*N.B.: Born in Brooklyn, Nat Finkelstein (1933-2009) studied photography under Alexey Brodovitch, the legendary art director of Harper's Bazaar, and worked as a photojournalist for the Black Star and PIX photo agencies, reporting primarily on the political developments of various subcultures in New York City in the 1960s. In 1964 Finkelstein entered Andy Warhol's Factory as a photojournalist and remained for three years; Finkelstein's photographs from this period are now regarded as some of the most iconic of the time.*

*Fine silvery impression. Horizontal centrefold reinforced and filled in. A vertical fold and other small restorations. The watermark is found in other early impressions of 1508, 1512 and 1514.*

*It is the first print of Lucas with a date and it is a rather large-sized print. In or around 1508 he also engraved Suzanna and the Elders and David playing the harp for Saul. It is already mature and very refined in style. Internationally it must have been recognized. One finds the group of trees used by Marc Antonio Raimondi in a print dated 1510. The subject shows the sleeping Mohammed while the Monk Sergius is killed by Mohammed's followers. For the story read the entry 40 in the catalogue of the Lucas van Leyden exhibition in Leiden in 2011.*



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

Second copy located, of the expanded second edition of a concise artillery manual. Jähns approvingly says about the rare 1685 edition: "Das kleine, für die Brusttasche eingerichtete Büchlein ist prachtig angeordnet und mit ganz guten Zeichnungen ausgestattet". With chapters on how to aim, how to fire, how to shoot at night, how to use a howitzer, what to do when ammunition jams, etc. A tear in one folding plate, some minor foxing and a few small stains; a good copy. Binding rubbed and with some damage to the hinges, but still firm.



With contributions by Creeley, Olson, Duncan, Dahlberg, Zukofsky, Layton, Leverett, Bronk, Jess, Blackburn, Eigner, Artaud, and many others. Illustrated with works by Franz Kline, Rene Laubies, and others. The final issue was devoted to Beat authors and contains work by Kerouac, Ginsberg, Snyder, Whalen, and a pre-publication excerpt from Naked Lunch by Burroughs.*

*An excellent set of this famous "assembling" produced in 100 copies by a group of Russian emigrants who had taken*



refuge in New York in 1979 after being expelled from the Soviet artist's organisation (their work declared provocative and harmful). The various issues contain original drawings, carbon paper in colour, collages, rubber-stamp and xerox art. The pages are made of envelopes, housing printed matter, objects, etc. The use of envelopes was caused by the fact that the Gerlovinss (of the New York editorial team) residence was across the street from an envelope manufacturer, who periodically threw excess stock away for pulping. The first number was issued under the title "Kolkhoz" and is devoted to Russian artists. Editorial board consists of: -Moscow team: The collective action group, Makarevich + Yelagina & co., The Toadstools, -New York team: Bakhchanyan, The Gerlovinss, The Tupitsyns. No. 1 "Kolkhoz" is devoted to Russian artists. Nos. 2 and 3 are international, No. 4 is a special issue called "Wonderkids": "Famous artworks (Miro, Picasso, Dubuffet, Twombly) influenced by children's art, are completed by children of contemporary artists". No. 5 is a special issue called: "5 years plan". No. 6 is the "Stalin Test", in which the editors ask various persons to make a contribution on the theme Stalin. Contributions by Komar & Melamid, V. Bakhchanyan, Rimma & Valery Gerlovin, C. Pittore, B. Cleveland, R. Kostelanetz, A. Abramov, Le Nussberg, B. Buczak, P. Rypson, G. Hendricks, T. Hsieh, E.M. Plankett, No-Grupo, Baroni, Blaine, Makarevich, J. Furnival, Dupuy, P. Frank, C. Schneemann a.o. The editions were 100 copies for the first 5, and 80 copies for No. 6.

*Duplessis-Mornay (1549-1623) was a French statesman and Huguenot leader. He escaped the massacres of St. Bartholomew and fled to England and for the next ten years acted as a military leader in the Huguenot cause and as a diplomatic agent to William of Orange and Henry of Navarre. He actively furthered the proceedings of the general synods of the French Reformed Church and cherished the ideal of the union of all Protestant Churches. The conversion of Henry IV (1593), whose trusted counsellor he had been, came as a great blow, but he continued to work hard for the toleration of the Huguenots and secured in 1598 the Edict of Nantes. In 1621, after the renewal of persecution under Louis XIII he retired to his castle, La Forêt-sur-Sèvre, where he died. He is nowadays considered to have been at least the intellectual author, if not the author, of the famous *Vindiciae contra Tyrannos*. His erudition was immense, he was called the "Pope of the Huguenots" and he was the author of various important writings: a true gentleman as well as a man of action and one of the key figures in the political-religious controversies and developments of the late 16th and early 17th century.*


Nicolaes Petter (1624 - 1672) was a 17th century German wine merchant and wrestling master. He was born in Mommenheim, Germany and took on an apprenticeship in Amsterdam, Netherlands as a young man. He then joined the wine guild and went on to become a successful wine merchant. Petter practiced a style of grappling known as luctoriis, and was known in his time as an undefeatable wrestler. His clientele seems to have consisted mostly of upper-class gentlemen, and the techniques he taught were considered more "civilized" than common wrestling. Petter wrote an extensive treatise on grappling as a means of urban self-defense titled *Klare Onderrichtinge der Voortreffelijcke Worstel-Konst* ("Clear Education in the Magnificent Art of Wrestling"), but did not publish it before his death in 1672. His widow inherited the manuscript and published it with illustrator Romeyn de Hooghe in 1674, and it was reprinted and translated many times in the following centuries. Sydney Anglo describes this text as "historically speaking, [one of] the [two] most important treatises on unarmed combat ever printed", and notes that "in many ways, the finest of all wrestling books-and deservedly the most famous-was the treatise by Nicolaes Petter and Romeyn de Hooghe". The combination of Petter's lucid descriptions, devoid of all jargon, and de Hooge's masterful depiction of pain and violence in the engravings, elevates the book to its position of solitary eminence. It is also probably unique in presenting an effective and complete unarmed combat system in a format from which it would be actually possible to learn. 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

\* Eugénie Smeenk (1883-1978), daughter of the owner of the renowned Hotel Du Soleil in Arnhem, collected signatures and other autograph contributions of famous visitors. In this album, there are three categories: musicians from abroad, actors from France and visual artists from the Netherlands. The most important visiting musicians were Sergei Rachmaninoff, who entered a musical fragment from the Second Piano Concerto, that he had performed in Arnhem that same evening (December 7, 1908) and Willem Mengelberg, who directed that concert; cellist Pablo Casals and pianist Harold Bauer, who performed together on November 26, 1907; opera singers Jeanne Raunay, Hermine Bosetti and Georgette Leblanc - with her husband, the author Maurice Maeterlinck - violinists Jacques Thibaud and Kathleen Parlow; and composer Richard Strauss. The actors' comprise famous actress Sarah Bernhardt, Édouard de Max with his young assistant Marie Ventura, and Coquelin Cadet. The actors' signatures are accompanied by friendly and humorous quotations.

The drawings and prints are generally from a slightly later date, 1909-1921. The artists are Jozef Israëls (pen drawing of a girl on a dune, not dated), Charles Dankmeijer (old farm, ink drawing), Toon Dupuis (photo of an equestrian statue), Hendrik van Bloem (landscape, etching), H.J. Haverman (rabbits, ink drawing), Kees van Waningen (landscape, charcoal drawing), Herman Moerkerk (old man, mottoed 'Sic transit...', elaborate drawing in aquarel and crayon), Willem E. Roelofs jr. (fish in a kitchen, ink drawing) and Benjamin Prins (old man from Ponte Tresa, pencil drawing).

An astonishing company to find in a young woman's album!



\* *A mythical book of modern Dutch literature! This copy of the first edition of Pijpelijntjes, published in June 1904, is one of the very few of which the complete original wraps have been preserved, even including the backstrip. The physician-writer A. Aletrino, to whom this openly gay erotic novel was dedicated in print, recognized himself in one of its two main characters ("Sam", Aletrino's nickname). Immediately after publication, along with De Haan's fiancee Johanna van Maarseveen, he bought up the whole edition and destroyed it. Only very few copies escaped destruction. In October 1904, a second, rewritten edition was published. The first edition of Pijpelijntjes is now considered one of the rarest books in Dutch literature.*

\* "Who Are We?" Poignant, direct, emotional gay love poetry by Scottish-born German poet John Henry Mackay, under his well-hidden pseudonym "Sagitta" ("arrow"): rhythmical stanzas about longing and sorrow. The second volume of the Buecher der namenlosen Liebe, in first edition, luxuriantly printed in 1000 copies on Zanders Bütten with endpapers of thin Japanese paper, and covers of Imperial Japanese, printed in gold.

An outstanding association copy: not only is this one of the rare surviving copies with handwritten date and name, it's a most important name: this is the subscription copy for 'Dr. Magnus Hirschfeld in Charlottenburg', on December 16, 1905. The number is 43, it probably was one of the first copies that were sold. After about 200 books had been distributed, the Buecher der namenlosen Liebe were banned (in 1909) and seized by the police. Part of this first edition was recovered by Mackay after 1918 and eventually sold, but unnumbered and without names.



**IN AANBOUW** Huge archive regarding the Dutch pre-war literary almanac *In Aanbouw*. Original correspondence, contributions, editorial notes, photographs and artwork. Hoornik, Karel Jonckheere, Cor Klinkenbijl, Louis Th. Lehmann, A. Marja, Adriaan Morriën, F.C. Terborgh, M. Vasalis, Ab Visser and publishing houses Leopold and Manteau; 150 concepts of letters and submission reviews by K. Lekkerkerker; 40 original photographs and drawings; dozens of proofs, clippings and promotional material; letters and prints about the reprint that was issued to commemorate the 50th birthday of the book. 1938-1946 and 1989.



\* Fascinating archive of the nicely illustrated almanac that published work of no less than 51 promising young literary authors of 1939 from Holland and Belgium. Composed by K. Lekkerkerker, *In Aanbouw* (meaning Under Construction) is considered the most important pre-war anthology. The letters by the (mostly male) poets and writers concern their latest work, their bio- and bibliographies (so far) and their portraits. This archive not only consists of full correspondences, but also shows Lekkerkerker's editorial work, his consultations with his Dutch and Flemish publishers, and his efforts to hold *In Aanbouw* exhibitions in bookstores all over the Low Countries.

Some authors, like Lehmann and d'Haese, overload Lekkerkerker with extensive letters, poems and stories. Others are more reserved: the illustrious bibliophile Emile van der Borch van Verwolde immediately refuses to cede a photograph, Belcampo considers himself too old to be included in the almanac, and the diplomat Reijnier Flaes does not wish to be associated with his pseudonym F.C. Terborgh. Much to Lekkerkerker's regret, M. Vasalis only sends a (charming) rejection letter. After the successful launch of *In Aanbouw* and its talents, some authors continue to correspond with Lekkerkerker about literature and more personal matters. The archive also contains poems and stories that were considered superfluous or unfit for publication: i.a. a satirical sonnet by Chris van Geel Jr. and a short story by Terborgh.

Een bibliographie van niets is moeilijk te geven" (Flaes, 6-1-1939); "Mijn schrijfdrift is belangrijk ouder dan mijn literaire loopbaan die beperkt is tot de publicatie van wat verzen in Helikon en van wat verzen en een korte novelle in Werk. Leopold en Gorter vonden mijn liefde voor poezie het eerst gereed. De Balzac en Dostojewsky leerden mij waardoor en waarom er geschreven moet worden" (Blaman, 29-7-1939); "Ik ben 1,77m lang, weeg 70 k.g., heb enige jaren gehockeyd en beoefen nu atletiek. Ik schrijf verzen sinds 1936, maar vind Bix Beiderbecke een grotere dode dan Rilke. Mijn werkwijze bestaat uit het imiteren van anderen, dat ik gepubliceerd word is geheel buiten mijn toedoen" (Lehmann, autobiography 1939).

*Important, multifaceted material from numerous beginners and budding authors - some with a shining future, some soon to be forgotten.*


\* "Hour-teller of Wisdom", divided into 24 chapters, such as the hours of the day, for time and again awakening the latent piety of the people. The Blessed Henry Suso, a Dominican monk (from the vicinity of Konstanz, about 1295-1366), illustrated this exhortation to religiosity with visions, writing in an enthusiastic, picturesque style. He was a student and admirer of the mystic Meister Eckhart. At the end of the book a solid learning method to master divine wisdom has been added, and after that a prayer of the Dominican Jordanus the Saxonia addressed to St. Dominic. These two latter, more lessonlike elements, are printed in red and black.

The Horologium Sapientiae had great influence in the late Middle Ages, for instance on Thomas a Kempis and Geert Grote. Hundreds of manuscripts in different languages are known and nine incunable editions. and shadow the compositions are being seen to best advantage. In the folder with the introduction by Ovink are five serigraphs, counterparts of five different letters. Paul van Capelleveen, curator of the National Library of the Netherlands, writes on his blog that artist and printer Harry van Kuyk (1929-2008) from the 1970s managed to draw - even international - attention for his unusual embossing compositions. To be able to manufacture them, he had a heavy press built that could get relief from several centimeters in a picture, both positive and negative: high and low, often combined in a single print. Van Kuyk's publications are at the cutting edge of the artist's book, private printing and graphic art. In libraries, his work is barely represented, but in museums all the more. The first 93 volumes have been numbered variously (sometimes "hors série"). Volumes 94-139 carry the number 152 under the colophon; starting from vol. 140 the membership number is 67. Stichting De Roos is still active and membership No. 67 is included in the ownership of this complete set.

Stichting De Roos was founded in 1945 by Chris Leeflang, Charles Nypels and G.M. van Wees. The foundation aims to publish (illustrated) literary publications by acclaimed Dutch and foreign authors in a bibliophile edition of 175 numbered copies. The complete range offers a fascinating insight into the development of the bibliophile book in the Netherlands from World War II until today, in regard to typography and to illustration. Numerous typographers and artists contributed to the success of De Roos: Hermanus Berserik, Irma Boom, Metten Koornstra, Jan van Krimpen, Kurt Löb, Frank Lodeizen, Charles Nypels, S.H. de Roos, Peter Vos and many, many others. Complete sets are getting very rare.

De jurist Theodorus Beckeringh (1712 – 1790) was amateur landmeter en reisde voor de vervaardiging van de kaart door de hele provincie. Dit leverde hem echter niet altijd nauwkeurige metingen en waarnemingen op. Tevens baseerde hij zich op diverse oude schetskaarten. Dit wordt te meer duidelijk wanneer men de kaart vergelijkt met 18de-eeuwse kaarten van professionele landmeters; Beckeringh zit er gemiddeld zo'n 2,5 km naast. De kracht van de kaart is dan ook niet de nauwkeurigheid, maar de exacte weergave van de grenscheiding met Friesland, Drenthe en Duitsland. In de randen links en rechts van de kaart staan afbeeldingen van 24 Groninger borgen (adelhuizen). Er is hierover nog wel enige strijd geweest in de Provinciale Staten. Uit voorstudies blijkt dat Beckeringh geen groot tekenaar was. De kwaliteit van zijn schetsen was zeer matig, maar thuis achter de tekentafel met behulp van een liniariaal werkte Beckeringh deze uit tot nette pentekeningen. Het werk is opgedragen aan stadhouder Willem V, zijn wapen treffen we tweemaal op de kaart aan. Rechts in de bovenrand staat het wapen van Stad en Lande. Het cartouche linksonder is versierd met het wapen van de Stad Groningen en De Ommelanden. Linksonder op de kaart zijn twee schaalstokken afgebeeld; een vermeldt Duitse mijlen, de ander geeft aan hoe lang een wandelaar over een bepaalde afstand doet. Midden onder een gezicht op de stad Groningen. De inzet rechtsboven toont een deel van de wadden en de eilanden Schiermonnikoog en Rottumeroog. Bijna 45 jaar na uitgifte worden de koperplaten van de kaart samen met 95 afdrukken in het openbaar verkocht. In een advertentie wordt de kaart aangeprezen als veelgevraagd en zeer nauwkeurig. Wat er met de platen is gebeurt, is niet bekend, doch het is niet onwaarschijnlijk dat ze zijn afgeslepen en opnieuw zijn gebruikt door een graveur voor het drukken van andere zaken.



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
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
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

Senya (Simon) Fleshin (also: Fléchine or Flechin, born in Achtyrka, Ukraine, Russia 1894, he died in Mexico City in 1981) was an anarchist and photographer. He and the anarchist Mollie Steimer (pseudonym of Marthe Alperine, born in Dunaevtsy, Russia 1897, died in Cuernavaca, Mexico 1980) met in Russia and became companions. In 1941 Fleshin and Steimer emigrated to Mexico. Their house became a meeting centre for political refugees and they corresponded with anarchists around the world. In May 1942 they opened the photographic studio Semo, abbreviations of Senya and Mollie. The photographs for this work, pictures of hands and feet in the work of modern ballet choreographer Hans Weidt, were made in the studio of Senya Fleshin in Paris before the WW II. Fleshin was forced to leave France after Hitler occupied Paris. The negatives survived the war and in 1975 this book was published as a result of a long-cherished dream.


Therefore institutional libraries would fasten their most valuable books to a horizontal iron bar running along the desk (picture attached so you can get an idea).

While the incunabulum is in itself not particular rare, examples which preserve the eyelet and entire chain (especially of such exceptional length), that can be attributed to a bookbinder are almost never encountered. Ernst Kyriß was a bookbinder researcher, on the bases of the stamps used, he identified certain bookbind ateliers. This volume came from the Carmelite convent in Bamberg (Kyriß, 52) and identified the binder as Johannes de Meien'.

Provenance: Carmelite convent of Bamberg (inscriptions on flyleaf and A2: "Carmeli Bambergensis"), secularised in 1803. Later in the library of the Liverpool physician Richard Caton (1842-1926), whose scientific work was crucial in discovering the electrical nature of the brain (his armorial bookplate on flyleaf).

*Damme Bindery in three very beautiful, blind-stamped bindings. The Van Damme Bindery was active in the year 1750-1786 in the city Amsterdam. The bindings made in this bindery belong to the best that was made in Amsterdam during the eighteenth century. The gilding used on the bindings is very diverse, in the middle of the covers a black central shield with the image of an angel, crowned by blessing hands. Surrounded by a triumphal arch with a pair of angels stamped in each other's mirror image on top of it, altogether framed by broad ornamental border. The spines are decorated with an angel surrounded by tendrils between each raised band, leaving some space for the title and volume indication. The Van Damme Bindery was known to place minor and sometimes almost hidden references in the gilding, which point out to the content of the book. The tooling used for this set is an example of this. The angels and the blessing hands refer to the religious content of this work.*

The engravings are originating from the Flemish School, mostly after Rubens, Rembrandt, Jordaeus, Landseer, De Vos, De Hondecoure, Potter and Vinckboons. The Royaalbijbel can be seen as a collection of large-sized Bible prints with or without the Bible text in book form. The customer was able to choose the prints and have them bound by a book binder. Because of the private compilation and the considerably large stocklist of Visscher of Royaalprints, every copy is unique and extremely diverse. For example, 66 of the engravings of this copy are also present in the Royaalbijbel of the British Museum and 65 of the engravings are also present in the copy of the Museum Boijmans Van Beuningen. 17 of the engravings can not be found in either copy. Besides biblical scenes this copy contains 2 stair engravings (the First World on 13 stairs and the Twelve Apostles on 12 stairs), an engraving of the christian household, an engraving of the 7 works of mercy, a caricature of the Catholic Church and an engraving of the Christian Knight. Under almost every engraving a title in Latin with an accompanying poem in Dutch. The prints make a beautiful whole and are arranged in order of events, the text block is decorated with gilt and near the edges gauffred with a design of flowers.*

The print series is beautifully and precisely engraved, the colouring is even and the colourist used quite a lot of colours. Under the engravings is listed the reference to the accompanying Bible text and a 4 line long poem both in Latin and in German. The engravings are mostly engraved by Jan and Casper Luyken and some by François Antoinne Meloni and Paul Decker. This is a later and undated edition, the frontispieces are almost the same compared to the other editions which are dated from 1708-1714, except that in this edition the printer information from Endter is added. The print series is like that from the other editions but is printed without numbers. Christoph Weigel was a very known German publisher who collaborated multiple times with father and son Luyken. He published the German edition of the known emblem book 'Het Menselyk Bedryf' and Casper Luyken worked for a year in his publishing house in Nürnberg. This edition is the only copy of this work that was not printed by himself but was outsourced to be printed by Endter. This copy proves to be a special one according to the description of Van Eeghen, he writes that he only knows the New Testament of this edition, Poortman only states in his standard work that this edition exists but that he is not acquainted with it.



\* Anna Maria van Schurman 1607-1678, was an exceptionally learned scholar, artist and student and is regarded as the most famous Dutch woman of her time. From her hand were published multiple works, among which the Opuscula which contains letters and poems from and to Van Schurman. This edition from 1653, is the third and most extensive copy of the Opuscula and contains extra letters and poems compared to the other 3 editions. This copy also contains a different portrait with a different caption. Van Schurman engraved the portraits for her published works herself.

\* Uncut identically bound set of this extensive standard work about the world history. The series was originally published in English in 65 volumes and was one of the first works that unified the history of Western Europe with the other known cultures. Because of the extensiveness of the series it became widely known and was translated and published in full or abridged. Kornelis Westerbaen took this job on him for the Dutch edition, he started translating 'A Universal History' in 1736, of which was published a volume annually -enriched with his own annotations- with the title 'Algemeene Histori. The series, containing 18 volumes and an index volume, describe the history of the world from its creation to the year 1462. The series contains 18 different frontispieces, 62 maps and 24 engravings, all maps and almost all engravings are folding. The engravings depict historical sites, Biblical scenes, character sets, portraits, coins and artifacts. Both the text blocks and the engravings are beautifully bright and fresh.

\* The first edition by publisher Cock of this psalterium, called 'Souter Liedekens' in popular language. The Souter Liedekens are collected and compiled by Jonkheer Willem van Zuylen van Nyeveld, Lord of Bergambacht. He was the first to put the Psalms of David in Dutch rhyme, to the tune of known, most worldly songs. These were, even during the most severe persecutions in The Netherlands, eagerly sought, used, and sung by the people. The demand was so large that 6 different editions were published by the same editor in the same year (1540). In this edition 165 psalmes are set to rhyme, from which 154 in music notation with one accord. The text is printed in black and red, the titlepage is decorated with a woodcut engraving depicting king David playing his harp.



Already in the fifties Max and I decided to specialize mainly in Dutch literature. We brought together a huge stock, tucked into which there are collections of the best or most important authors, complete in all their publications up to their death and/or their collected works.

This has enabled me to do research. In the beginning the focus was more on the content comparing texts and typesetting. Now the emphasis of my research is more on the physical appearance, for instance on the variant bindings of the same book. For more information on this see my publication *Willem Elsschot in Boek en Band, Een eerste inventarisatie van bandvarianten*, published by the Willem Elsschot Genootschap and us in 2010, see also *Das Zahngold* which is the website of author and publisher and former editor in chief of Literair supplement of NRC Handelsblad Reinjan Mulder.

In my illustrated catalogue devoted to Daniël Heinsius I published the results of my research of the variants of the same emblems over many years of publishing. I intend to do the same with some of the emblematic works of Jacob Cats. A recent illness however made it clear to me that it would be wiser if I tried to disperse the collections myself, which Max and I had made with so much energy and love.

Our collection of Couperus books in variant bindings (which is even more complete than the famous Eekhof collection in the Royal Library (KB)) is already in the safe hands of Ruud Veen (grandson of Couperus' foremost publisher), see his [www.couperus-collectie.nl](http://www.couperus-collectie.nl).

Our Elsschot collection with all the variant bindings (see above) is now in the Letterenhuis (formerly AMVC) in Antwerp.

Of the many collections that are still in my possession, here are some examples:

## Rhetoricians

A collection of 14 different festive books at gatherings of Rhetoricians from the Gent plays of 1539 in the edition of 1564 to one of the very last *Vlissings Redens-Lusthof* in 1641, printed in 1642. As highlights: *Spelen van Rotterdam* 1561, printed in 1564 and *Zeven Spelen van Bermherticheyd*, Amsterdam 1591. A sixteenth century edition of Matthijs de Casteleins *Conste van Rhetoriken* could be added. No collection like this has been offered since the Scheepers Auction, 1947.

## Daniël Heinsius

Our collection of the poetry in Dutch by Daniël Heinsius (1580-1655), ranging from an unknown edition of *Quaeris Quid sit Amor?* 1601 or 1602, that is also an Album Amicorum of 29 songs, 18 of which are not in the databank of the P.C. Meertens Institute of Amsterdam University, to an unknown edition in 24mo oblong published by Blaeu of *Emblematum Amatoria*, which is earlier than the one known (copies of this are in Amsterdam and Leiden University libraries). Our copy is bound together with an edition of Vaenius *Emblematum Aliquot Selectiorum Amatoria*, issued by Blaeu and also unknown and earlier as well. None mentioned in NCC.

## Herman Gorter

A collection of Herman Gorter's poetry, including all except for one of his pre-publications with the highlight Jenne's copy of his *Liedjes*, 3 Vols. in red morocco (only 3 copies, for Herman, Ada & Jenne exists). A collection of almost all editions of the *Mei* and a deluxe set of his works published in 1916 in green morocco might be added.

## J.J. Slauerhoff

A collection of all the works of J.J. Slauerhoff (poetry and prose) in all editions up to and including the first edition of his collected works 1940-1958 (if wanted in the deluxe edition). Highlights, apart from a deluxe copy of his first book, *Archipel* 1923, the 2 Du Perron editions, include the never offered *Soleares* 1933 in the first edition printed in only 15 copies, this copy nr. 1. Some of the very scarce dedication copies might be added.

## Menno ter Braak

Originally my private collection, built up over many years, of 60 dedication copies of works by Menno ter Braak, with dedications to fellow authors of that period, often close friends like E. du Perron, J. Greshoff, H. Marsman, Dick (D.A.M.) Binnendijk, Jo Otten, A. Vigoleis Thelen, Arthur Lehning, G.H. 's-Gravesande (his colleague at Het Vaderland) and also to his brother, in the book that is also dedicated to him: *Demasqué der Schoonheid*, 1932.

## Karel van de Woestijne

A collection of all the works in all editions until 1946 (poetry and prose) by Karel van de Woestijne, including 12 deluxe copies, some hitherto not known to exist.

If wanted variant bindings of Van Dishoeck editions might be added.

## Paul van Ostaijen

A collection of Paul van Ostaijen (poetry and prose) of all books published from *Music-Hall* onwards until 1946, including some deluxe copies. Some dedication copies might be added.

## A.A. Balkema

A complete collection of the Amsterdam book production (before, in and after the Second World war up to his departure for S.Africa) of bookdealer and publisher A.A. Balkema, in the Huis op de Drie Grachten, including of course his 5 lb. Press. Also included is the fabulous first edition of the *Omar Khayyam* in the typography of Jan van Krimpen, printed in only 12 copies (plus one) in 1944. Extra copies of some of the editions on different paper and or with variant covers might be added.

## Fine Printing

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For more information on all of the above see some of our catalogues (on our website or ask for copies on paper of catalogues on *De Zilverdistel*, *De Kunera Pers* and the *Halcyon Press*) and also the more recently published book *The Ideal Book* (2010) by Paul van Capelleveen and others, and the earlier published by Van Halsbeke (Stols), 1929 and Pannekoek (later 's-Gravesande) 1925, and of course on the great artist Van Krimpen up to now the only book is by Dreyfus - *The work of Jan van Krimpen: a record in honour of his sixtieth birthday*, 1952. Smaller collections on this subject (Fine Printing in the Netherlands) are also possible.

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*Kenneth James Dover (1920-2010) - An evergreen hobby: languages and linguistics. Scrinium purchased Dover's complete library in 2010. Some of his books were not for sale till now. They give a nice impression of the young scholar to be. Kenneth James Dover (KJD) opens Chapter 5 of his 'Marginal Comment: At some time - I can't be precise - my interest in alphabets, writing-systems and codes (I did not draw any significant distinction between an evolving script and an invented code) made a decisive and enduring shift from symbol to substance: I became interested in languages. (...) My thirteenth-birthday present from my parents in March 1933 was Alice Werner's little book 'The Language Families of Africa' and I don't think they can have been guessing. Codrington's 'Melanesian Languages followed as a Christmas present. From that moment, with an abruptness rather like Toad's conversion from caravans to cars in 'The Wind in the Willows', I was hooked on the Western Pacific, and dropped Africa. By 1938 I had collected over thirty grammars, dictionaries and comparative studies of the languages of Indonesia, New Guinea and the Pacific Islands.'*

Speaking quite passable English, he showed us round his private museum, and gave us a vigorous exposition of his theory about the Asiatic origin of the ruling dynasty of Mycenae. (...) To the majority of English scholars he is a kind of dragon breathing half-baked heresies; to us, one of the nicest characters one could meet.' (pp.37-38). We (...) 'went by car to the ruins of Nicopolis. It was here that Augustus won the battle of Actium, and to commemorate his victory founded the city, which Justinian afterwards enlarged. (...) Massive ruins stand up along every horizon; instead of stones, the fields are full of bits of Roman brick. (...) We scrambled through masses of brambles and devilish thorns to look of Augustus's temple in order to piece together his inscription, and all but lost our way in pitch-dark passages beneath the Odeon. (...) As Alistair said, if only some rich American would 'donate' a million pounds for its clearing and excavation, it might be a second Pompeii, almost a second Rome.' (pp.38-39).

As it became increasingly clear that the authorities were closely monitoring the 'atheist Jew', Spinoza decided to postpone publication. It was only after his death, 21 Febr. 1677, that the clandestine operation could take place. The dying Spinoza had instructed his landlord to send all of his manuscripts from The Hague to the Amsterdam publisher Jan Rieuwertsz. A team of approx. 6 editors, all former friends of Spinoza, managed to prepare two editions, in Latin and in Dutch, in a very short period of time. By the end of December 1677, both versions of the book were ready for distribution. Already in June 1678 the book was banned by the States of Holland. 



*The French Dominican Nicolaus Gorranus (ca 1210 - ca 1295) was unsurpassed by his contemporaries as a preacher and scriptural commentator. This book contains Gorran's work on the Pauline writings (to the Romans, 1st and 2nd Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1st and 2nd Thessalonians, Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews) together with a few short writings by a.o. Dionysius (the Areopagite) and Ignatius (of Antioch). This is the only one of Gorran's works that has been printed in the 15th century.*

*Johann Koelhoff the Elder started his own printing office in 1471 at Cologne, after having worked with Wendelin von Speyer in Venice. His introduction of the system of quire-signatures was an important contribution to the art of printing there. He died in 1493 and had more than 125 works printed.*

*Binding: covers decorated with extensive blind-tooling elements in the shape of 5-leaves flower elements, leaf-like elements and smaller dot-star elements within rhomboid spaces formed by parallel crossing lines (this concept not in Kyriss (Verzierte gotische Einbände im alten deutschen Sprachgebiet).*

*Condition: Leaves d6, k10, l9, dd8, mm2 and qq10 with repaired tears; several leaves slightly browned; some dispersed stains; edges with (water)stains. Altogether a fine, broad-margined and clean copy of a very rare incunable.*


