

















## Collection of Photographs by Neal Barr for Harper's Bazaar, 1967-1974.





celebrities in designer clothing -- Diane Keaton in DVF, Marlene Dietrich in necklace by Jean Louis, and models in clothes by Givenchy, Dior, *et al.* All photographs in excellent condition, taken from 1967-1974, though some may have been printed in the 1990s. Most are inscribed by Barr on the back of the matte to Dorothy Weaver, with typed labels identifying the photograph's subject, the designer, and its intended publication date or usage. Includes the original mailing envelopes, many of which contain short correspondence from Barr to Weaver, in his hand, on his stationery. Neal Barr (b. 1932) has enjoyed tremendous success as a fashion and ad photographer, from his start as an apprentice to Irving Penn, to the opening of his own studios in New York and California.

#### 2. Handwritten and Illustrated Costume Manuscript Inscribed to Cecil B. DeMille by Josef Schildkraut.

removed. Half blue calf gilt; binding professionally repaired, edges and corners rubbed. Cecil B. DeMille (bookplate, his sale, Christie's East, 18 October 1988, lot 235), with presentation inscription by Josef Schildkraut dated 1935.

Jakob Hefner-Alteneck (1811-1903), director of the Bavarian National Museum in Munich, published this collection of reproductions from medieval manuscripts and sculpture in a 3-volume edition (Frankfurt: Keller-Beyerle, 1840-1854). This is a manuscript copy of the first part of that work based on the Mannheim edition (Lipperheide Ca5), from the library of Cecil B. DeMille, given to him by the film actor Josef Schildkraut. The illustrations depict costume, armor, and courtly dress. DeMille's library was especially rich in illustrated books of historical costume and artifacts, which he used as sources for costumes and props in his historical films. Schildkraut (1896-1964) appeared in some sixty films from 1915 to 1964, including the role of Otto Frank in *The Diary of Anne Frank* (1959). A fine manuscript book with notable provenance and a fine association.

Collection of 10 Original Drawings for Women's Outerwear, Coats

America, c. 1930s

Group of 10 original costume studies, on heavy cardstock mounts ranging in size from about 9.5-by-10.5 inches to 13-by-18 inches, in pen-and-ink or grey wash heightened in white. Presumably created by S. C. Cavanagh Ltd., with the firm's name in pencil along the bottom edge of many of the studies. Expertly carried out illustrations of elegant women, in long coats or evening jackets, pinky fingers held delicately aloft. All cards a little rubbed and smudged along the edges, but overall nice and bright, suitable for display. A wonderful collection for the classic or vintage stylist.

Cora MacGeachy was one of the premier costume designers on Broadway in the first quarter of the 20th century, working notably as sole costume designer on musicals and revues produced by Florenz Ziegfeld.

4. **Original Painting by Cora MacGeachy, Costume Designer.** New York, early 20th century. Image of a woman in tiara and a striking pink and green dress -- the green coils into a snake, the pink sleeves are fashioned into enormous orchids -- rendered in ink and gouache, with the artist's signature at the bottom. About 17-by-11.5 inches, with some very light chipping along the edges, nowhere infringing into the image. Suitable for framing.

Painting on heavy cardstock (about 12-by-15 inches), background painted silver, each featuring a costumed woman, expertly rendered in gouache, ink, and paper, with the title handwritten on the back. "Ballerina" shows a woman in fluffy pink and silver skirt, silver hat, and glittering bodice. "Pierrette" shows a woman in ruffled silver tutu with enormous pink and white trail, glittering pink hat and bodice. Both paintings are in excellent condition, suitable for display, with just some light rubbing along the edges. Bold, and pretty.



Contemporary green morocco, giltstamped lettering and ornament in spine compartments (5 raised bands); 3 volumes, 120 x 190 mm; containing a total of 37 silver prints (92 x 140 mm) mounted to the recto only of grey heavy cardstock leaves, with the name of the studio

the mount. Features one mustachioed gentleman "trying on" different postures, identities, and costumes in the studio, including businessman's attire, tuxedos, ethnic costume (sombrero!), swimming costume (Speedo!). He flexes his biceps, he smokes a cigar. Spine somewhat sunned; some light scuffing along edges of boards. One leaf detached, otherwise internally bright and clean.

Red card wrappers with "Gunal Erkose" stamped in gilt on front cover; two volumes, 4to; unpaginated, with b/w photographs (27 in one, 23 in the other) tipped-onto black leaves with printed frames, and handwritten prices below (e.g. Fob Istanbul US \$34). Covers a bit scuffed; slight wave to text block. A fun time capsule of early 1970s Turkish leather fashions for men and (primarily) women, modelling outer wear and jackets, dresses, and pant suits.



# 9. Montviol, [Louis Julien] Le Chevalier de. Album of 9 Watercolor Drawings of Ancient Greeks and Romans, Illustrating Ancient Costume. [France], 1815.

Pen and ink and watercolor on paper, heightened with gum arabic, captioned, signed ("L.C. de Mont-viol"), and dated. 4to (drawings approx. 16 x 12 cm). Tipped to larger sheets in album bound in red wrappers, with manuscript onlaid title, "Recherches sur les Costumes Anciencs -- Grecs & Romans. Dessines et peints a l'aquarelle par Le Ch de Mont-siol - peintre." Superbly executed studies of ancient costume by an artist who specialized in miniature portraiture. Montviol was a former guard to Louis XVI who, imprisoned during the Terror, managed to escape to England, and only returned to France during the Empire. "Retire dans une petite propriete familiale a Annecy, dans le departement de la Loire, il y finit ses jours sous la Restauration, en ultivant paisiblement les belles-lettres et les arts d'agrement, surtout la peinture." (v. REVUE D'HISTOIRE DE LYON, Tome Dixieme, Annee 1911, p. 82.)



Seventeenth-century sprinkled vellum, red speckled edges. Small stain on pages 50V and 51R; a short cut in the lower margin of the last two leaves. A lovely suite of etchings by Fialetti, illustrating the habits of the various religious orders and their coats of arms, and providing a brief history of each order. A French version appeared in 1658, published by Adrien Menier (Colas 1061). After training with Giovanni Battista Cremonensi in his native Bologna, Fialetti went to work under Tintoretto in Venice; he became a favored student, and was an executor of Tintoretto's estate. Records in Venice list him as a printmaker in 1596, and as a member of the fraternity of painters between 1604 and 1612. In the course of his career, Fialetti etched over 240 plates, of which most were book illustrations or issued as series. The rendering of his figures, particularly the masculine faces, reflects the influence of the realism of the Caracci.




Small 4to (140 x 106mm). [iv], 91pp. 29 finely hand-colored engraved plates fully captioned depicting costume and peoples of the world. Period boards backed in cloth; (some light outer wear, early ownership signature in ink on top edge of front free-endpaper and title page, light, marginal finger smudges to the plates; else contents are clean; very good).

Children's book of Continental costumes printed in Leipzig at the turn of the 19th century. A rare illustrated work first published in 1796, plentiful in delicately hand-colored engravings of native peoples from around the world. This, the second part, was probably written solely by Karl Seidel, a teacher at the Tochterschule (Public Girls School) in Dessau. This "Gallery of People" was designed as a picture book for young children, not yet in their early childhood, to expand their knowledge and satisfy their curiosity about faraway lands. The first part (not included here), included nations, professions and items that were sorted in alphabetical order from Abbess, Admiral, Amazon and Armenians to Dwarf, Gypsy and Wizard. The lives portrayed are wide ranging and include simpletons, butchers, slaves, gardeners and fools. This second part organizes the peoples (usually a man, woman and native, all with appropriate props) by continents: Asians, Africans, Americans and Indians, and Europeans. The illustrations for Native American peoples are of high interest, not only for their expert work, but for the range of tribes and geography, even the Acadian peoples of Canada are represented. This type of book departs from the common ABC books as the pictures and text have a social studies meaning. Rarely found, only two copies located at the Metropolitan Museum of Art and at Princeton's Cotsen Library.



Green cloth, original illustrated wraps mounted to each board; 4to (6.25 x 9.75 inches); pp. 278, plus 68 beautifully hand-colored lithographic plates (including title-p.), collates complete. Original covers scuffed, tanned; cloth lightly chipped at spine tips and corners; previous owner's (discreet) stamp on FFEP and top margin of title-page. The text pages are just a bit foxed, but the plates are very nice indeed -- colors remain bright and true -- usually offering two scenes per plate, and showing men and women's costume, plus the occasional landscape, in Japan, Jerusalem, India, Tibet, China, the Caucasus, and more. Wonderful.

3 parts in 4 volumes, 4o (252 x 165 mm). 244 lithographic plates each with two subjects (some occasional some light staining, a few plates trimmed closely, a few short tears). Contemporary half calf, spines gilt, each with gilt-lettered black lettering pieces, marbled boards (some light rubbing). The work comprises costume plates and views including: 68 plates of Asia; 52 plates of Africa; 36 plates of North and South America; 28 plates of Australia; and 60 plates of Europe. Colas 3027; Lipperheide I, Ad 16. (4) A very nice set indeed; usually found broken up.

(6x3¾"), calf-backed cloth over boards, spines gilt. Rare edition of Ferrario's notable work on the costume of the world - OCLC lists several partial sets, but none complete as this

one. The are 4 volumes devoted to America; 3 to Africa; 7 to Asia; 2 to Asia Aggiunte; and 10 volumes in 16 to Europe. Lipperheide 51, cites a folio edition published between 1817-1834; Hiler, p.311, citing an 1827 Milan edition; Colas cites other editions. Page edges and some spines darkened from smoke, some extremity wear and a few spines dampstained; occasional foxing and dampstaining to contents, else very good. Additional shipping charges may apply.



Circular portraits with about a 3.5-inch circumference, tipped-onto heavy grey cardstock, bordered in black, mounted on blue paper. A few speckles in the background of the portrait of the woman of Tochia, otherwise lovely, suitable for display. Expertly rendered by Jakob Suter (1793-1874), an engraver, lithographer, and painter -- and an important teacher, whose pupils include Johann Burger.

Detailed, finished, professional drawings of the main and supporting characters of "The Merchant of Venice" in full costume. Gently buckled; scattered light marginal foxing (only occasionally affecting the image); paper remnants on the verso from having previously been mounted.

"The Merchant of Venice" was issued fifth, and included 29 plates.

Detailed, finished, professional paintings of the main and supporting characters of "The Taming of the Shrew" in full costume. Gently buckled; scattered light marginal foxing (only occasionally affecting the image); paper remnants on the verso from having previously been mounted.



Robert L. Bööcke was the author of "Shakespearean Costumes: Illustrations of the Whole of the Characters of Each Play, in Correct Costume, Compiled from Authentic Sources, as Given by Montfaucon, Royal Mss., Holbein, Zuccaro, Strutt, &c." published by Samuel Miller in London, 1889, and issued in 8 parts. "Taming of the Shrew" was issued third, and contained 32 plates, so this collection is very near complete.



America, c. 1940

Costume and fashion designs for women; loose sheets, on a variety of papers or board, ranging in size from about 8x10 to 15x21 inches; using chalk, crayon, watercolor, ink, and even a bit of collage. Includes dresses, hats, and gowns -- many possibly for Advance Patterns, Fashions, and Fabrics; and one ad mock-up for Dorothy Gray lipstick ("American Beauty"). Some dated, all signed by the artist. Some a little worn along the edges, but condition is VG+ or better overall, suitable for display.

Much of Teed's original artwork is now in the collection of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston. This diverse group shows glamorous fashion in a variety of illustrative styles, from spare line drawings on black paper, to gowns trimmed in paper doily, to finished and highly detailed watercolors.

#### Scrapbook of All the Best from Vintage Ladies' Magazines --Fashion and Style, Beauty, Interior Design, Celebrities, and Society Pages.

America, likely, 1920s.







Cloth-covered flexible boards (7.25x9.5 inches); pp. 100, full of handwritten text (tidy, in ink) and with numerous collage and/or tipped-on illustrations, culled from a variety of sources. Boards a bit chipped along the edges; text block brittle, with some chipping and loss of text along the very edges; rear board, with mounted (upside-down) illustration, a bit soiled. In very good condition overall, still legible, with illustrations largely unscathed.

Clearly a great fan of what would today fall into the "women's interest" section of your local newsstand, this scrapbook addresses women's fashion, furniture and interior design, entertainment (primarily theater and film), and celebrity and society gossip. Images are culled from a variety of unidentified magazines, and include fashion illustrations by [Porter] Woodruff and others, plus b/w photos of celebrities and socialites (Anna May Wong, May Allison, Richard Barthelmess). Some timely issues are discussed -- what to wear to a horse race, to a basketball game, in a basketball game (a dress!), how to wear bobbed hair -- and it also takes a look at Spain's royal family, a boat wreck, a modern kitchen, hints for Christmas shopping. A single page titled "For the Modern Woman" nicely encapsulates the diversity of this lively, if somewhat superficial, volume -- it offers descriptions and prices for slippers, satin ribbons, and a gold-striped card table. By turns light and diverting, or pensively aspirational, a nice look at some timeless cultural concerns, as well as distinctly dated trends.







21. **Sketchbook -- Original Drawings of Women's Clothing -- Fashion Illustration.** probably New York, 1943-1944. Wraps, cloth backstrip, "Public Schools of Highland Park, Composition Book, No. 60" printed on front cover; 172 x 210 mm; approx. pp. 100, lined paper, it contains 19 pencil drawings of women in dresses, most of them initialed "R.W." and dated. Some of the drawings are incomplete -- a bit ghostly -- but all are nicely accomlished, offering a collection of sophisticated fashions of the period. The models are perhaps based on film stars. Rear cover detached.

Red cloth over boards, "Spring / 1941 / A / 22" handwritten in white ink on spine; 4to (275x200mm); contains 282 original fashion designs on the recto only, each colored by hand, signed by the designer, and with typed notes. Spine chipped; boards a bit scuffed; binding shaken. Leaves a bit brittle along the edges, some with very light chipping (not affecting the image); a few leaves detached, laid in. Andre Studios was a major fashion firm in NYC in the 1930s and 40s. FIT has a large holding of Andre Studio material.




24. Blahnik, Manolo; Wintour, Anna (foreword); et al. **Manolo Blahnik Drawings.** New York: Thames & Hudson, 2003.

Heavy cardstock wraps, illustrated in full-color; unpaginated, with 134 illustrations, 125 of which are in full-color. Covers very faintly rubbed; some light soiling along bottom edge of text block (nowhere infringing upon the illustrations or text). A bright, colorful, very fun look at Manolo Blahnik's sketches -- fuel for everyone's shoe fantasies! An excellent copy.



Contemporary half black morocco and marbled boards, gilt-stamped lettering in second spine compartment (5 raised bands); 8vo (157 x 196 mm); contains illustrated title-page, TOC, and 108 numbered plates (on the verso), with facing text in English (recto of preceding leaf). Written and illustrated entirely by hand, and 40 of the plates hand-colored, this meticulous volume replicates the Gand 1835-1840 first edition of Felix de Vigne's "Vade-mecum du peintre, ou, Recueil de costumes du moyen-âge, pour servir à l'histoire de la Belgique et pays circonvoisins." Boards and spine scuffed; title-page a little loose; occasional faint browning or dusty finger-smudge. In one instance, paint has oxidized, turning one figure's flesh a spotty grey. Bookplate and signature of John Brandard on front

paste-down; and bookplate of noted antiquarian Harry Lawrence Bradfer-Lawrence on rear paste-down. Brandard has also signed the final leaf, with a calligraphic drawing of a bird, and "Finis."

John Brandard (England, 1812-1863) was a lithographic artist, and long a partner of the printers M. and N. Hanhart, for whom he produced designs for Louis-Antoine Jullien, and hundreds of illustrated title-pages for sheet music. He brought the chromolithograph, which had been first used in connection with music in 1841, to an incredibly high level of sophistication, using half a dozen or more stones to produce a single image, printed on high quality paper. He employed two full-time assistants, allowing him to produce artwork quickly and prolifically, mainly concentrating on ballet and opera. His portraits of dancers were admired by Degas. The skill with which this volume is carried out suggests that it's the work of Brandard himself -- penmanship is tidy



and legible, and the drawings and coloring capture fine details. A laid-in letter from 1889 discusses armour, as does a pencilled note laid-in at plate 54, so this volume was once carefully studied.

Also, Jesuit pilgrims and sisters of the Benedictine, Sylvestrine and Cistercian, among other lesser-known orders and historical figures such as Leopold III of Austria and Louis III of Tremoilles. Early 19th-century half calf over imitation silk cloth-covered boards and decorative endpapers, spine with label COSTUME; some light foxing most severe at beginning, otherwise the colors remaining extraordinarily fresh and bright. Armorial bookplate from the Princely house of Liechtenstein on front pastedown.

Unique compilation of 73 expertly executed hand-colored watercolors of various religious, knightly and official orders with a bookplate of the royal arms of Liechtenstein. Each figure is executed with extraordinary talent and is superbly hand-colored in a range of washes; many of these costumes have changed very little and have a history stretching back to medieval times. In the twentieth century an interest in costume and fashion books was spurred on by the dawning Victorian age in England in the 1830s, which then spread to the continent. Each picture in this unique set is an individual work of art, full of expression, and with strikingly attractive faces and gestures. The expert attention given to each work of art strongly suggests this book was a maquette for a larger print-run of a souvenir book of costumes. Captions are in German and early provenance points to possible creation in the principality of Liechtenstein. One can think of the principality's official motto "For God, Prince and Fatherland" and see how all these official garments best represent a history of European court and important religious connections for an established royal line such as Liechtenstein. Perhaps this book was once in the royal home of the Johann I Joseph, Prince of Liechtenstein, who had fourteen children, and it may have belonged to his son Prince Friedrich Adalbert (1807-1885), who later became the 1,018th Knight of the Order of the Golden Fleece in Austria. With interesting connections to the royal house of Liechtenstein and 73 examples of hand-colored historic costumes, this truly is a unique survival.
