According to Coy Ludwig, this book "provided an avenue of expression for Parrish's architectural interests, as well as for his growing desire to paint landscapes." Few very light scuffs to back cover, minute bumps to corners of front cover, else a very fine copy in dark green cloth with bright gilt cover medallion.
