

First edition of this adaptation. Prince Adalbert's *Aus meinem Tagebuche*, was printed for private distribution only; Kletke rewrote the Prince's first-person diary as a third-person narrative and offered it commercially. The frontispiece shows the Prince in full military regalia.


Prince Adalbert and his suite arrived in Rio de Janeiro in 1842. From there they made several excursions, to Nova Friburgo, Macaé, Campos, etc. Next they sailed to Pará, from there up the Amazon to the Xingu, and up the Xingu to a point never before visited by Europeans. Upon their return to Pará the Prince and his entourage made excursions into Maranhão, Recife and Bahia. The Brazilian section of the book covers pp. 207-749. Preceding it is a description of the Prince's journeys to Aetna, the Alhambra, Gibraltar, Cádiz, Madeira and Tenerife, with substantial chapters on each.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION? The writer was Ouvidor and Juiz da Alfandega in Funchal. He proposes a sweeping overhaul of the Finances of the Customs House there. This should be seen in the context of the 1820 liberal revolution in Portugal. In 1821 the Constitutional Côrtes was meeting, writing Portugal's first constitution, which would be promulgated the following year. The present text makes reference to the proposed constitution.




Frutuoso's magisterial, multi-volume history and geography of Portugal's Atlantic possessions (the Azores, Madeira, Cape Verde and the Canary Islands) was unpublished at his death, and remained so until it was donated to the Public Library and Archive on Ponta Delgada in the nineteenth century.

Gaspar Frutuoso (Ponta Delgada, 1522-Ribeira Grande, 1591), historian, priest and humanist, was a native of São Miguel in the Açores. He received both a bachelor's degree after studying under Domingos de Soto at the University of Salamanca, and a doctorate in theology from the Salamanca, or perhaps from the Jesuit university at Évora.





FIRST and ONLY EDITION of the COMPLETE COLLECTION. With the exception of the Vieira and Freitas bibliography, we have found no reference to more than the first 3 fascicles, and scant references to these. The first fascicle, referred to on the half title as "Volume I" and on the title page as "1.º Volume" deals with England, beginning with Liverpool, then brief description of Manchester, a long section on London, followed by brief sections on Old Hall Green and Brighton. The second fascicle, referred to on the title page as "2.ª Fasciculo", deals with Belgium and the Rhineland. The third fascicle, referred to on the title page as "França, Tomo I", deals exclusively with Paris. The fourth fascicle, referred to on the title page as "4.° Fasciculo, França, Tomo II", also deals substantially with Paris to p. 104, then goes on the describe the suburbs of Paris, Vichy, Bayonne, Pau, Lourdes, Toulouse, Marseilles, and Nice. These first 4 parts are bound in the first volume. The second volume begins with what is referred to on the title page as "5.ª Fasciculo, Italia, Tomo Primeiro". 

Dona Maria Amélia (1831-1853) was a princess of the Empire of Brazil and a member of the Brazilian branch of the House of Bragança. Her parents were Emperor Dom Pedro I, the first ruler of Brazil, and his second wife, the Empress D. Amélie of Leuchtenberg. The only child of her father's second marriage, Maria Amélia was born in France after Pedro I abdicated the Brazilian throne in favor of his son Dom Pedro II. Before Maria Amélia was a month old, Pedro I went to Portugal to restore the crown of the eldest daughter of his first marriage, Dona Maria II. He fought a successful war against his

brother Miguel I, who had usurped Maria II's throne. Only a few months after his victory, Pedro I died from tuberculosis. Maria Amélia's mother took her to Portugal, where she remained for most of her life without ever visiting Brazil. The Brazilian government refused to recognize Maria Amélia as a member of Brazil's Imperial House because she was foreign-born, but when her elder half-brother D. Pedro II was declared of age in 1840, he successfully intervened on her behalf. D. Maria Amélia became engaged to Archduke Maximilian of Austria in early 1852, but before the marriage could take place she contracted tuberculosis, and was taken to the town of Funchal on the Portuguese island of Madeira. Despite its reputedly healthy climate, her health continued to deteriorate, and she died on 4 February 1853. Her body was taken to mainland Portugal and interred in the Pantheon of the House of Braganza; almost 130 years later, her remains were taken to Brazil. In honor of her daughter, D. Maria Amélia's mother financed the construction of the "Princesa D. Maria Amélia" hospital in Funchal. The widowed Duchess of Bragança, Dona Amélia, i.e., Amélie of Leuchtenberg (Portuguese: Amélia Augusta Eugénia Napoleona de Leuchtenberg; French: Amélie Auguste Eugénie Napoléonne de Leuchtenberg, 1812-1873), former Empress of Brazil, was the granddaughter of Josephine de Beauharnais, Empress of the French. Her father, Eugène de Beauharnais, was the only son of Empress Josephine and her first husband Alexandre, Viscount of Beauharnais. He thus became a stepson of Napoleon Bonaparte when his mother married the future emperor. The mother of Empress Amélie was Princess Augusta, daughter of Maximilian I, King of Bavaria. D. Amélia was a well educated, cultured woman. She amassed a considerable library.





José Silvestre Ribeiro (Idanha-a-Nova, 1807-Lisbon, 1891), Portuguese politician and historian, was administrator of various districts, among them his term as Governador Civil do Districto de Funchal from 1846 to 1852 (with a brief interruption due to the Patuleia revolt), Minister of Justice, parliamentary deputy and peer of the realm. He distinguished himself on several occasions, not the least of which was in combating the 1847 famine in Madeira. He was one of the most advanced Portuguese thinkers of his time.

*Provenance:* The extensive library of the Dukes of Palmela, formed mainly in the nineteenth century, was dispersed, for the most part, during the second quarter of the twentieth century through the 1960s. The first to hold the title was D. Pedro de Sousa Holstein (1781-1850), a Portuguese diplomat who served as prime minister at various times in the 1830s and 1840s. A native of Madeira (born ca. 1766-70), while a student at Coimbra Medina e Vasconcellos was accused of crimes that he indignantly states he had never even thought of; after a year and a half in prison, he was released on condition that he not return to Coimbra. He went back to Madeira, where in 1823 he was arrested for having contacts with partisans of the constitutional party. Medina e Vasconcellos died in 1824, on his way to serve an eight-year sentence of exile in Cabo-Verde.




