[A True and Exact Description of the Most Celebrated East India Coasts of Malabar and Choromandel. significant loss. The engravings in this copy are particularly fine crisp dark impressions. An exceptionally good copy. Rare.

This handsome work on the northern part of Ceylon and Southern India was written by the Dutch cleric Phillipus Baldaeus. Baldaeus accompanied Ryckloff van Goens's expedition against the Portuguese possessions in South India and Northern Ceylon in 1658 as chaplain to the troops. Baldaeus's eye-witness account of this expedition against Tuticorn, Mannar, Jaffna and Negapatam is included here. After the expedition was complete, Baldaeus returned to Ceylon in the second half of 1658 serving as a missionary for the Dutch Reform Church for seven years in the area around Jaffna.



Divided into sections describing Southern India, Ceylon and the religious beliefs of the Indians it is generously illustrated with very striking engravings, maps and plans throughout. This is a particularly attractive copy as the images and maps are all good clear dark strikes. A keenly observed graphic account of the Tamil world of northern Ceylon and Southern India in the second half of the 17th century.

Shortly after this Dutch edition a German edition was published. Unfortunately, although the new preface to the German edition states that it was "carefully translated" from the Dutch this was not the case. The translation is not very accurate due chiefly to the translator's ignorance of the local words used. This is particularly significant as the English edition by Churchill was in turn based on the German edition, and, as Churchill did not refer back to the original Dutch, the errors were perpetuated. The German and Dutch editions were not reprinted in full again, however the

work proved popular in England and was reprinted three times after the first English edition of 1703 as part of Churchill's voyages. Baldaeus's writing was then neglected for a period of over 200 years and a complete edition of the Ceylonese section of this work was not published until the middle of the 20th century. A very handsome copy of the first edition of this beautifully illustrated work.

Working under the supervision of Rev. José Alque, S.J. the local draftsmen involved in this publication worked hard to produce this fine work which includes much new information. A collection of 27 official reports published in the second half of the 19th century and early 20th century on matters commercial relating to China. Packed with information these reports form a valuable picture of the commercial relationship between China and Britain at this period. Equally importantly, they also shed



light on conditions in the treaty ports concerned, and on the situation in the production areas from which exported staples of trade originated. Underlining the relevance of the genre for regional history, this long run of reports from Ningpo, professionally bound in light card, was assembled by the previous owner for use in compiling a general account of the area and its hinterland. Twelve delicate and detailed paintings on pith presented in a small glass fronted box. Four of the paintings are a little foxed but mostly only light and occasional. Four paintings have closed tears and one has the corner detached but still present. A delightful collection in original box.

These collections of pith paintings were issued to satisfy the desire of the 19th European visitor to China for a light weight attractive souvenir to take home. They were available from the 1830s to the end of the 19th century and were often issued in albums. As usual there is no indication who the artist might be. Late 19th century. **AU\$1000**

Full colour original poster advertising Pinkettes Pills. The poster features a Chinese family in a Suzhou style garden. The children are playing with containers of the pills and the father is holding one up in his

hand to show an older seated gentleman. A box at the top left of the image outlines where to purchase the pills and a box at the top right of the image asks a series of health questions. Beneath the image is a message stating the importance of rest and that the family head must take care of this. In the two boxes at the bottom of the image are a list of illnesses or impediments that the pills cure. Around the image and boxes are gold borders. Image measures approximately 85.5 x 37.5cm. Upper edge trimmed, edges chipped, three small holes lower edge and one small hole center of image, large tear upper edge with minor loss, repaired with paper and tape, 8cm closed tear towards the top of the image, repaired with sellotape, edges reinforced in a few places with paper, few minor brown spots, some wear and creasing to poster. This book is a particularly lively and informative account of the 1842 campaign in China which ended in the treaty of Nanking (Nanjing) and the opening of the first five "treaty



ports", including Shanghai. Aide de Camp to Major-General Lord Saltoun, his usefulness to that musical general was enhanced by his own skills in that line. Zieber. 1845. **AU\$450.00**

17. Davey, Neil K. Netsuke. A comprehensive study based on the M.T. Hindson Collection.

Colour and black and white plates, 564pp, dustjacket. Quarto. Very good copy. In this major work Neil K Davey surveys over 1300 representative pieces in two main sections; in the first section, the signed Netsuke are discussed, divided into different schools; in the second section the unsigned and unattributable netsuke are categorised by subject matter. Both are fully illustrated with over 1200 black and white photographs of netsuke and some 300 illustrations of the artists' actual signatures. Full details of artists, schools and subjects are given. The introduction describes the general background of netsuke and comments on materials, techniques and terminology. This important reference includes a glossary of Japanese terms, and an index of all known Netsuke artists, with facts about the type of work for which they are recognised and their names in Japanese characters, where the artist is known. Impressions of Hong Kong, Manila and Singapore

The art of Elizabeth Durack (1915–2000) CMG OBE Hon DLitt is best known for its singular rendition of the landscape, mythology and people of northern Australia.

Less well known is work that Elizabeth, my mother, produced midcareer when she travelled widely through the United States, Europe, the Middle East, Africa and Asia. 'Living and learning' were guiding principles; her interest in many subjects and cultures persistent and life-long. In the 1960s and 70s, before the phenomenal rise of international tourism and luxury package tours, she travelled to the great cities of the world and also to many out-of

-the-way places frequently using local transport. She claimed, at one stage: 'There's nothing like comfort to dull the senses ...'

The artworks offered here depict aspects of three major East Asian centres — Hong Kong, Manila and Singapore. Within the series a range of styles and moods are evident. Some paintings are developed and quite complex, others more simple and literal. Most incorporate a sense of movement, characteristic of much of her art. All have an aesthetic as well as historic appeal. In each image an essence of a city is captured. Inhabitants of these cities, and visitors too, will recognise within them a distinctive *spirit of place* despite the vast changes that have occurred in the years since the works were first created.

These are rare works by a committed and thoughtful Australian who visited her 'northern neighbours' some 40 years ago portraying cities and their peoples with empathy, detachment and wonder.

22. [Erotica]. Chinese Pillowbook Album.

Erotic album featuring 6 full page colour printed leaves with Chinese text opposite, untitled cloth covered album. Leaves a little soiled and browned, cloth a little browned with minor light wear. Pillowbooks such as this were very popular in China and were often given to sons as part of their sexual sex education on the occasion of their marriage and in turn the albums were often shared by the son with his new bride on their wedding night. Although erotic art has been popular in China for over well over 1000 years unfortunately there has been a considerable destruction of Chinese pillowbooks. This is due, in part, to Confucian influences and that of European missionaries and for these reasons they are not as commonly found as may be expected. 1936. AU\$975.00

23. Faber, Ernst. The Human Heart.

9 black and white full page illustrations, [38pp], original wrappers, small pamphlet annotated on many leaves in Romanised Chinese apparently by a 19th century owner. Neat ownership signature upper wrapper. Most uncommon. *Text in Chinese.* No publication details. **AU\$275.00**

24. Faber, Rev. Ernst. China in the Light of History.

Includes discussion on Chinese history, the Imperial Family, Chinese literature, Taoism, Confucianism, and Buddhism. Dr Faber, a Rhenish Missionary Society, missionary arrived in Hong Kong in 1865. However after a difference over the issue of conversion he left the mission in 1880. 
SUGOROKU

Japanese board games known as e-Sugoroku became very popular in the Edo period. The skills of the woodblock artists were demonstrated with the many colourful images and interesting themes. Favoured themes include behaviour and manners, travel and geography and the world of performing arts, many featuring famous actors of the day.

Large coloured handcoloured wood block map of the world. Measures 100 x 151cm. This spectacular, large coloured map by Nagakubo Sekisui (1717-1801) was based on Matteo Ricci's world map published in ten editions between 1584 - 1610. Text on the map states that the information used in making this map was learned in China in the 29th year of the Wanli Period (1591) and this map was first published in 1785. The cartographer and polymath, Nagakubo Sekisui, a Confucian scholar from Mito was active as a mapmaker from 1770 onward. He made many popular maps which were published in a number of editions. His mapping, which was considerably more accurate than his predecessors, advanced the science of cartography in Japan. Nagakubo Sekisui's maps were the first Japanese maps to use longitudinal lines, which, though inaccurate due to the lack of knowledge of astronomy, was a breakthrough in Japanese cartography and this was later improved on by Ino Tadataka. Sekisui's Sankai Yochi Zenzu was enormously popular and was published in many editions in varying sizes through to the middle of the 19th century. Japan was still largely closed to foreign influence at the time this map was published (the penalty for leaving the country or for a foreigner entering outside of the very restricted trading areas was death) and this map serves as an important and fascinating insight into the view an educated Japanese person might have held of the world beyond Japanese shores. The considerable amount of text printed along the upper section of the sheet gives information about the world's regions and the mountains, seas etc. Relief is shown pictorially. Particularly interesting is the southern section of the map which is dominated by a very large unknown territory stretching without break across the bottom of the map. Australia as we recognise it today or as represented in European maps of the period does not appear at all. There are two sections where the otherwise reasonably flat line of the unknown southern land bears a slight similarity to Cape York with a northern projection but the lack of knowledge of the region is summed up in the text "No Chinese person has been to this area so we cannot say what peoples live here". 

The Liaodong Peninsula well known for the part it played barely 10 years later in the Russo-Japanese War was firstly ceded to Japan but within days, by the means of the Triple Intervention, Russia, Germany and France had gained control of this strategic area. 




