A very fine example of Anthoine-Legrain's work, presumably on Arnould's behalf. He was the stepson of Pierre Legrain who had revolutionised modernist bookbinding in the 1920s, inheriting the Legrain studio on Pierre's death in 1929 and continuing the tradition established there.

This edition of Candide seems to be the scarcest of Bofa's illustrated books with no other copy recorded at auction since this copy appeared at Sotheby's, (25th March 1969, lot 363).
