This issue features "From the Basketball Diaries," a two entry prose piece from Jim Carroll that would later be incorporated into the 1978 classic The Basketball Diaries. Published when Carroll was just 17, these two entries dated Feb. 4 1965 ("We just got into town for the very spectacular National High School All Star Basketball Game.") and Feb. 5, 1965 ("After very poor breakfast Joe Slapstick calls aside Corky and I and lets us know he is giving us another change and would be starting the game anyway.") were later incorporated into the book as Winter 66 (pages 153-155). These initial installments appeared a decade before the book which has since become a cult classic and the inspiration for the 1995 film of the same name starring Leonardo DiCaprio. #364596

Dream Analysis Part V: Notes on the Seminar in Analytical Psychology Given

By Dr. C.G. Jung. Zurich: (Carl Jung) Winter 1929/30. First edition. Quarto. Multigraphed sheets bound in canvas and marbled papercovered boards. 190pp., one plate (complete). Ownership signature of Kristine Mann with a New York address, written twice on the title page, her pencil notes in the text, canvas eroded a little at the spine ends, "D.V." and date hand lettered on the spine, a sound, very good copy of this verbatim transcription from notes of Jung's Seminar. Affixed inside the front cover is the stricture: "This report is unofficial and strictly for the use of members of the Seminar, with the understanding that it is not to be circulated." A very important association copy. The Kristine Mann Library of the Analytical Psychology Club at the C.G. Jung Center of New York is named after Dr. Mann, one of the first women psychoanalysts in the States, and co-founder in 1936 of the aforementioned club in New York. Dr. Mann is widely believed to be "Miss X," the subject of Jung's "A Study in the Process of Individuation," in which he interprets a series of 24 paintings of a Miss X. According to the Jung Center website: "A strong case can be made that Kristine Mann was as great an influence on Jung's connection of alchemy and individuation as was The Secret of the Golden Flower." Mann graduated from Smith College, and then taught at Vassar, then later studied medicine and psychology at Columbia and Cornell, from which she graduated as an M.D. She had always been interested in women's health and physical fitness (she was the captain of Smith College's first basketball team) and her interest eventually led her to focus on the psychological elements of women's health. During World War I, she worked on women's health issues in industry and war plants. When the war ended, she began analysis with Dr. Beatrice Hinkle, Jung's first American disciple and translator, who was also the first woman to practice as a psychiatrist and analyst in the United States. In 1921, Mann went to Zurich to study with Jung himself. In many ways Jung's study of the paintings of Miss X is considered among his most important work. A wonderful association copy, presumably this report enjoyed very limited distribution


