

The confusion about the origin of this piece probably originated because a rector in Old St. Paul's used the quote, obtained from a 1948 edition of Ehrmann's collected poems, in a sermon, and it was erronously attributed to the church, founded in 1692. Noted by Wyatt in two lines written beneath the limitation number, as "In all good faith wrongly ascribed... Written by Max Ehrmann. First published in 1948." #281612 \$275
