Northrop was a close friend of Davis since their days as cadets together at West Point. Back East on sick leave, Northrop studied medicine and began to practice in Charleston, SC, which led to his dismissal from the Army. Davis, when Secretary of War, reinstated and promoted him. Northrop resigned his commission when South Carolina seceded; Davis appointed him Commissary General of the Confederate Army. He later was appointed a brigadier general. His indifference to the fate of Union prisoners led to accusation that he was starving them, but Davis protected him from calls for dismissal until he was relieved of duty in February 1865.

"On the 9th of Dec., a pistol that was in my pocket went off, how, I know not, the ball entered my leg 4 or 5 inches above the knee, split the lower edge of the cap and concealed itself somewhere about the joint. Michigan Cavalry as a captain and was promoted to colonel after the Battle of Chickamauga. He married Mary Kent on 1 September 1864 while on a short leave. After Pritchard returned to his unit, Mary was injured in a railroad accident and spent the rest of her life in a wheelchair. Pritchard rose to fame as the commander of the unit that captured Jefferson Davis on 10 May 1865 in Georgia. After the war, Pritchard returned to the practice of law in Michigan. Though a national hero he avoided appeals to run for governor or congress.

Autograph letter signed, 3pp., to "Mary, My Dear Friend," dated Allegan, [Ohio], 17 August 1862. : I have become a man of war and have placed myself in the ranks of the great Army of the Union & have resolved to live under the Stars & Stripes or die fighting in their defense. I have become fully convinced that the time has come when every man should go who can go. I have raised a splendid company of Cavalry in this country and have it fully organized ... I hold the position of Captain, by choice of the Co."

Autograph letter signed, 4pp, to "Mary my own Dear Dear Darling," Dated On board the Steamship Clyde off Fortress Monroe, [Virginia], 20 May 1865. [With] orig. addressed mailing envelope. "Our country still lives and Liberty is ours and by the blessings of our God thy husband has been chosen to place the foot upon the serpent's neck and today the arch fiend & traitor and main author of all our national woes lies a prisoner in my power ... On the night of the seventh inst. I was sent out of Macon with my Regt. ... with directions to go 75 or 100 miles from M. & take possession of all the ferries ... and to scout the country as far as possible with a view to the capture of Jeff Davis & other parties--which were known to be flying from Richmond for the purpose of reaching the Trans. Mississippi Department. At Abbyville 75 miles from Macon on the afternoon of the 9th I came upon the track of a train which I captured on the morning of the 10th near Irwinville about 100 miles SE of Macon and which proved to be a very important capture as by it we secured the person and family of Jeff Davis his P.M. Gen [John Reagan] Col. Johnson & Col. Lubbock of his military staff and Burton N. Harrison his private Secretary, Majr. Mauravel, Capt. Moody & Lt. Hathaway also the Brother & Sister of Mrs. D. five wagons & three (3) ambulances & quite a number of Private soldiers..."

Autograph letter signed, 3pp., to "My Dearly Beloved Wife," Dated Fortress Monroe, 24 May 1865. [with] orig. addressed mailing envelope. "Jeff Davis & Clay were escorted on shore by me on the afternoon of the 22d inst. and delivered over to Maj. Gen. Miles. Comdg. the District Fortress Monroe in obedience of orders rect. from the Secy of War. They are heavily ironed and confined in solitary cells under a heavy guard in this Fortification where they will be kept until trial....
