers of a deep, intense yellow that bloom in May and June. The plant has long been valued for its medicinal qualities, and is still used by homeopathic specialists and in many folk remedies. Current herbalist practices differ little from Sarmiento’s *Disertacion*.

Sarmiento describes how *carqueyxa* was made into syrup, which the poor and provincial people in Spain used as a remedy to purify the blood (p. 34). *Carqueyxa* was seen as an affordable alternative to an unnamed plant that was brought from Japan for similar purposes (p. 35). Pages 55-65 list cases where patients in the area of Segovia had read an earlier edition of Sarmiento’s work and improved their illnesses through these remedies. Treatments in this section include bathing in water infused with *carqueyxa* flowers from the Cebrero mountains of Galicia, which gave patients relief from rheumatism. Pages 55-58 tell of a patient who was forbidden to eat chocolate due to stomach problems. After drinking *carqueyxa* tea, the patient (Don Miguel Dovalin) was able to eat chocolate freely. Later pages describe patients being cured of gout by applying boiled *carqueyxa* flowers to the affected areas externally, with a cloth: one patient was even able to ride horseback again (p. 61). *Carqueyxa* tea is also cited as curing a patient whose lack of appetite was so extreme that he was near death (p. 60), and a patient who was cured of recurring tertian fevers (*tercianas rebeldes*) by drinking *carqueyxa* flower tea (p. 62).

The revered Portuguese herbalist José Salgueiro (b. 1919) has written highly of *carqueja* (to use its Portuguese name), in the form of tea brewed from the flowers, as one of the most effective plants to cure illnesses and diseases of the liver. This tea is also said to be effective for illnesses of the gallbladder, kidneys, bladder, and urinary tract. Using a similar treatment method as the one Sarmiento describes, José Salgueiro describes how to use *carqueja* externally, by boiling the flowers and then applied gauze soaked in the liquid to a skin sores (*chagas*). *Carqueja* is still considered effective as a blood purifier, and for relieving diabetes, stomach illnesses, intestinal problems, the flu, colds, bronchitis, and pneumonia. For internal illnesses, Salgueiro prescribes 35 grams of flowers added to 1 liter of water, bring to a boil and let steep for 10 minutes. (See José Salgueiro, *Ervase, Usos e Saberes*, Lisbon: Edições Colibri, 2013, pp. 108-9.)

Father Martín Sarmiento, born Pedro José García Balboa (Villafranca del Bierzo, El Bierzo, 1695-Madrid, 1772) was a Spanish scholar, writer, and Benedictine monk, and an illustrious representative of the Enlightenment. He was born in Leon and grew up in Galicia, where he developed an interest in the Gallego language. He wrote on a wide

variety of subjects, including literature, medicine, botany, ethnography, history, theology and linguistics.

Whitehead lists 19 titles at the British Library printed by Antonio Espinosa between 1780 and [ca. 1800]. Only two, from 1780 and 1788, have Segovia imprints; the rest have Madrid imprints.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this poem celebrating the victory of twenty-year-old D. Afonso VI at the Battle of Ameixial on June 8, 1663. In Spain it is usually called the Battle of Estremoz; here it is referred to as the Battle of Canal, after the parish near Évora where the battle took place. This was one of the major battles of the Restauração, which effectively ended Spain's attempt to undo Portuguese independence, finally recognized in 1668. The Spanish had overrun southern Portugal under the leadership of D. Juan de Austria, natural son of Philip IV of Spain. The Portuguese, reinforced by English troops and led by Schomberg, inflicted heavy casualties and forced the Spanish to retreat across the border to Badajoz. The Spanish garrison at Évora surrendered soon afterwards.

Frei Jeronymo Vahia (1620?/1630?-1688), court preacher to D. Afonso VI, was in his time a famous orator and poet. Born in Coimbra (some say near Viana do Castelo), he became a Benedictine monk in 1643, eventually becoming *cronista* of the Order. Over 500 pages of his poems, in the style of Gongora, appeared in *Fénix Renascida*, volumes I-IV. Innocência, who complains of his "violentas metaphoras, e conceitos exquisitamente esquadrinhadados," confusingly adds that if he hadn't succumbed to the "mania que predominava entre os seus contemporaneos," Vahia would be considered one of Portugal's best poets. Of late there have been reevaluations and increased interest in the poetry of this period in general, and in this author in particular.

FIRST EDITION, later issue: the same as the original 1773 edition except for the new title pages and half titles. This comprehensive dictionary for those studying historical documents or paleography includes 51 engraved plates with facsimiles of ancient and national scripts—one or two plates for each letter of the alphabet, plus other subjects such as Latin abbreviations. The entries in the dictionary include lengthy discussions of dates, abbreviations, scripts, seals, and a host of official documents (secular and clerical). In the preface, the author describes the difficulties of studying this field and what he hopes to accomplish by compiling a dictionary such as this.

Jean-François de Vaines (1733-1803) is identified on the title page as a Benedictine from the Congregation of St. Maur, whose members were known for their high level of scholarship.

Provenance: D. José de Saldanha Oliveira e Souza, who also used the name José Luiz de Saldanha (1839-1912), was a son of D. João de Saldanha Oliveira Juzarte Figueira e Sousa, 3° conde de Rio Maior, and brother of António José Luís de Saldanha Oliveira Juzarte Figueira e Sousa, 4° conde and 1° marquês de Rio Maior. A chemist and mineralogist, parliamentary deputy, and high government official, he studied mathematics and philosophy at Coimbra University, wrote on subjects as varied as agriculture, finance, and engravings, and amassed an important library. He was a devoted proponent of progress in the national agricultural sector, which he considered one of the primary sources of public wealth. The Casa da Anunciada library of the counts of Rio Maior was one of the best private libraries ever formed in Portugal. It was dispersed for the most part not long after the April 1974 Portuguese revolution.

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
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
