Coke acquired almost his entire collection during his continental travels (1712-1718), including 600 manuscripts in Italy, many of which came from the Giuseppe Valletta library in Naples, whilst the Greek manuscripts from the Giustiniani libarry at Venice were acquired en bloc in 1721. Madden's initial reaction to them was 'superb, and valuable beyond any estimate.'

Munby, Connoisseurs and Medieval Miniatures, pp.6-8. Only the third English monograph, in English, on an illuminated manuscript. This world-famous Book of Hours was purchased by James Edwards at the Portland sale, later passing through the hands of the Marquess of Blandford, John Milner, Sir John Tobin and Boone before being acquired by the British Museum.
