The author, who was over 70 years old when this new edition appeared, notes that while it is based on the earlier book, it is a completely new work. Cover lightly soiled, spine ends bumped, ownership stamp on title, with signature on verso of endpaper and his small, decorative initial intaglio stamp on title. VG. \$30.00

"*The Young Gardener's Assistant*" was the first of Bridgeman's horticulture books and was originally published in 1829. It contains three sections: vegetables, flowers and fruits. It was later issued as "*The American Kitchen-Gardener*" and then revised in 1866 to comprise the first section of his "*The American Gardener's Assistant*" [See Item #31]. It was a work long popular due to its very practical monthly instructions, running through 13 editions between 1829 and 1872. \$50.00

This monthly calendar of work to be done in the flower garden was first issued in 1832 and was co-authored by Thomas Hibbert and Robert Buist who were partners in a greenhouse and florist business located in Philadelphia. After Hibbert's death Buist added seed selling to the business operations and became one of the most successful seedsmen in the U.S. This title was issued in a number of editions and was the first book published in this country that was readily usable to gardeners. The "New Edition" offered here is the same as the 1839 second edition except for the final advertisements for English books available in Philadelphia at the time, which have been reset. \$150.00

Both works are guides to farming and agriculture originally written in the first century B.C. From the 15th century onward, they were often bound together, sometimes also with the agricultural works of Palladius and Columella. In this edition, Cato's work comprises the first 105pp; the rest is Varro's. \$200.00

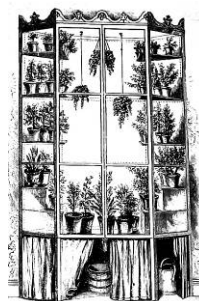

This extensive, well-illustrated work was first published in 1859 and was issued in a number of subsequent editions. This sixth - and final - edition is not as common as the earlier ones. It is arranged in calendar format and covers gardens and farms of some size. In the preface to the fifth edition (also copyrighted 1866 and reprinted in this edition), the author makes reference to how the Civil War had stimulated great improvements in agricultural machinery and tools. \$150.00

A. Waugh and published as "Landscape Gardening" in 1911. The landscape designs are taken from the author's own practice as a landscape gardener at Birkenhead Park in England. This is a particularly interesting copy of this work as it was specially bound at the time it was published to include two blank leaves between each text leaf, which greatly expanded the size of the book and resulted in the need to bind it in two volumes. 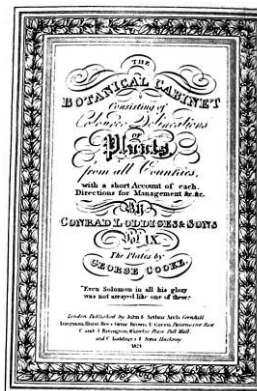

The volumes are in generally very good condition with some scuffing; each contains the armorial bookplate of W. R. Grace (likely William Russell Grace, a former New York City mayor and founder of the W. R. Grace shipping business) as well as the name of Grace M. Ellinwood dated Apr. 7, 1894. Joint of Vol. 6 worn with tender hinge, several joints rubbed. Plates are in very good condition, clear and crisp, though some have been cropped close.

Conrad Loddiges (1728-1836) was a Dutch-born British gardener, who came to Hackney, England in the 1760's and established a nursery where he, along with his son George, specialized in importing exotic plants including a number from America. The "Botanical Cabinet" was originally issued in monthly parts containing 10 plates each and was later bound in volumes of 100 plates each. The complete set reached 20 volumes and was published from 1817-1833. The "Cabinet" appeared simultaneously in both a large paper edition in which the plates were fully colored and a small paper edition, which contained partially colored plates designed to highlight one or more of the plant's botanical parts (e.g., stem, leaf, flower, etc.). In this particular set, however, a total of 95 of the plates are fully colored while the rest are partially colored. Runs of these color plate botanical works become increasingly scarce as they are often destroyed by being broken apart for their plates. The run of seven volumes - \$2,500.00

There is a loose sheet calligraphed by the artist describing the work laid in: "These books were conceived one lovely day during the summer, while living on the coast of Maine. The day was warm and breezy, my garden was a riot of color, and the bees were happily humming." (Maine) 1985. Sweet was born in New Jersey in 1956 and attended the Kansas City Art Institute. The work offered here, *Elements of Botany*, was part of this lottery: "Printed for the Author as prizes in the Royal Botanical Lottery." 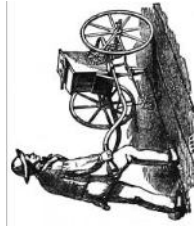
