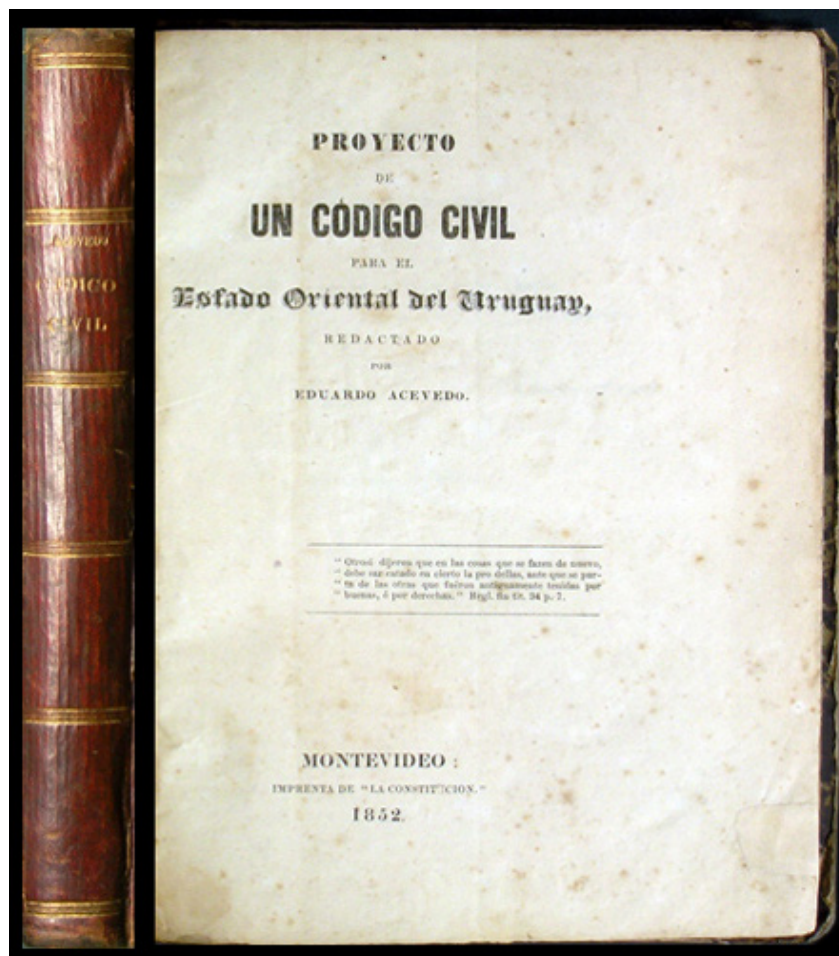

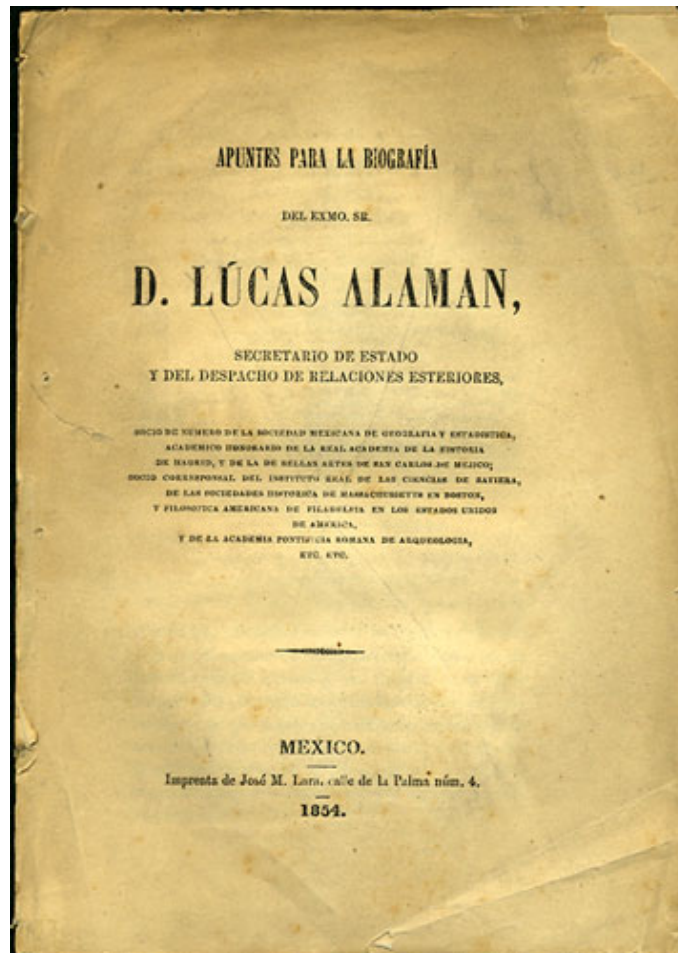

Eduardo Acevedo (1815-1863) "studied at the Department of Jurisprudence of the University of Buenos Aires and then in the Academy of Jurisprudence in the same city, receiving his doctorate in 1836. In 1839 he moved to Montevideo where he later served as a legal official, judge, and vice president of its Academy of Jurisprudence... In the mid-1850s, he returned to Buenos Aires where in 1855 he served as president of the Academy of Jurisprudence," Matthew Campbell Mirow, Latin American Law (Univ. Texas, 2004; p. 157-8). OCLC shows only 7 copies in North and South America. Boards worn, especially at edges and corners with some loss, half-title, title, and dedication leaves with minor restoration at fore edge, a few creases or chips to corners of a few leaves, occasional minor staining, mostly to rear index, but still a good or better solid copy. Andrés Bello y López (1781-1865) "is generally considered to be the most complete intellectual of 19th-century Latin America....[He joined the government in 1802 but],..., Bello wrote numerous poems...edited the first newspaper published in Venezuela and wrote the first book published in the captaincy general. ... When a provisional government was established in 1810, he was sent to London as part of a diplomatic mission headed by Bolívar. Bello remained in the British capital until 1829, serving as secretary to the Venezuelan, Chilean, and Colombian legations... [Hired by Chile] Bello was involved in nearly all aspects of life [there]. He was editor of the official government newspaper (El Araucano, 1830-1853); a senator (1837-1864); chief administrative officer of the Ministry of Foreign Relations (1829-1852); and the founder and rector of the University of Chile (1842-1865). He also helped write the Constitution of 1833 and wrote all the major presidential speeches from 1831 to 1833. His position as confidential adviser to presidents and government ministers gave him tremendous influence in Chilean politics. Bello's influence was also great in Chilean cultural and social life. His Spanish grammar is perhaps the greatest ever produced. His civil law code is still in effect in Chile, with modifications, and it was adopted by many other Latin American countries. His works on philosophy are esteemed, and his book on international law was acclaimed a classic," (EWB, 1998). 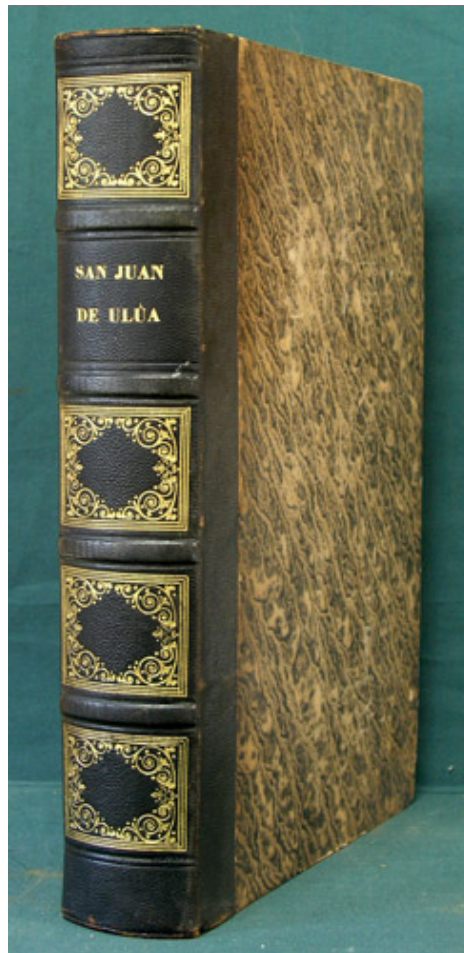

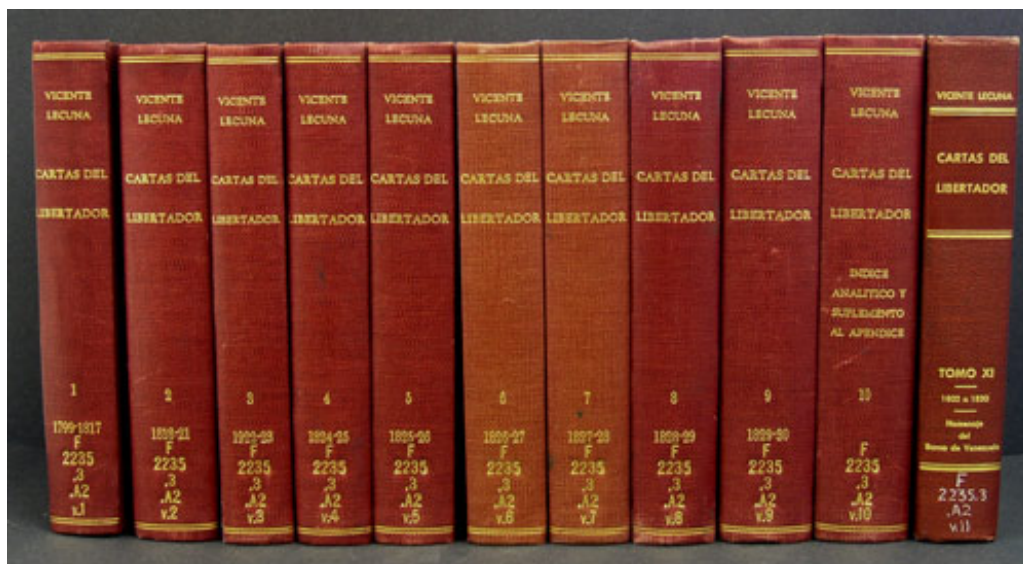

"The most exhaustive work on this episode [the Pastry War] with illustrations, mainly by Blanchard, who, assisting also as interpreter, had additional opportunity for gaining information. He accompanied Baudin's representative to Mexico and other places, and used his pen freely in observations on the scenery, the people, and their institutions, all of which served to add variety and interest to the narrative, the attractive style of which owes much to the revision of Dauzats," (Bancroft, Hist. Mexico, p. 204). Raines, discussing Maissin's report, concludes that "Admiral Baudin's favorable report of Texas doubtless hastened the recognition of the Republic by France," (Bibliography of Texas. p. 145). Printing on India paper was not common; Sabin also notes that the book was printed for 45 fr. with vignettes and 25 fr without. "After Musters was placed on half pay, in 1869-70 he carried out a long-cherished ambition to travel in southern South America. He was one of the first Europeans to document the region, living with Patagonian Indians, and traveling with one of their bands from the Strait of Magellan to the River Negro, and then crossing northern Patagonia from east to west, a journey of almost 1400 miles, half of which was unknown to Europeans. His acute powers of observation provided the first comprehensive account of the eastern foothills of the Andes, and of the lifestyle of the Tehuelche, Pampas, and Araucanian Indians" (DNB).
