This year marks the twenty-fifth anniversary of Seamus Heaney being awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature for 'works of lyrical beauty and ethical depth, which exalt everyday miracles and the living past'.

Born in Casteldawson, County Derry in North Ireland, Heaney studied at Queen's, Belfast where he became a lecturer at the close of the 1960s. It was during this period that he made his debut as a poet, but continued to divide his time between academia and his writing, whilst working at Harvard, Oxford and Carysfort College in Dublin.

'Heaney's poetry is often down-to-earth. For him, poetry was like the earth - something that must be plowed and turned. Often he paints the gray and damp Irish landscape; peat moss has a special place in his poetry. The poems often are connected with daily experiences, but they also derive motifs from history, all the way back to prehistoric times. Seamus Heaney's profound interest in the Celtic and the pre-Christian as well as in Catholic literary tradition has found expression in a number of essays and translations' (Seamus Heaney – Facts. NobelPrize.org. Nobel Media AB 2020. Thu. 4 Jun 2020).

Ed and Mary Conley Downe, a New York couple, were instrumental in the success of the Irish Clifden Arts Festival, now the longest running community arts festival in Ireland. Heaney referred to the festival as 'this nest of the arts', and the New York couple became close friends of the poet for the last twenty-five years of his life. During this time they built the comprehensive collection of items listed here, almost all inscribed or signed by Heaney, and including a great many of the rarest Heaney items, ranging from 1963 to 2016.




Signed by Heaney at his contribution. This first of these two poems became, of course Death of a Naturalist. It precedes the eponymous book by a year. Rare signed.

With the author's signed presentation inscription to the title page, "for Mary - between my finger and my thumb / The squat pen rests - Seamus Heaney". The quotation is from Digging, the opening poem of this collection. Death of a Naturalist is Heaney's first regularly published book, preceded only by the slim pamphlet Eleven Poems. Important obviously for Heaney's own career but also marking a key moment in the history of modern Irish poetry, being the first book of its type taken up by Faber. It went on to win the Geoffrey Faber Memorial Prize.

With the author's signed presentation inscription to the front wrapper, "for Mary Seamus Heaney". The author's first book. Ok time to call a spade a spade. There are three apparent "issues" of Heaney's first publication, the first two are in white self wrappers, with the Festival Publications' roundel in light purple then, subsequently, dark purple. The third manifestation was issued (as here) in green wrappers with printing details on the lower wrapper in two distinct states. These are NOT issues; they are distinct printings. No less appealing and bibliographically important for that, but the persistent notion that the later issues are somehow part of the original printing is false. The present example has the printer's information stamped on the lower wrapper, is in exemplary condition, and has a particularly friendly, simple presentation inscription. Rare thus.







From a total edition of just 150 copies this is one of the first 50 numbered and signed by the author. Prints the single eponymous poem which represent a major point in Heaney's career. The poem is rightly celebrated as one of the early masterpieces, this is the rarest form of its publication.

An anthology produced to raise money for the Poets Trust, Twelve writers were asked to contribute a specially written work never before published. Each of the hundred were signed by all twelve authors who were, Ted Hughes, Stevie Smith, George MacBeth, Peter Redgrove, Adrian Henri, Lee Harwood, Tom Pickard, Michael Hamburger, Edward Lucie-Smith, Jon Silkin, William Plomer and Heaney.



One of just 25 copies specially bound, with a hand-written colophon each signed by Heaney. A typed letter from the firm Bertram Rota loosely inserted explains that this issue was produced by Brian Dickson from sheets of the first edition which, "were discovered in the Faber & Faber warehouse in 1981. Most of the copies were given to Mr Heaney and friends of the binder though some were sold direct to collectors. This copy is one of the very few (approximately 4) offered to the trade:" Just to complete a piece of the bibliography on this issue, we can see from the present copy that the sheets in question were from the simultaneously issued, wrappered state of the first edition (Brandes and Durken A12b) - the rubric on the verso of the title page differs between the two states. One the great and most desirable rarities in the canon, this cataloguer has just seen one other copy offered for sale in the past 25 years.







This book was issued in three apparent formats 25 lesser copies bound in paper; then two states according to the publisher, one bound in 'black textured goat skin' (70 copies) the other in 'black textured morocco' (30 copies). The problem being morocco IS goat skin.

Now the present copy is without question bound in morocco and is number 120 of the 125. What is certain is that this is a fine copy of a vulnerable book.


