He received little formal education and was selftaught. Since we know from his Autobiography that he "read everything he could lay his hands on in his father's library," and that it was his practice to make "copious notes" of "all things [he] read," it seems highly likely that this book must have come from his father's library. A particularly fulsome note three pages in length, written at the time of his first medical apprenticeship at age 17, is Signed and dated "T. Huxley, Leamington, Warwickshire, Sept. 14, 1842."
