Florida East Coast Railway. St. Augustine, FL. 10-1910.

Booklet, black and white photo illustrations, color maps on inside covers, 127pp, 7 1/4 x 4 inches, color pictorial paper wrappers. Light soiling to covers, very good condition.

An early and uncommon guide book listing the many attractive Florida destinations, their highlights and in many cases information on hotels and other lodging with prices. At the back of the booklet is a four page listing of Hotels and Boarding Houses with daily and weekly rates. The color maps on the inside front covers are

both titled "Florida East Coast Railway and Connections," one showing the eastern US, Cuba and the Bahamas, the other showing connections within Florida. The back cover illustration, entitled "East Coast of Florida is Paradise Regained," features an idyllic (?) view of a car being driven along a beach surrounded by palm trees, a resort in the distance; above this is a map of Florida and adjacent islands. 

The hotel is shown at 220 23rd Street, close to Collins Avenue and the ocean. Map is undated, but the costumes, particularly golf and bathing outfits, suggest the late 1930s. Reference is also made to Pan American Airport, which closed in 1945. Map is signed by cartographer F. L. Morgan

Miami Post Card Co. / Approved Atlas & Maps Ltd. Miami, Florida. **1949**. Folded map, 8 ½ x 3 ½ inches, unfolding to sheet size 34 x 21 ½ inches. One side features a nearly full-page map of Miami with two modestly sized inset maps: West Miami and City of Coral Gables. Beneath this map assemblage is a narrow map 3 x 21 1/2 inches featuring "The Keys and Overseas Highway." Verso of map features a Street Map of Miami Beach, a map of North Miami, and a Street Index. Map in good condition; two very short repaired tears at folds.

The Miami map features some site-specific notation, no doubt paid for by commercial interests. These include Pan Am location, two Jai Alai locations, and a large plot on the Bay east of Brickell Avenue identified as "Miss Harris' Florida School." Several Golf Courses and a Country Club are duly noted. An uncommon

Color bird's eye view pictorial map, approximately 15 x 26 inches on sheet 20 x 32 inches folding to 10 x 4 inches, map is bordered by hotel listings, multiple fold as issued. Inset map of Distances to Miami. Verso is accommodation listings and two column listing of what to see. Light toning along the edges and centrefold (mostly noticeable in

the text areas; short separations at fold intersections, short split at lower fold edges (in the margin only). Overall very good condition.

This is a detailed bird's eye view map of Miami Beach and Miami viewed from the east with major roads marked and small pictographs for noteworthy buildings. Places marked include the Harvey Firestone Estate, McClellan Ocean Villa, several hotels along the ocean front and the Venetian Islands. Around the map is an extensive list of hotels, War Time Accommodations in Greater Miami": "There are hotel and apartment accommodations available here for civilian occupancy this spring and summer. Despite the fact that the army and navy are training thousands of men in Greater Miami every day of the year, you can find attractive accommodations here at reasonable prices." On the verso, there is a listing of "What to See, Places to Go and Things to Do in Miami." A most interesting document of War-time Miami. [Stock #39069] US\$350.00

An uncommon map showing the modest extent of the city of Orlando in the mid 1930s from Par Avenue in the north to Grant Avenue in the south. Some 35 lakes are named, and a street directory surrounds the map which is marked copyright 1935 by Tyn Cobb's Florida Press, Inc. at lower left. The verso of the broadside sheet provides "Facts About Orlando, Florida 'The City Beautiful." [Stock #54668] US\$235.00

Damp stain to lower margins of all maps; scarcely noticeable except for sheet 1 where it is visible mostly at the lower areas of the left and right edges. Tab attached to each map as issued.

Five plat maps from G.M. Hopkins "Plat Book of Greater Miami Florida and Suburbs," maps numbered 1 through 5 showing the central



business and civic area of Miami. Some maps feature paste-on revisions/up-dates regarding land use. Sheets 1, 2, 3 are scaled 100 feet to 1 inch. Sheets 4 and 5 are scaled 150 feet to one inch. From South to North the alignment is as follows: sheets 4, 1, 2, 5. From West to East the alignment is as follows: sheets 3 and 1. The southern-most border (see sheet 4) is Southwest 11th which extends west to Southwest 4th and east to Biscayne Bay. The northern-most border (see sheet 5) is Northwest 18th which extends west to Northwest 3rd and east to Biscayne Bay. From West to East (see sheets 3 and 1) the western-most border is Southwest 7th; the southern-most border is Southwest 3rd on map 3 and Southeast 2nd and the Florida East Coast Railway (Royal Palm Hotel Spur) on map 1. The northern-most border is Northwest 3rd on map 3 and Northeast 4th on map 1. These maps are a fascinating look into Miami's past. Most

noticeably in map 1, but to some extent with all these maps of the central area of Miami, businesses and civic buildings are extensively marked and Map 1 represents a vital city centre so different from the current time. Amendments have been glued over sections eg. a Walgreen's has been added at the corner of SE Second Avenue and E. Flagler; two new buildings have been added to an empty block between SE First and Second at Biscayne Boulevard. [Stock #46693] US\$850.00

Brochure, 9 x 7 ¾ inches, 10 pp., folded in half, very likely for mailing. Color illustrations on front and back covers; black and white photo illustrations on interior. Spine split and held together in two places with tape, wear to right edge, but still overall good to very good condition.

Various topics of interest to those considering moving to Palm Beach County: transportation, agriculture, water supply, community life, employment opportunity, etc. Additional pages focus on other communities in the county, including Boca Raton, Lake Worth, Jupiter, as well as Greater Palm Beach. Verso of rear cover features a map in color, showing the eastern communities on the Atlantic

Ocean, from Jupiter in the north to Boca Raton in the south. Several canals extend from Lake Okeechobee in a south easterly direction. An uncommon publication; only one WorldCat listing was found. The rear cover features a stately southern residence with, in the circular drive, a chauffeur-driven vehicle holding two passengers. In the distance is a pasture populated with various cows. The challenged artist has drawn the cows totally out of scale; they appear to be the size of dinosaurs when compared to the sporty automobile in the foreground. A fascinating look at Florida in the middle of the 19th century, with much surveying completed (including along the full length of the east coast), but with the full expanse of the lower interior of the peninsula unsurveyed. A rare and decorative Florida map of Key West, a community of central importance to American military and cultural history, by Ohio artist and illustrator Arthur B. Suchy (1901-1995). This is the "Collectors' Edition, limited to one hundred, hand-colored" copies. This print comes from the artist's estate and has



been recently handcolored after a signed master copy watercolored by Suchy. As well as being a stunning image, there is much of historical interest with hotels and other lodging marked A to L and 67 places of interest marked and named in the legend surrounding the map. Places marked include the Mercedes Hospital, the Porter Dock Co, the Parker Plantation, the Cigar Factories, and the Key West Country Club. Plant and wildlife (including brown Pelicans) are featured. A small inset map at lower right shows the route of the proposed Eastern link to the Pan American Highway and states "THE FUTURE: Key West is the connecting link in the short route to South America. This Eastern branch of the Pan-American Highway is now being projected." At top right the direction to, and distance from, Miami (170 miles by auto, 120 miles via air) is indicated with text stating "auto route soon to be shortened to about 162 miles." 

In 1932 the Lindgren Brothers of Spokane, Washington began manufacturing colorful silk-screened maps depicting iconic national parks and other scenic areas. With emphasis on both verbal and visual humor, they titled these inexpensive tourist souvenirs "Hysterical Maps," seeking to distinguish them from "historical" pictorial maps, a genre then in vogue. Aimed at the middle-class American tourist, they were available for purchase at gas stations and other stops along the vacation route. No holdings listed on OCLC/WorldCat. [Stock #54688]

Wonderful panoramic bird's eye view map embellished with a decorative border. North is at the left edge: the map extends from Donner Pass Summit at lower left corner to Blue

Mountain at lower right, from Reno beneath the cartouche at upper left to Walker Lake at upper right. "Painted by Gerald A. Eddy Glendale Calif." As well as topographical features such as mountains and lakes, many ski areas etc are named, such as Squaw Valley Ski Area, Tahoe City Ski Hill, Bijou Ski Hill Golf Course. This vintage pamphlet features a bird's eye view map of Los Angeles County with Long Beach centrally located at the lower edge and another map of the City of Long Beach California, each designed by Mary Hall Atwood and bordered with numerous vignette illustrations of points of interest. The verso contains

good condition.

The full sheet map is a schematic bird's eye view style map of the Greater Los Angeles area with Olympic venues marked eg. bicycle start and finish, rowing course, Olympic village. The attractive border shows routes to Los Angeles from the north, south and east with pictographs of the sights along the routes. The smaller pictorial map titled "The Olympic City 1932" shows vignette map illustrations of various Olympic venues; on the other half sheet is information on Olympic Games history, and a schedule of the games. A decorative, fascinating piece of Southern California history, this 1954 map celebrates Los Angeles' developing freeway system, color coded to show "completed or under construction" "budgeted" and "future construction." Compiled from an impeccable source ("Basic cartographic data supplied by State of California, Department of Public Works, Division of Highways, District VII. 4-1-54.") the map is enlivened with brightly

colored pictographs of points of interest along the freeways such as the Farmer's Market, UCLA campus, and the headquarters of the map publishers, Pacific Press. The Los Angeles Allied Printing Trades Council is also listed as publisher - a reminder of an era when trade union influence was at its peak in the U.S.; this is reflected in the cartouche at lower left showing a clean cut man in overalls with tools of trade standing against a background of skyscrapers and factories. On the right is a woman positioned next to the Allied Printing Union label. We have been unable to locate a copy of this in OCLC/WorldCat. [Stock #54686] US\$650.00




