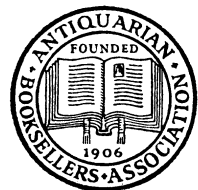

Speech of the Earl of Abingdon, on His Lordship's Motion for Postponing the Further Consideration of the Question for the Abolition of the Slave Trade: with some Stricture on the Speech of the Bishop of St. Davids, 23 pp. title a little dust soiled, small hole in last page affecting one letter, stitched as issued, London Debrett, [1793]

This speech, delivered on the 11th April, 1793, rails against the New Thinking, the Rights of Man and French Philosophers. Abingdon's sympathies were known to be with the French Revolution from his pamphlet "A Letter to Lady Loughborough" - 1798, but he is quite clear in this pamphlet that "Anarchy now rules in France."

With the succession of Pope Clement XIII to the pontificate in July 1758, there came a crisis about the ministry of the Jesuits in Europe and the Americas. His predecessor Benedict XIV an anti-Jesuit, had requested an investigation into the conduct of the Jesuits in Portugal and their colonies. This was underlined by the Bourbon Catholic claims of illegal trading and the incitements of riots in Paraguay. Clement was a weak Pope relying heavily on his pro-Jesuit secretary of state. He felt it was necessary to uphold the rights of the holy see, but the Marquis de Pombal, a powerful minister in Portugal, sequestered the Jesuits assets and had them transported to Rome. By 1764 the Society had been abolished in France by Royal decree. In 1767 the Jesuits were expelled from Spain and her colonies and later in the same year from Naples and Sicily.

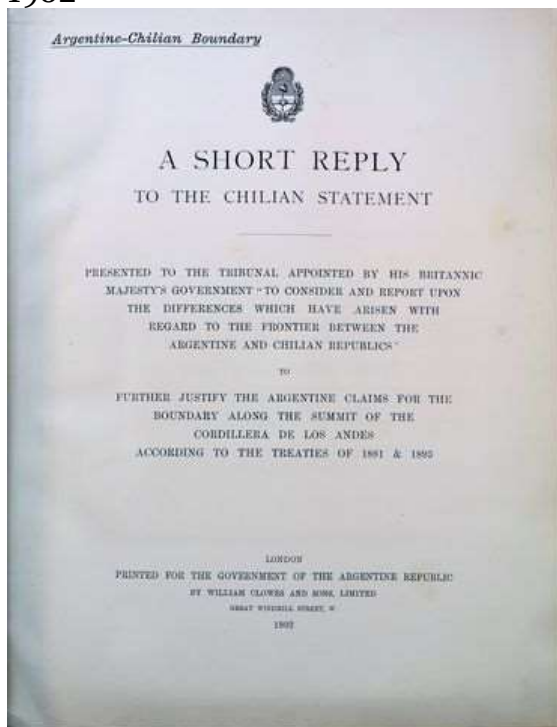

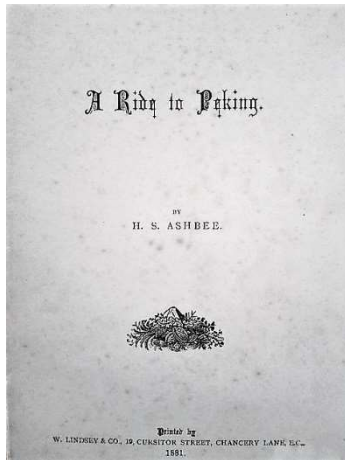

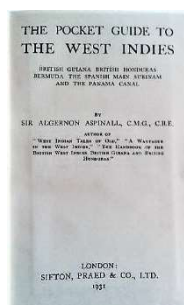

A record of two days in the saddle from Tiensin to Peking. In the company of two Americans "the colonel... the dread of all juvenile celestials", the other a doctor who "had tried his hand at almost everything without having achieved fortune or immortality". The journey was of discomfort, however the sight of the walls of Peking he describes as "very imposing, - beautiful certainly not, striking, and unlike what one encounters in Europe... It is the lofty wall of Peking, flanked at regular intervals with large square towers, which fills the approaching traveller with amazement."

Henry Spencer Ashbee, 1834–1900, whose pseudonym “*Pisanus Fraxi*” is a scatological anagram of



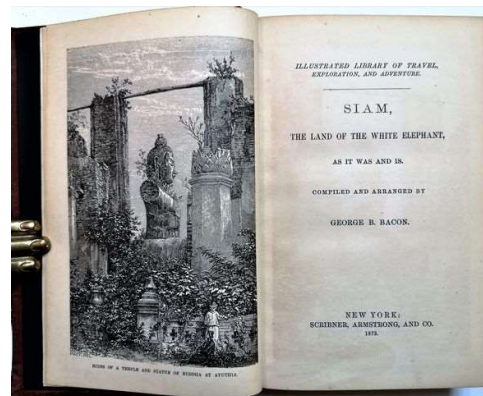
latinised Ash Bee, *Fraxinus Apis*. He was one of the great book collectors of the nineteenth century, particularly in the fields of *Erotica* and *Don Quixote*. His bibliophile salons in the Albany were legendary, included Sir Richard Burton, John Camden Hotten, and Richard Monkton Milne. David Chabers his biographer considers that he “was proud to be English, and of the empire, thought little of those outside Europe apart from the Japanese. By religion a lapsed protestant, he had a particular disregard for the Church of Rome and its priests.” This little snippet is not prefaced or followed up with any detail of his greater journey round the world in 1881-2.

The title, echoing Stanley's In Darkest Africa published in the same year, set



the foundation for the Army's modern social welfare approach. It compared what was considered "civilised" England with "Darkest Africa" – a land considered poor and backward. What Booth suggested was that much of London and greater England after the Industrial Revolution was not better off in the quality of life than those in the underdeveloped world.

The Christian movement with a quasi-military structure and government founded in 1865 has spread from London, England, to many parts of the world and is known for being one of the largest distributors of humanitarian aid.

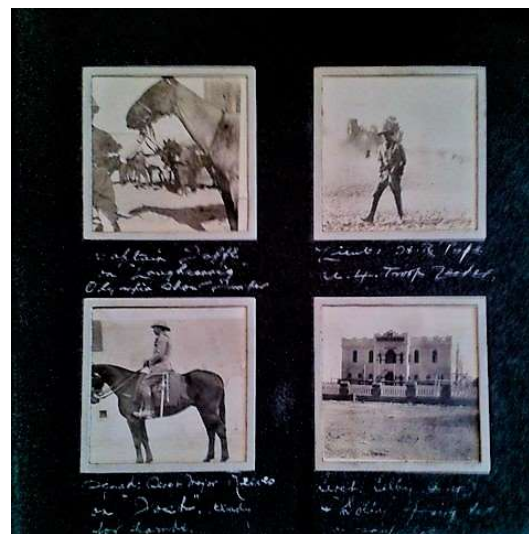

Abassia, a suburb of Cairo, is the seat of the Coptic Church, and a Training School during the First World War for Military Police.

The Westminster Dragoons were formed during the Boer War. Although they did not fight during that Emergency, they trained and sent out over 1000 men to the Imperial Yeomanry in South Africa. The

Regiment numbered amongst its ranks some very wealthy and influential men (including a maharajah) and it was this fact that enabled the Regiment to buy, build and equip the magnificent Headquarters at Elverton Street, Westminster. There was little going on in the run up to the First World War, They left Southampton on the "S.S. Aragon" for Alexandria in 1914 to relieve the 3rd Dragoon Guards in Cairo as garrison cavalry. This album pre-dates the arrival of the main force, but represents the forerunners to the occupation out there.

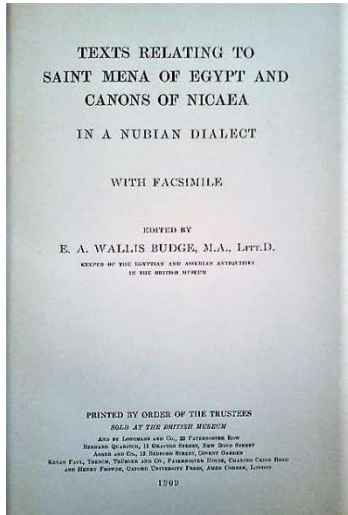

Egyptian and Assyrian Antiquities, making it the best in the World. Although from a poor background, through his own dilligence and with the influence of Sir John Stainer and



William Gladstone, he received a First Class Education in his subjects. Having joined the British Museum he was sent on Antiquities Retrieving projects. His Nile Notes for Travellers, was commissioned by Thomas Cook for the growing market in Tourism to Egypt and the Antiquities.

Manichaeism thrived between the third and seventh centuries, and at its height was one of the most widespread religions in the world. Manichaeian churches and scriptures existed as far east as China and as far west as the Roman Empire.It was widespread among the legions of the Roman Empire, who considered it a soldier's religion, and it was briefly the main rival to Christianity in the competition to replace classical paganism. Manichaeism survived longer in the East than in the West, and it appears to have finally faded away after the 14th century in southern China, contemporary to the decline in China of the Church of the East.

Émile Littré (1801-1881) Philosopher and Lexicographer, commenced his major work in 1844 and took 30 years for its completion. Working on Le National under its editor Armand Carrel, later becoming its Director, he came across the works of Auguste Comte and sought to popularise his positivist philosophy.

The Dictionnaire, finished in 1873, was written on 415,636 sheets, bundled in packets of a thousand, and stored in wooden crates filling the cellar of Littré's home in Mesnil-leRoi.

Prince Leopold, the Duke of Albany (1853-1884) was Queen Victoria and Prince Albert's fourth son and eighth child. He suffered from Haemophilia inherited through his mother. In 1872 he became a student at Christ Church at the University of Oxford. He was acquainted with Alice Liddell, whose father was the Dean, Vice Chancellor of the University and had been Domestic Chaplain to Prince Albert. He became godfather to her second son Leopold. There was a suggestion of marriage, but he is said to have preferred Alice's sister Edith. However, Queen Victoria decided that reigning monarchs children should marry only reigning monarchs children, and he married Princess Helene of Waldeck-Pyrmont. It was during his time at the University he acquired these fine volumes.

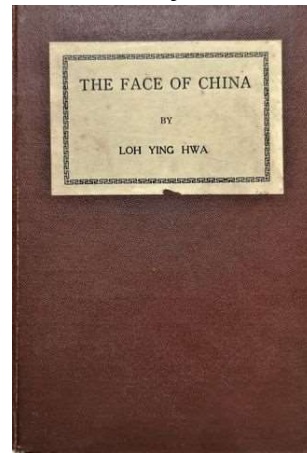

The Battle of Steenkerque, part of the Nine Years War, was fought on August 3, 1692. The Allies, English, Scottish, Dutch and German forces under Prince William of Orange, William III of Great Britain, against the French under the duc de Luxembourg. The allies lost 8,000 men out of 15,000, and an equal number were lost to the French out of a much larger contingent. It was considered to be the hardest battle ever fought by infantry in that war. Five British Regiments were completely destroyed.

The famous "Steinkerck Cravat" was named after the Battle. It was a lace cravat loosely worn with long ends. According to Voltaire it was in fashion after the Battle where the French gentlemen had to fight with cravats "déranger" on account of being surprised by the Allies.

This novel was the best selling book of the nineteenth century, with only the Bible outselling it. Not even Dickens, with the death of little Nell, could outshine Stowe's death of little Eva. After its' initial success, the American Civil War and the abolition of Slavery. the novel's reputation soared.

Cassell visited America in 1853 to attend the "World Temperance Convention" in New York, and again in 1854 and 1859 on publishing business. He met the author Harriet Beecher Stowe and arranged for the publication of an illustrated edition of "Uncle Tom's Cabin" in Britain - to great success. Cassell strongly supported the cause of the slavery abolitionists. However strong the text is emotionally, and against the Slavery in the Southern State, the illustrations conform to the comic stereotype of Currier and Ives black humour. President Lincoln, it is claimed, blamed the Civil War on this work.

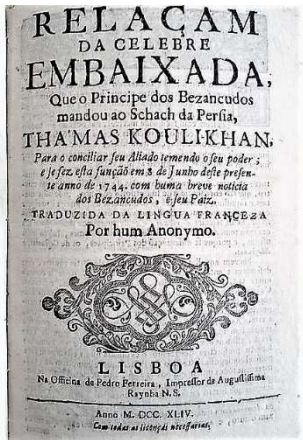
Rose Troup was Transport officer on Stanley's Emin Pasha Relief Expedition. This was the magnificent end to Stanley's Exploration Career. Sir William Garstin, writing the the Journal of the R.G.S. said of the expedition "The main facts regarding the Sources of the Nile were finally revealed by him, and nothing was left for future explorer's but to fill in details".

The Rear Column had been beset with difficulties waiting for the return of Stanley's Advance Column. With the death of Major Bartelot and Jameson, and various desertions, Rose Troup decided to go back to England. Stanley's public criticism of his rear column spurred Troup into print to give his version of events. Because of the contract he signed at the start of the expedition, Stanley took out injunction to suppress the book. Troup counter sued, alleging breach of contract, "he never supplied me with the tent, bed, Winchester rifle canteen, and a due share of European provisions. Mr Stanley's failure to fulfil his contract appeared to me to nullify it,". The case was settled out of court and Troup, after an agreed delay, published his book.

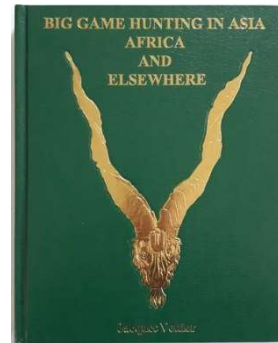

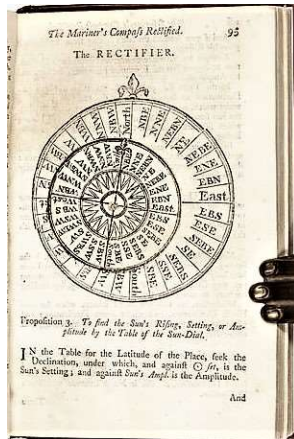

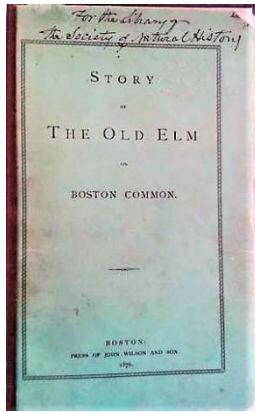

The story, set in 1894, concerns a supposed anthropologist, Charles Kilpont arriving in Leopoldville, with curiosity about Cannibal Feasts. There is a description of Leopoldville "It was at this time a small isolated Belgian settlement, surrounded by great sweeping wastes of land & forests, and was in the heart of the worst cannibal country in Africa." Inevitably a virginal "ward" arrives equipped with maid and old nurse, and later a young geologist, setting the romantic scene. The missing chapters concern the actual feast. They are listed at the beginning and bear shock-horror titles such as "The larder of the Bangalas", "Two men at meat", "White meat". One can infer quite easily the gist of those pages, as we have already mysteriously "lost" the young lady's maid in chapter nine. The rest of the novel is pursuit, rescue, retribution, and "happily ever after".

The style of the novel oozes Edwardian Melodrama "And once, mark you, a man, be he French, Belgian, or English, has tasted human flesh, he can never satisfy his stomach with any other sort of food. He will eat other things to keep himself alive. But the awful craving, the horrible hungering for human flesh, will steadily grow upon him; until at last he finds a way of satisfying his unnatural lust." There is even an early "Poirot" figure in the Belgian Governor, Major Everard, "He was a short, rather stout little man, rejoicing in the possession of a round good

natured face, which ill suited the long light-coloured & finely curled moustache which he wore with such evident pride & satisfaction."

Whalley spent time in Africa after having served with Lord Robert's bodyguards during the Boer War when he was awarded the Kimberley Star. He later returned to England to serve as a Lieutenant in the First World War and was awarded the Military Cross. In the Russian Campaign he was awarded the order of St. Stanislaus. He wrote a volume of South African stories published as "Tales from Muizenberg" in 1905.
