




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

Major architects featured include Kay Fisker, Gropius, Ernst May, Oud, Poelzig, Roux-Spitz and Bruno Taut, while there is also good coverage of other German architects including Paul Mebes (Berlin) and Karl Schneider (Hamburg). 
Leopold Bauer (1872-1938) was a pupil of Carl Hasenauer and of Otto Wagner at the Academy of Fine Arts in Vienna. He was both an architect and an arts and crafts designer, as well as a writer on these subjects. He took a mediating position between Historicism and Secession, thereby meeting the taste of most of his contemporaries. In his early villa buildings, he followed the example of Joseph Maria Olbrich; showing discernment in his treatment of ornamentation and color, his interior designs were distinctly appealing. 

The first book published by the Bauhaus, preceding the Bauhausbücher proper of 1925 and after; Bayer's brilliant front cover design is fittingly proclaimatory. Typography by L. Moholy-Nagy; binding design by Bayer. Texts by Gropius ("Idee und Aufbau des Staatlichen Bauhauses"), Klee, Kandinsky, Moholy-Nagy, Schlemmer and Grunow. The work was issued on the occasion of the great Weimar Bauhaus exhibition of 1923. One of 2000 German-language copies, from the edition of 2600 in all. The delicate spine is hardly visible professionally restored.

First edition. Mario Dal Fabbro (1913 – 1990) studied both at the R. Superior Institute for Decorative and Industrial Arts at Venice, and the R. Magistero Artistico. He graduated with high honors in 1937. Before his advanced education, Dal Fabbro worked in his family's furniture design shop. Always able to combine the theoretical with the practical aspects of construction, Dal Fabbro's early experience helps account for his later success in the technical and creative fields of furniture design. Between 1938 and 1948 — before immigrating to America — Dal Fabbro created designs for private individuals and various furniture houses in Milan. In 1948 he immigrated to America and a year later published Modern Furniture: Its Design and Construction , which achieved international recognition. Following this success, Dal Fabbro began designing furniture for mass production. Jacket very lightly edgeworn with small chips.






A fine long run of the leading periodical of the thirties on functional architecture and related subjects, published 1932-1943.

In 1932, the groups „De Acht“ from Amsterdam and „Opbouw“ from Rotterdam founded the magazine „De 8 en Opbouw“. For the first time in Holland a magazine went beyond the mere manifesto to become a means of circulating information. The periodical aimed at a well-grounded analysis of architecture ranging from the definition of the variables connected with the housing issue to a review of new building techniques as tools for an aesthetic dematerialization of buildings.

In 1932 Paul Schuitema, who was a member of the architect-group "De Opbouw" created a basic design for the magazine. Other designers could then fill in the rest of the cover. Including full cover designs by Paul Schuitema and a special issue on photography with pictures by Schuitema and Piet Zwart. Due to the war, year 12 and 13 consist of only 12 issues and after the first issue of 1943, the magazine stopped publishing. Beautiful single issues, only a few issues a bit dusty or very little damaged.



Fine and representative works on German Baroque architecture. The splendid plates in co-operation with artists such as G. C. Bodenehr, J. J. und P. H. Kleinschmidt, J. U. Krauss, J. B. Probst et al, showing inside and outside views of castles and palaces etc. „The most valuable feature of his book is that Decker not merely supplies elevations, sections and ground plans of his intended buildings, but also illustrates in exact detail every wall and ceiling of each of the principal state rooms as they would have been decorated and painted in the completed palace. He also provides handsome perspective illustrations of the formal gardens that would be appropriate for the palace concerned, with accompanying designs for orangeries, pavilions, grottes, fountains and other structures.“ Hugh Pagan, Catalogue 41, # 31.

Wilhelm Deffke (1887-1950], whom in 1925 Bruno Taut had appointed director of the Magdeburg exhibition "Der Zucker" was in the same year also named director of the Magdeburg Handwerker- und Kunstgewerbeschule (whose students then included Walter Dexel and Johannes Molzahn, among others). Following this, Deffke was given complete responsibility for all aspects of the design of the Magdeburg Theatre Exhibition—architecture, exhibition design, poster, catalogue and so forth—for which this publication was printed. Deffke's brilliant conception, with its powerful red and black graphic abstractions, perhaps inevitably calls to mind Frederick Kiesler's 1924 program for the Internationale Ausstellung neuer Theatertechnik, in Wien, though quite different in its immediacy. Particularly striking are his extraordinary advertising designs at the end.


"The first and only issue of the aforementioned trade magazine *Maske*, which he designed in form of foldout over two meters long and had produced by Wohlfeld, already had a 'bibliophile rarity value' just a short time after it was published. When the Werkbund was planning its exhibition 'Die Wohnung' in Stuttgart in 1927, it was Döcker who was the spokesman for a group of young architects and artists who were eager to make sure that the orientation of the exhibition would be towards the 'New Building' philosophy. The plan that was finally accepted for the Weißenhof housing development was designed by Mies van der Rohe, but Döcker himself was in charge of the building works, and it was he who designed and built numbers 21 and 22 of the houses (which were later destroyed in the war). As a result of his assignment, and, even more, the Waiblingen Hospital, designed on his terrace principle, Döcker became internationally famous. 

In addition to being a critic, the Romanian architect Badovici was also Gray's companion, and her collaborator at this time on their famous house in the south of France, called E.1027 (a coded combination of their initials)." 



Contents loose, as issued. A handsome portfolio of custom mural designs for gracious modern living, in German art déco taste. The designs combine warm-toned geometrical arrangements with clusters of floral motifs and other elements. All could be commissioned from Grohmann's studio, with prices by the foot. The publication was sponsored by the paint and lacquer manufacturer with whom he collaborated. This portfolio is a continuation of the series „Einfache Raumgestaltung“. Portfolio spine frayed, dusty, and darkened. Four plates somewhat foxing, inside but mostly clean series.







Kawakita Renshichiro (1902-1975) was an architect and interior designer and a key figure during the early phase of modernism in Japan. In 1932 he founded the Institute of New Architecture and Industrial Arts with the aim of bringing the ideas of the Bauhaus school to Japan. The present monthly magazine (also launched in 1932) showcases aspects of modern commercial architecture (shops, restaurants, theatres, cinemas, libraries, schools, factories) as well as interior design (showcases, shelving, chairs etc.) from the West and their application in Japan. Most of the articles are by Kawakita himself but there are also translations from Western sources. 'I see all' was strongly influenced by the Russian and German avant-garde and later issues discuss the influence of technology on contemporary art (Hans Arp) and photography (montage). References are made to new publications and magazines for specific countries (Germany: Die Form; Moderne Bauformen, Die Neue Linie; Soviet Union: USSR in Construction, Cobetckay Apxntektypa) showing the keen awareness in Japan of modernist trends abroad.

New Frankfurt was an affordable public housing program started in 1925 and completed in 1930. It was also the name of the accompanying magazine that was published from 1926 to 1931 dedicated to international tendencies in architecture, the renewal of art, housing and education. Fifty-two issues in five volumes were published in all. In some ways, it came close to being an "architectural manual", although it also gave wide play to other themes like the new means of communication, education, and advertising. Ernst May, head of the Technical Office of City Hall, introduced the first issue in this way: "Das neue Frankfurt's endeavour will encompass all of the sectors of activity that in our opinion are significant in terms of definition of culture in the metropolis".



Neues Bauen in der Welt, volume 2. One of the most important immigrants from Europe was Richard J. Neutra (1892-1970), who became an American citizen in 1932. A native of Vienna, like his schoolfriend and sometime partner Rudolph Schindler, Neutra settled in California and helped to secure the acceptance of European functionalism in the 1920s. He was already familiar with Frank Lloyd Wright's work before he left for America in 1923, where he first worked in the studio of Holabird & Roche in Chicago. He visited Louis Sullivan before his death and was present at Sullivan's funeral in 1924, where he met Wright for the first time, a man who was to exert a considerable influence on him. Neutra's earliest books were devoted to describing his American experiences for the benefit of European readers. "Wie baut Amerika?" (1927), for example, gives an account of the construction of the Palmer House in Chicago, in which he had himself been involved during his time with Holabird & Roche, while his second book, "Amerika. Die Stilbildung des neuen Bauens in den Vereinigten Staaten" (1930), was written during the time when, in cooperation with Schindler, he was building the Lovell House in Los Angeles, the project which made him famous overnight. In this book he promoted Schindler's work and the Californian architecture of Irving Gill, which was almost unknown in Europe at the time. These works of Neutra's made a great impact on Europe – even on Japan – and did more to promote an understanding of American architecture than, for example, Erich Mendelsohn's "Amerika: Bilderbuch eines Architekten" (1926). 

Jean-Baptiste Rondelet (1734-1829), a pupil of Jacques-François Blondel and Boullée, travelled through Italy in 1783-84. His five-volume „Traité théorique et pratique de l'art de bâtir“ was a practical pedant to Durand's „Précis des leçons“. He summarised his architectural aesthetic in the preface to the first volume, many of his ideas expressed being those of Blondel and Durand. The main source of Rondelet's importance is the comprehensive theory of materials and building construction given in the second, third and fourth volumes of his work. He was one of the first to undertake systematic analysis of the use of iron and the statics of iron structures, to which he was first drawn while working under Soufflot at the Panthéon in Paris. 



A complete set of the Berlin edition of Frühlicht. Issue 1-14 (1920) contain a section called Frühlicht, written by Bruno Taut, which became a separate periodical with the same title in fall 1921. (Magdeburg, Peters Verlag 1921-22, nos. 1-4, all published). In 1919 a group of radical utopian architects, on the initiative of Bruno Taut, began a network of correspondence through which they expressed their views on the architecture of the future. In July 1920 the editors (Bruno Möhring and Cornelius Gurlitt) of the more conservative 'Stadtbaukunst' could, in Taut's words, "no longer stand the light" and their uncomfortable association come to an abrupt end. After Bruno Taut was appointed city planner and architectural adviser to Magdeburg in 1921 he revived 'Frühlicht' as separate magazine. The Magdeburg edition is more widely known, it is the much scarcer Berlin 'Frühlicht' that best captures the mood and spirit of this group. Small section of the spine professionally restored. In his Kahn Lectures Wright gave a summary of the ideas behind his prairie houses, setting out in a nine-point programme the principles of the unbroken transition from interior to exterior, the open plan and what he called 'the destruction of the box'. (Kruft). The present binding by Wright is a particularly pleasing and successful design. The text is also important: "One of Wright's last reasonably jargon-free publications. "The entire issue of the January 1938 'Architectural Forum' is a masterpiece in terms of its totally unified design, which combines the skills of the photographer, the writer, and the graphic designer. The design is a statement of Wright's ideas about architecture in the graphic medium. The bold, simple rectilinear designs characteristic of Wright's furniture are reflected here in the straight lines and right angles that compose the cover. Wright's idea of continuity is expressed in the continuation of the design from the cover to the inside pages and then its repetition at the end. The lettering used on the cover was developed in the 1920s and was also used in 'An Autobiography' six years earlier. Five variations of the typeface of the cover were used inside the magazine. Wright's now familiar signature – the red square from the early Oak Park days – appears boldly as the center of the cover's design. Appropriately, the issue was dedicated 'to my beloved master Louis Henry Sullivan and grand old chief Dankmar Adler.' D. Hanks, The decorative designs of FLW, pp. 182-183 and color plate 21."
