FIRST EDITION. The present volume has the peculiarity of containing the half title and title pages in duplicate, in slightly different settings of type.


The *Psalmos de David* is the first volume of the author's *Obras*. A second volume appeared the following year titled *Poesias sacras e profanas*. Each work has a separate title page. They tend to appear separately on the market, and are often listed separately in catalgues and bibliograpies. The *Psalmos* are preceded by a "Discurso" by Garção Stockler on Hebrew language and poetry. The translation of the *Psalmos* into Portuguese rhyme was made in 1806 in Lisbon, where Pereira de Sousa Caldas, a native of Rio de Janeiro, had fled from persecution for his letters to the Conde de Rezende. A second edition of the Obras appeared in 2 volumes in 1836, but without the *Psalmos*.

Sousa Ĉaldas (Rio de Janeiro, 1762-1814), was a Colonial Brazilian poet, priest and orator. An Arcadian, he was "o mais vigoroso lírico dos predecessores imediatos do romantismo" (Veríssimo p. 114). He was imprisoned in 1781 by the Inquisition on grounds of being "herege, naturalista, deísta e blasfemo"—apparently because he was influenced by Rousseau. Eventually he took orders and began writing sacred poetry. In 1808 he returned to his native Rio de Janeiro, where he died. He is patron of the 34th chair of the Brazilian Academy of Letters.

Second edition. Originally published at Coimbra, also by Amado, in 1894. Several Italian and Spanish translations also appeared.

The poet, diplomat and university professor Eugénio de Castro (Eugénio de Castro e Almeida, 1869-1944) introduced Symbolism to Portugal; as a young diplomat in Paris he came into contact with the great French symbolist poets, becoming a friend of Jean Moréas and Henri de Régnier. His influence can be seen even on such established Portuguese writers as Guerra Junqueiro, and he undoubtedly paved the way for Camilo Pessanha and Mário Sá Carneiro. Castro's verse ("often so perfect, always so artificial," says Bell, Portuguese Literature p. 337) signaled the return to poetry of careful thought and planning, as opposed to the inspired improvisation of the Romanticists, and led to the cult of "art for art's sake" or "estheticism" that became prominent in Portugal ca. 1925.


FIRST and ONLY EDITION of an early work, preceded only by Ante-manhã (1919) and Danças de roda (1921) by this notable woman poet, novelist, playwright, writer and translator, the author of at least 22 books, including poetry, fiction, theater, and juvenile literature. She translated Rainer Maria Rilke, Katherine Mansfield, Pirandello, and Ionesco

Maria Fernanda Teles de Castro e Quadros Ferro (Lisbon, 1900-Lisbon, 1994), poet, novelist and dramatist, usually published under the name Fernanda de Castro. On her mother's side she was descended from Goan aristocrats of Brahman background, on her father's from significant Portuguese military and arquitectural figures. Her poetry is exceptional, and in such volumes as *Ante-manhā*, *Danças de Roda*, *Cidade em flor, Jardim* and *Daquém e dalém alma*, "uma sensibilidade marvilhosa se alia à completa mestria da forma sem perda das mais espontâneas qualidades de frescura e singeleza" (*Grande enciclopédia*). She was responsible for the creation of the Associação Nacional dos Parques Infantis, which dispenses information on child care. Castro won the Academia das Ciências de Lisboa's prestigious Ricardo Malheiro prize in 1946, the first woman to be so honored. Her husband was the journalist, modernist poet, writer and propagandist for the Salazar regime, António Ferro, to whom the book is dedicated, and whom she accompanied to Brazil and participated with in the famous São Paulo Modern Art Week. She was the mother of the poet and critic António Quadros.







FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Magnificent full-color facsimile reproduction of a profusely illustrated, unique manuscript written in 1616, now in the Biblioteca da Ajuda. Manuel Fernandes, the author of the *Livro de traças de carpintaria*, calls himself "an official of the same art." This shipbuilding ordinance, describing more than 2 dozen ships of various kinds, is the equivalent of a treatise on shipbuilding of the time. According to the introduction by Rogério S.G. d'Oliveira, President of the Academia de Marinha, it is "of greater archaeological value than the best contemporary foreign works."

Second edition, "correcta e diminuida". The first edition, with 239 pp. and 4 plates, was published earlier the same year. A third edition appeared in 1929, apparently a reprint of the second. This book provides an overview of Brazilian history and literature, including the Portuguese background, with many biographical sketches. There is a section on Camões (pp. 47-57), one of Peixoto's major interests.

[Júlio] Âfrânio Peixoto (Lençóis, Bahía, 1876-Rio de Janeiro, 1947), distinguished physician, politician, historian, university president, eugenicist and hygienist, was a prolific author of novels, literary criticism, scientific works, etc. He was congressional representative from Bahia in the Brazilian federal Câmara de Deputados (1924–1930), and first President of the Universidade Federal do Rio de Janeiro. A member and President of the Brazilian Academia de Letras, his Obras completas, in 25 volumes, were published in 1944.



FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Includes a sonnet by Machado de Assis on p. 48. Other contributors, among many, are Joaquim Nabuco (2 sonnets, pp. 63-4), Sylvio Roméro (poem on p. 101), José Bonifacio de Andrada e Silva (2.°, "O Moço"; sonnet on p. 56), the Barão de S. Felix, Affonso Celso, the Visconde de Araguaya, Assis Brasil, J.C. Bandeira de Mello, Bernardo Guimarães, Alberto de Oliveira and Lins de Albuquerque. Editors of this revue, which consisted only of the present volume, were Baldino Coelho, Candido Rosa, Franklin Tavora, Moreira Sampaio and Nicolão Midosi.


