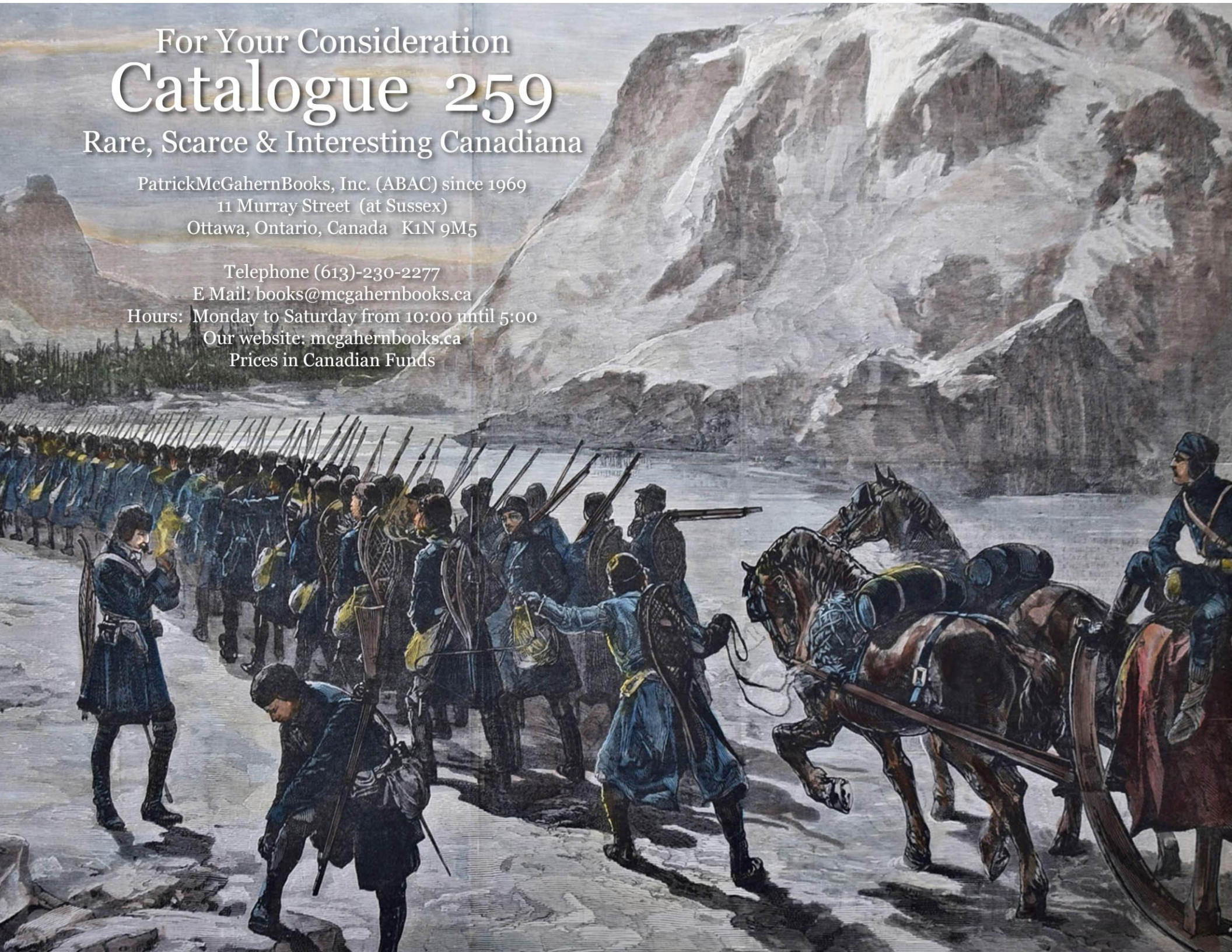

# 1. Canadian Flag

A very large Canadian Red Ensign that flew over the house of prominent Ottawa lawyer, McLeod Stewart (mayor of Ottawa from 1887 to 1888). A letter, showing provenance, states that the flag was flown over Stewart's residence, Appin House, which stood where the Museum of Nature is now located in Ottawa. Enclosed with: An Ottawa newspaper, "Every Saturday" (Vol. I, No. 4) dated Saturday January 8th, 1887 that contains on the front page an article on "The Progressive Son of Ottawa" on assuming his mayoralty position.

Flag dimensions: 1m.36cm x 2m, 32cm, (53" x 92" or 4'5" x 7'9"), the flag is complete but shows wear from use (frayed along edges, several small holes & stains). The probably date would be c.**1880**

S. McLeod is written on the upper left edge along one stripe of the Union Jack.

McLeod Stewart was born in Bytown in 1847 to a prominent Ottawa family that owned a large part of Ottawa Centretown called Stewarton. Many of the streets in this area are still named after the McLeod family. Stewart McLeod was an officer in the Governor General's Foot Guards and his patriotism is reflected in this Canadian national flag. The Red Ensign was replaced in 1965 as the Canadian national flag by the present maple-leaf flag.



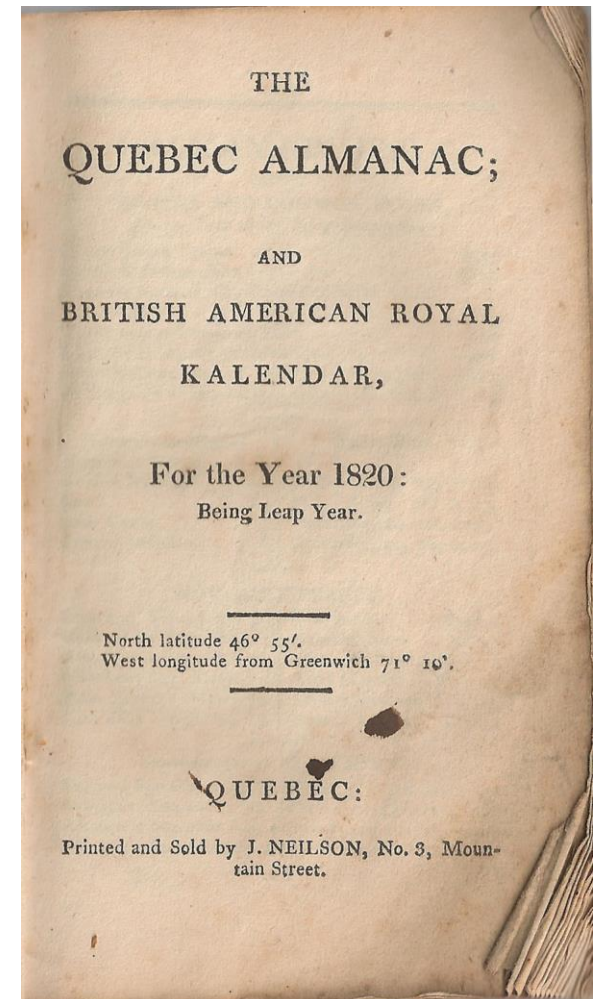
*Facsimile Image: Canadian Red Ensign, 1868-1921.*

The county was named in 1841 after the Huron Tract, an area in western Upper Canada purchased by the Canada Company in 1826. The million-acre tract fronted on the eastern shore of Lake Huron, which took its name from a confederacy of five Iroquoian tribes based in the area of Midland and Orillia. Their name in French signified 'boar's head' or 'ruffian', because their hair stood up in bristles. - Detailed list of maps on request.



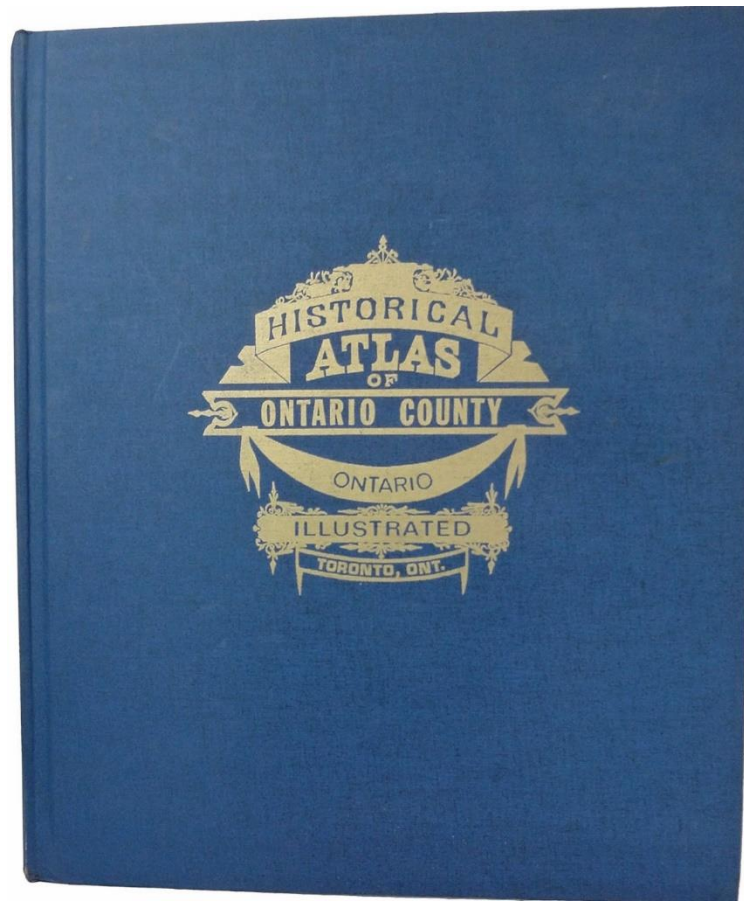

With F.W. BALDWIN and A.G. BELL he formed the Aerial Experiment Association to test the feasibility of powered flight. He made more than 200 short flights in experimental aircraft in the US before flying the SILVER DART at Baddeck 23 February 1909 - the first controlled flight by a British subject in the British Empire. McCurdy is also credited with making the first ocean flight, from Florida to Cuba, and with sending and receiving the first messages while aloft. He was assistant director of aircraft production for the Canadian government in WWII and was lieutenant- governor of NS 1947-52. He was awarded the MCKEE TROPHY (1959) on the 50th anniversary of the flight of the Silver Dart. (Canadian Encyclopedia)

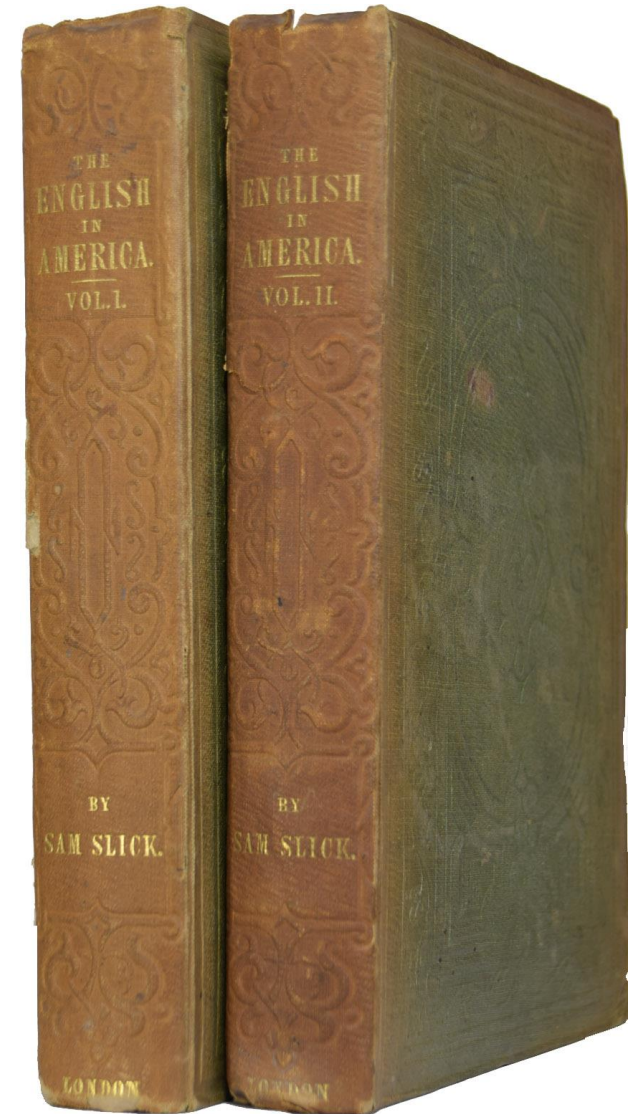

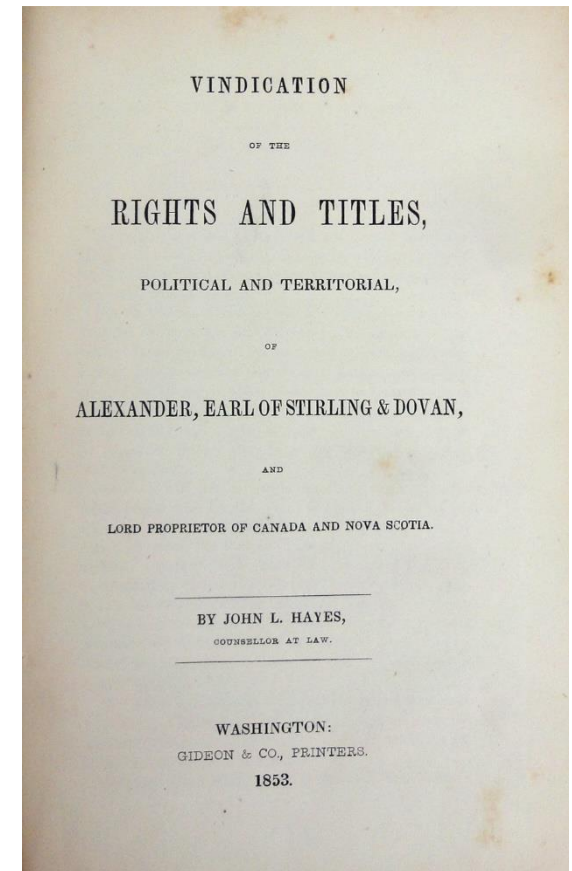

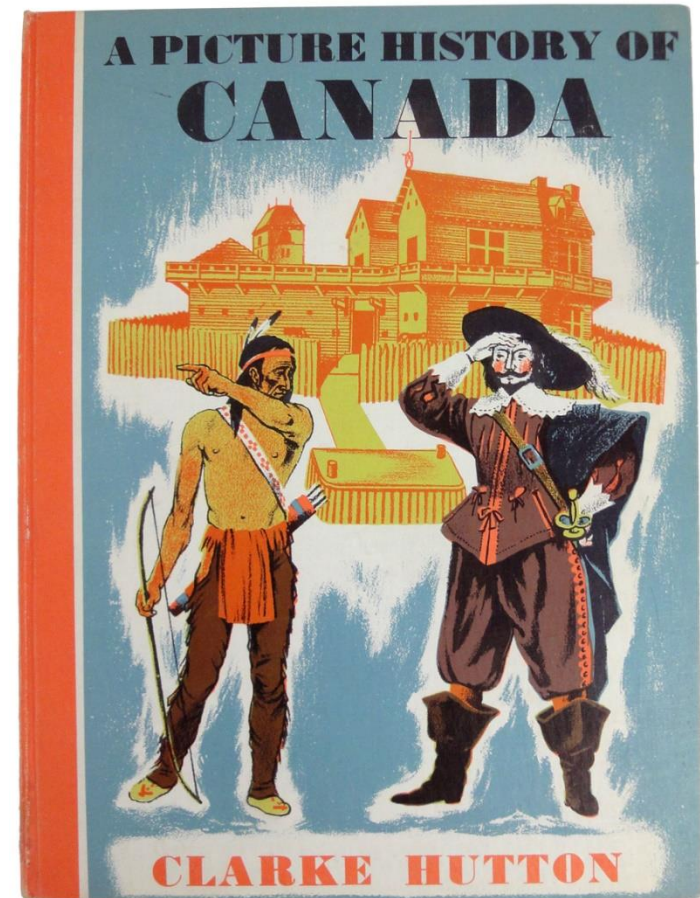


In 1621, the Scottish poet and statesman, Sir William Alexander of Menstrie (later Earl of Stirling and Viscount Canada) was granted virtually the whole of Nova Scotia, then known as 'New Scotland', by King James 1st. The grant was further increased by King Charles 1st to include the greater portion of what is now the north-eastern United States. The title lapsed in 1739 on the death of the fifth earl, who died without issue. In 1830, Alexander Humphrys-Alexander [1783-1859] claimed the earldom through his mother, a daughter of the putative sixth earl. Despite the fact his claim was dismissed by the courts in 1833, he continued to offer land for sale in Nova Scotia until 1837, and two years later, was tried and found guilty of forgery. John Lord Hayes, an American lawyer, here presents legal arguments in support of Alexander Humphrys-Alexander's claims, and criticizes the methods used by the Crown at his trial. T.P.L. 8299 & 8298. 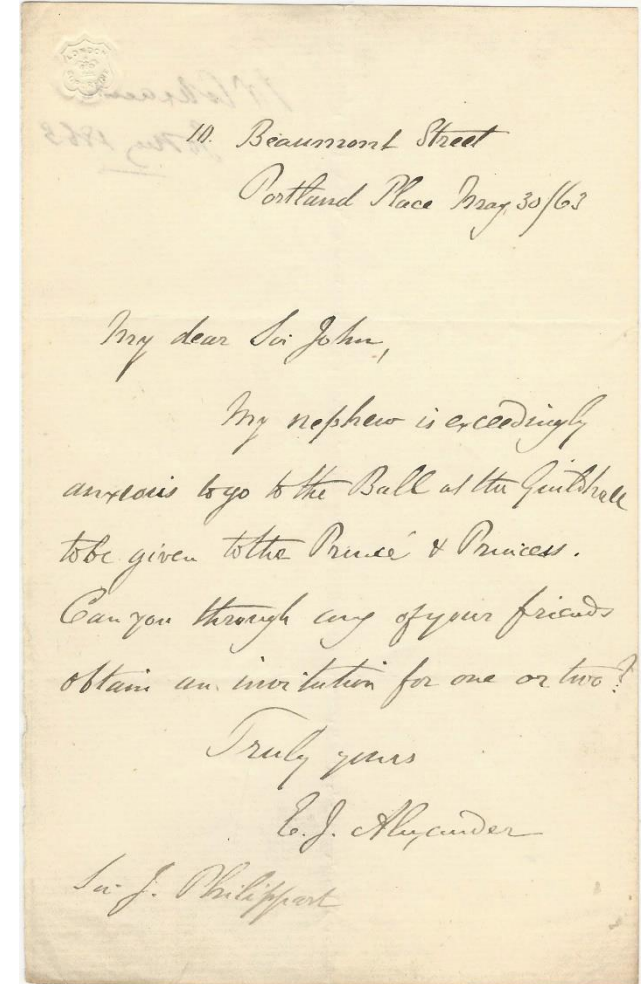


## 28. [HUMPHRYS-ALEXANDER, Alexander William Francis, Self-styled Viscount]

2 ALS, 1 signed 'Canada' to 'Dear Sir John', (John PHILLIPART, 1784-1874, the military historian), saying "As we have had now for several days ... your Letter and parcel for my Father ... I think it better to let you know that his health had become so bad that we persuaded him ... about a fortnight ago" to go to "a place in the country", his mother and he opened the letters "& finding papers which seem of importance we were afraid you might be uneasy about them ... we were desired to leave him as quiet as possible for a little while ... we hope that he will be better able soon to attend to business", 3 sides, 8vo., n.d., note by Sir John on 4th side 'July 1833', with 1 signed 'E.J. Alexander' to Sir John Philipart, saying "My nephew is exceedingly anxious to go to the Ball at the Guildhall to be given to the Prince and Princess" of Wales, newly married, "Can you ... obtain an invitation for one or two?", 10 Beaumont Street, Portland Place, 30th May 1863, two items **1833** and **1863**

The writer's father, Alexander Humphrys, (1783-1859), added the surname Alexander in 1824 and set about claiming the Earldom of Stirling, extinct since 1739. He alleged that he was descended from the 1st Earl, the famous Sir William Alexander of



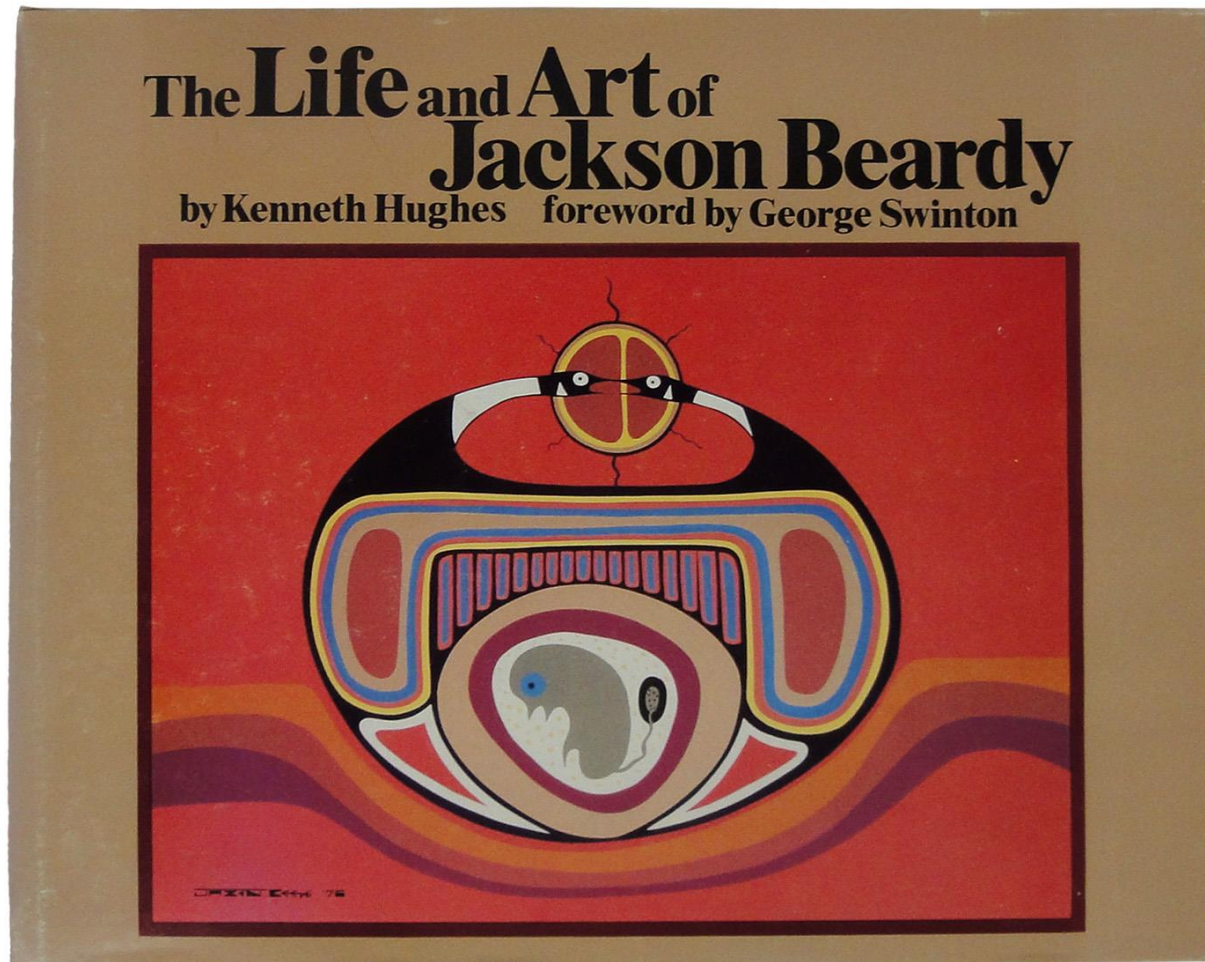
Menstrie, favourite of James VI and I. The 1st Earl was given the right to create for sale 100 (later 150) baronetcies of Nova Scotia. Humphrys-Alexander succeeded in voting as a Scottish Representative Peer in 1825, 1830 and 1831, and on the 2nd July 1831, was served 'heir special to the 1st Earl in his possessions in Nova Scotia' of which he had sasine six days later at Edinburgh Castle. His motive now appeared four days later. As 'Hereditary Lieutenant and Lord Proprietor of the Province of Nova Scotia, and the Lordship of Canada', he offered for sale '1,000,000 acres of the most excellent land in New Brunswick'. However, all services as heir except that to his mother were reduced (rescinded) in 1836, and in 1839 he was indicted for forging the excerpt. It was unanimously pronounced a forgery by the commission of which, however, he was acquitted. (See 'The Complete Peerage', Vol. XII, Appendix G). - John Philippart, military historian and Knight of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem, helped to revive the Order in England after the Napoleonic wars, and was chancellor of the English Language for 43 years. He also helped found the West London Hospital at Hammersmith.

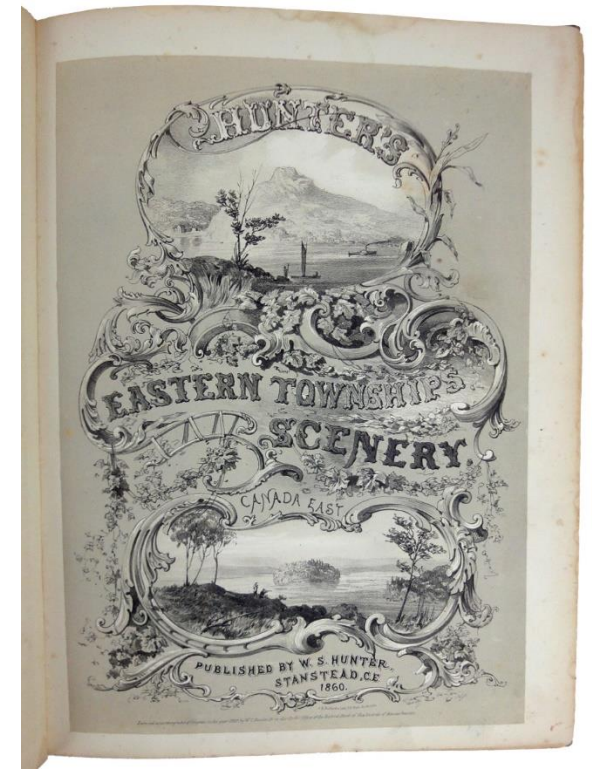

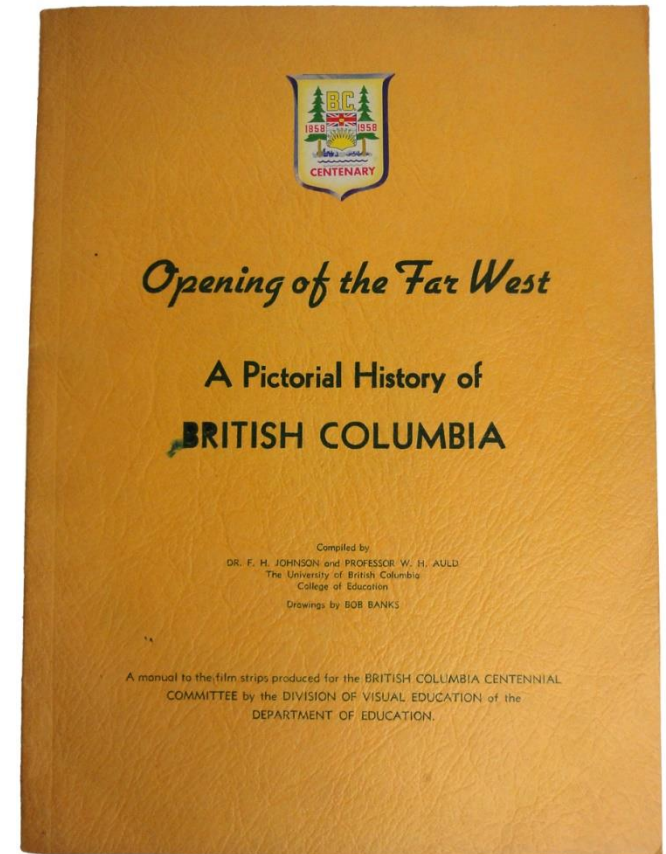

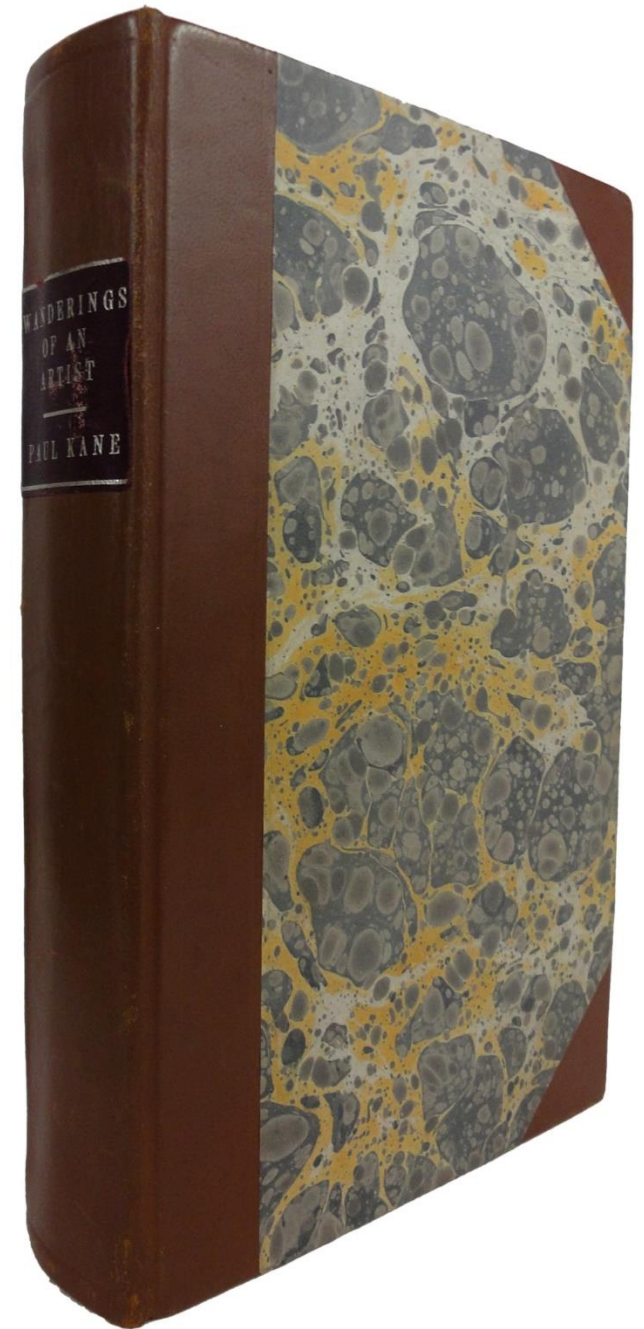

The son of an Irish immigrant to Toronto, Kane became one of Canada's most famous nineteenth century painters. After four years studying art in Europe, he returned to paint North American Indians. It was a time of cultivated interest in primitive societies and Kane's paintings somewhat romanticize his



subjects. They are, however, an eloquent record of Indian culture as it was, largely untouched by White influence.

He set out alone with paintbox and gun in 1845 and spent a summer in the Lake Huron and Lake Michigan regions, mainly sketching the Ojibway. For the next three years he went further west, often travelling with Hudson's Bay company fur traders. From this journey which took him across the Rockies and eventually to Vancouver Island he brought back several hundred sketches.

Kane spent the following years in his studio developing the sketches into hundreds of oil paintings, eight of which are reproduced as colour lithographs in this book. The finest works are probably the portraits of Indian chiefs, but the scenes of tribal ceremonies and buffalo hunting on the plains have a poignant interest as a record of a vanished world. An official United States Government report of the American naval victory over the Royal Navy on Lake Champlain on September 11, 1814. Thwarting British invasion attempts, it was a pivotal battle in the War of 1812. The American squadron was commanded by Captain Thomas Macdonough and in his report he lists the names of the killed and wounded along with a list of ships and armaments involved.

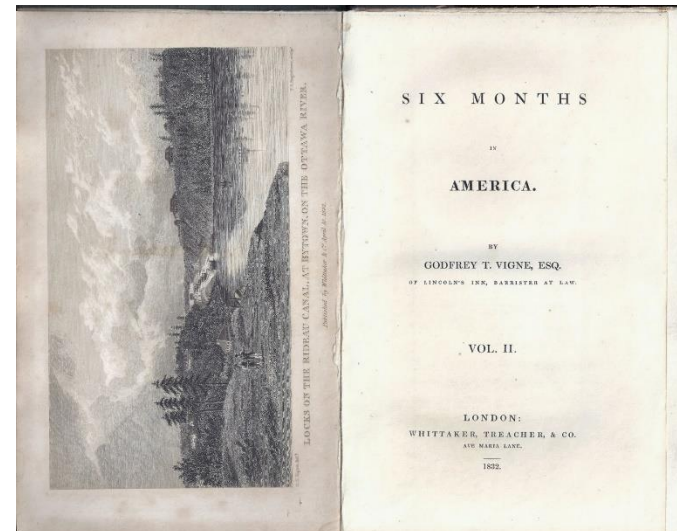
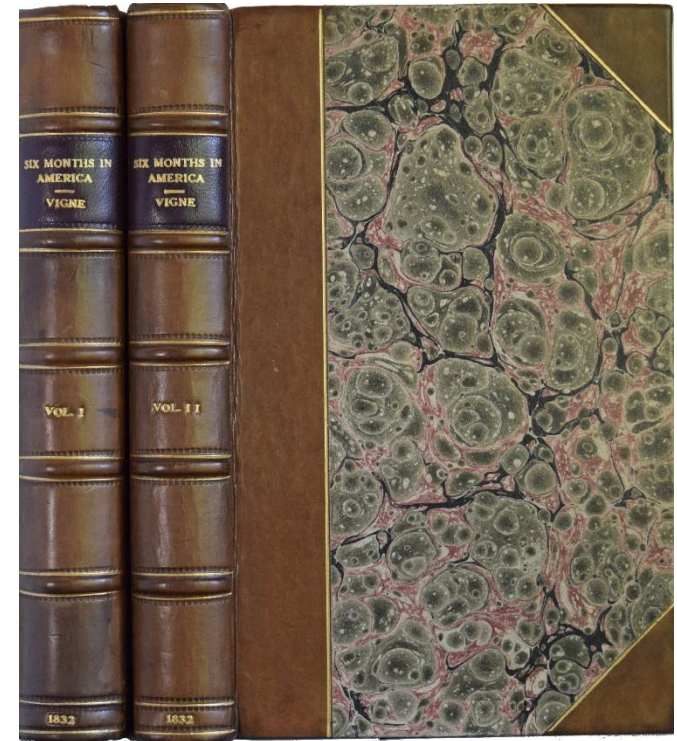

"Vigne's jaunty book records travels "with my note-book, sketch-book, gun and fishing rod - alone - unbewifed and unbevehicled...". Moving from Detroit up Lake Huron to Sault Ste. Marie and back to Buffalo, then by steamer from Niagara to Kingston, Montreal and back, Vigne wrote terse, amusing notes. He explained the civil and criminal laws of Quebec, and the French-Canadian habit of making over property to a son by notarial writing. These legal and economic structures he saw as shaping interesting social differences". (Waterson).

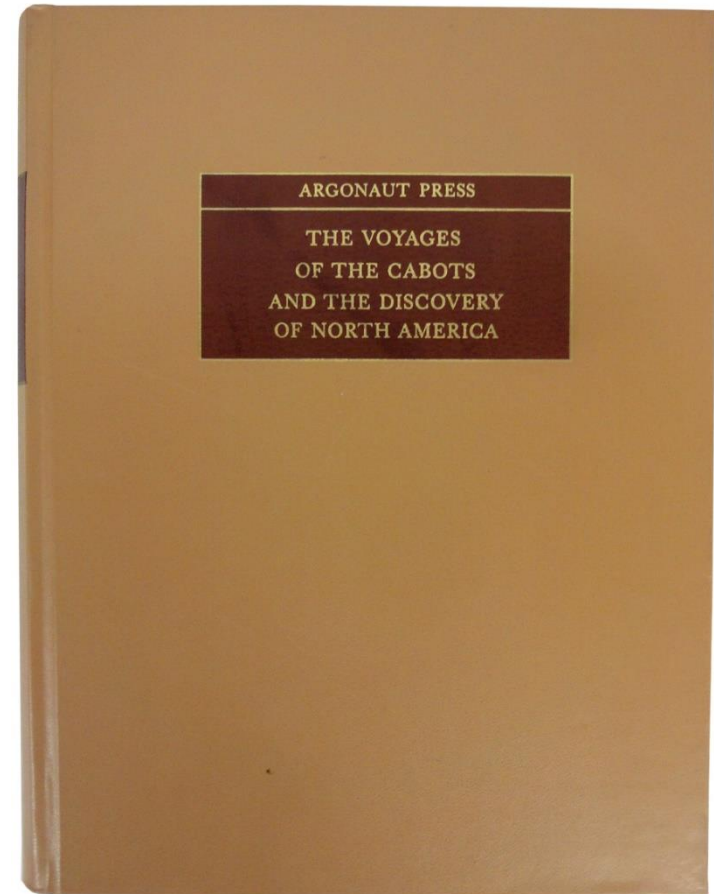
