The outstanding collection of late seventeenth- and eighteenth-century books, together with their sumptuous bindings, built up by Baron Ferdinand de Rothschild in the last 20 years of the 19th century match his other extraordinary collections (covered by the other catalogues in this series), and is among the best of its kind outside Paris. This catalogue reveals the riches of his collection for the first time. There are manuscripts (the compiler's own copy of the famous Guirlande de Julie (1641), written in the finest calligraphy of the period), decorated souvenirs of the high festivities of Louis XIV (such as the Ballet Royal de la Nuit), and the Plaisirs de l'Isle enchantée), the engraved masterpieces of the Cabinet du Roi, one of the two surviving copies of the 1718 Amours de Daphnis et Chloe illustrated by the Regent of France and bearing his personal arms on a mosaic binding, and a whole galaxy of the best illustrated French books of the Rococo period. The collection also contains an outstanding run of rare and highly attractive mosaic bindings, together with many in the dentelle style as well as others with wide, press-gilt, borders, and is thus not only a delight to the eye but also a survey of much that was the best in decorative book production at this richly inventive period.

The two volumes provide introductory surveys of the collection of ancien regimé books, of the Baron's life, historical interests and manner of book collecting (using important and unpublished trade documentation), an overview of the collection by subjects, a more detailed description of the illustrated books, and another of the wide range of royal, bibliophile and other important provenances. Two chapters cover the late seventeenth- and eighteenth-century Parisian book-binding trade and the technique of decorative gilding. The evolution of the various styles of the period are discussed one by one, and lists provided of all the examples in the collection, before a final section on bookbinders' 'signing' of their work and lists of English and other book bindings at Waddesdon. Of special importance is the classified index of French bookbinders' tools, which includes same size digital reproductions of most of those on the Waddesdon books, thus providing an authoritative reference on the best French bookbinding of this rich period. All 800 items are described in full detail with titlepage transcriptions, collations, lists of plates, details of provenance, descriptions of bindings, and notes on the importance of the works involved. A provenance index lists all identified past owners, with brief biographical notes. There is also a full biography. Apart from the extensive binders' tools index. numerous illustrations, with many in colour, bring the art of the Rococo book to life and provide an essential reference tool for anyone interested in books in France.

Giles Barber began his career at the Bodleian Library and was later Librarian of the Taylor Institution, and University Lecturer in Continental Bibliography, Oxford. He wrote extensively on ancien regime printing, publishing and book-collecting, as well as on bookbinding. He gave both the Pannizzi Lectures in the British Library (1988) and the Sandars Lectures at Cambridge (1998) and was Commandeur in the Ordre des Arts et des Lettres, Paris.
